

St. Stephen Deacon & Martyr Parish Annual Report—Piscal year 2018-2019

Dear Parishioners,

It has been a little over a year now since I became your pastor and I want to thank you for welcoming me into your faith family. Moving from a parish of 400 families to a parish of over 4,000 families can be overwhelming, but you have been very helpful to me during this time of transition.

There are always growing pains and a sense of uneasiness with what is "different." In reflecting on the past year our parish went through several changes. We were faced with a number of longtime parish employees who elected to retire or move on in different career directions. I want to ask you to join me to pray for them as they move on to this new chapter in their lives. Replacing these longtime staff members has been a slow and ongoing challenge, but I believe we are moving in the right direction and I hope to have a full "team" in place soon to meet the needs of our parishioners going forward.

This past year has been a learning experience for both you and me. I feel we both want the same good things for our parish and our parishioners. I want to apologize for anything that might have caused you any hurt feelings or misgivings with our parish or me. That was never my intention. Let me assure you that as we move forward we will do a better job of communicating the reasons behind any changes. But more importantly I am always open to dialog and discussion, as this is "our" parish and we need to work together as a team and the best way to begin that is to foster open discussion between all of you and me.

As pastor, I am responsible for the catechesis of the parishioners of all ages. And this is a responsibility that I take very seriously. After a year of observing what we were offering in terms of catechesis at all levels, I felt that we needed to tweak some of our offerings to ensure that we were offering a quality, faith filled, catechetical experience. The goal of any catechetical program should bring everyone closer to God and make "missionary disciples" to the world.

In an effort to enhance what we were offering and give more opportunities for our parishioners to come to know our Lord better and learn more about our faith and the Church to which we belong, we have made some changes in our catechetical and Religious Education Programs. These changes were made in a sincere effort to meet this objective, but it seems that in all instances the narrative behind them may not have always been clearly and accurately shared. Looking back with 20/20 hindsight, I feel I should have presented the changes and why they were being made personally so that this vision was communicated clearly. Much like the childhood game of telephone with the strings and the cans, by the time the message got to the people, it was an unclear version of the vision we tried to convey. For this I apologize and will work to do better in the future.

In the twenty years of our existence as a parish, the world in which we live in has undergone many changes, some that we can easily accept and others that we could have never imagined. But in order to live in this new reality we have to make changes and adjustments that reflect the current reality. The reality of full churches and full schools, and everyone dutifully practicing their faith are, unfortunately, no longer a reality. We are faced with a time and culture where the largest religious group is the "none," and I don't mean religious women nuns.

We live in a time where organized religion is going through a period of radical change. And in order to be successful as a Church, we need to be open to doing some things differently. And those new approaches will, in many cases, seem strange, foreign or very uncomfortable. People often mention that, "It is not like it was in the past!" And that is a true statement. So where does that leave us? Each of us is called to continually confirm our faith in Jesus Christ. We need to think outside the box to come up with new ways of being the Body of Christ, the Church, to our community, while honoring the decisions and practices from those made before us. And we all need to take our part in the process.

There are many ways to accomplish this. First, we must develop a new parish "spirit," in which we all can come together as a single community of believers. We need to support and empower each other, as we all work for the common good. We need to be inviting and welcoming to all. We need to support and become involved in all of our parish ministries, groups and activities. We need to be "Saint Stephen Proud!" There is something for everyone to become involved in and I welcome your ideas, your wisdom, your insights and mostly importantly your assistance and participation.

In the near future I am going to email out an electronic survey that I would like you to complete. This survey will be asking you for your input on what ministries would be of interest to your family and ones that you would feel a sense of commitment to. In addition, we will be asking about what kind of social events here at the parish you would be willing to attend or help organize. In completing this survey, I want your most honest and open input on what we can do to build a stronger community here at St. Stephen. We are the captains of the destiny of our parish and we need the input from each of you to make it a success.

