

ALL SAINTS