My goal is to also try and begin to better utilize the Parish Life Center (PLC) that was recently built and opened. It is a wonderful space to hold parish events, sporting events, workshops, and a wide host of activities. However, we don't currently have the people in place to organize and run these events. I am open to almost any event that would help us build a stronger community here at St. Stephen. One thing I have learned is that not all events are attractive to all people, in all age groups. So I am asking you, the parishioners of St. Stephen to bring forth your ideas for events that would be successful. We have tried a few, such as a parish picnic, a White Sox outing, an Oktoberfest, but I feel we are still missing out on opportunities to build community. I would like to throw it back to you. What would you like to see take place at St. Stephen? What can you commit to being part of and bringing your friends to? What are you willing to help us with? Would you be more interested in family events or adult events? There are many opportunities for everyone to become involved here at our parish, but yet we need your input on how to do that.

We are totally dependent on a vast volunteer force to keep the parish functioning. We thank all of you who have been so generous with your time and talent; we could not be a parish without your help. So many of us have such busy lives, we always assume that someone else will help us build the future at St. Stephen or think, "I will join in when life slows down." Unfortunately, by the time our lives slow down, our priorities are different and we have lost our connection to the parish. I ask each of you to consider at least one way you can become a stronger member of our faith community in the coming year. If more parishioners volunteered, no one would have to give us more than a few hours of time each year.

In terms of finances for our parish, we have spent the past year identifying, upgrading and maintaining our facilities. We have also looked closely at the budget and expenses to insure that we are being good stewards with the treasure you share with our parish. I ask you to read the letter from the Finance Council concerning some specifics that we have been working on this past year.

As we look to the future, I am grateful and hopeful that we can continue to work together. The strengths of our parish energize our mission of "working together for the glory of God." We do this in many ways. Much has been done and much still awaits us to be done in the present and future.

Of course, there are concerns as we look to the future. We must continually adapt to the needs of our younger families, children and youth. We need to make sure that our older parishioners, especially those who live alone, are ministered to, as well. We need to make our celebration of the Sunday Eucharist the highlight of our week. We reach out in compassion and joy to those who seek material assistance and we take seriously our responsibility to be good stewards of all God's many gifts.

I want to invite each of you to embark on this new beginning for us all. This year we are doing something different in reporting our financial results. We are sending them in a combination parish update and financial report to all of our registered families and individuals. We are hopeful that this effort will allow us to share this information with a larger group of people. I feel that it is equally important to share our financial information with you and also give you a better understanding of where we are as a parish today. I also want to share with you some of what awaits us as we look to the future. We have also included with this parish information your annual contribution report for the past year. The sharing of your time, talent and treasure, reflects your support of our parish and the ministries and programs we offer.

I want to thank you for all that you have done for our parish and me personally this past year. I look forward working with you in new and exciting ways as we begin to write the next chapter in the life of Saint Stephen's Parish

Fellow Parishioners,

During this past fiscal year, the wide range of services and activities listed on the report were dependent on a staff of six full-time, two part-time benefits eligible, and approximately 15 part-time people along with a shared youth minister with St. Elizabeth Seton and so many people who gave of their time, talent, and financial support to our parish. We thank everyone whose support allowed us to do this. You can be proud of what you have helped to accomplish.

In the 2018-19 fiscal year, there were many great successes:

- completed the Parish Life Center (PLC)
- ♦ completed the planting and landscaping of the bio-swale behind the PLC
- ♦ added dozens of trees in the parking lot and on the parish premises
- created social opportunities like the White Sox Outing
- hosted the Dinner for St. Joseph's Day
- started the Queen of Hearts raffle
- ⋄ began plans to host Super Bingo for parishioners to gather and bond

We also had a few personnel changes including the hiring of maintenance people to address short, medium and long term plans for our facilities; a new music director and we are in the process of hiring for a Director of Formation. With the new staff members in place, our focus for next year is to implement programs and events that will fully utilize the PLC and help us continue to grow the community of St. Stephen.

We are grateful for the generosity of our parishioners in the past year that has enabled us to meet our operating expenses, to see the parish life center finished and opened for usage, and to continue to pay down our mortgage. Since 2003, we have paid down our initial mortgage - the cost of our current facilities, our land, and parish startup costs – from \$8.3 million to approximately \$1.6 million while funding parish services and meeting the maintenance needs of our facilities.

In addition to providing support and review of financial statements, a key role of the finance committee is to plan for long-term maintenance and facility needs and long-term ministry needs. In addition, our goal is to provide our Pastor with our best advice and direction on meeting the long term financial goals of the parish. In addressing parish needs, our committee has three key financial priorities:

- meeting expenses for our current and future ministries
- paying down our two mortgages—remaining balances
 - -original mortgage \$1.5 Million
 - -PLC mortgage \$582,000
- providing for the completion and the upkeep costs of the parish life center

We have adjusted our budgeted collections downward, slightly to meet the financial trend of the parish and the diocese overall. However, as you each experience in your own homes, our St. Stephen home experiences the same increases in utilities and maintenance. In order for us to meet that budget and have adequate funds for the payment of both mortgages, we estimate that we will need a 5% increase in revenue for this current fiscal year. This increase can come from offertory collections, fundraising, or outright donations. Currently the mortgage payments on the PLC and the original church loan exceed \$60,000 per month. We appeal to your ongoing generosity to support our parish work. We ask anyone who is able to make a small increase in your donations.

The offertory collection was especially important since we are meeting our operating expenses and mortgage payments as well as supporting most archdiocesan causes through one collection. In 2018-2019, we changed our collection process and re-introduced a second collection for Archdiocese mandated collections and a building and maintenance fund. Recall that the archdiocese financed our facilities for the church and support wings based on a commitment to stewardship. Our original mortgage payments repay that confidence.

Our current status regarding the PLC is both encouraging and worrisome at the same time. When we started planning for the PLC we began a campaign pledge drive whereby the Archdiocese mandated that we have (at least) 67% of cash for the project in hand and 100% of the total commitment in pledges. We met those numbers. In fact, our original estimate of the second mortgage was close to \$1million; in reality, we borrowed less than \$675K from the Archdiocese to complete the project. The remainder of the funding was from the generous donations of our parishioners.

This commitment was the key to the success of our mortgage payments as well as the construction of the Parish Life Center. It is a testament to the commitment of our parishioners and further evidence of the type of parish that we want to maintain. Now that the dust has settled, our current mortgage on the PLC as of July 1, 2019, was \$582,000 with a monthly payment that averages \$18,000. The good news is that if every person who pledged to the To Teach Who Christ Is Campaign met their commitment and paid their pledges we would be able to pay off most if not all of that mortgage. The worrisome news is that payment of these pledges have been inconsistent since the beginning of the project and some of the pledges were never paid or completed. Based on the current rate of collection we will not collect most of those funds by the end of the campaign in 2020. Currently we are only collecting between \$5-7000 per month in pledge payments and must cover the balance (over \$10,000) each month from Sunday collections. If you have fallen behind on your pledge and have the ability to make those payments once again or complete your pledge, we ask that you do so.

We have a few capital projects that need action in the next year or two and are in the process of developing a long-term capital replacement plan for all equipment (mechanical and office). The most pressing issues are the parking lot and the church roof. The parking lot needs to be completely reconstructed, assuring that proper base material and drainage is installed. In addition, the shingles on the church roof are failing and although we have filed a claim with the manufacturer, we will have to bear the cost of the labor to have them replaced. You may recall that the Queen of Hearts net proceeds which were \$24,000 for the last fiscal year are earmarked for capital improvements like the parking lot and the roof. As we learn more about the costs of these projects and the projected timeline, we will share those numbers with you. We will most likely proceed with the church roof repairs first, next spring to avoid any damage inside the church. The parking lot project, which is anticipated to be close to \$1,000,000 may have to be put off until we can secure funding.

We have committed that 100% of proceeds from any fundraiser (included Queen of Hearts and Bingo) will be earmarked for capital improvements and to help pay down the two mortgages on time or ahead of schedule.

We ask that you determine your regular donation with our parish budgetary needs in mind. We control the costs and of the parish as best we can with the money collected each week. However, with the parish facilities aging, maintenance costs, utilities, and expenses rising, we need your continued financial support. St. Stephen parish has provided each of us and our families with blessings and ministries throughout the years. Please help us to continue to minister to you, your families and to the St. Stephen community in the future through your generous donations, contributions, and stewardship. I also invite you to consider the option of donating through the use of electronic debit or credit card, which makes regular support more convenient. Information on this is available in the narthex today and at the parish office.


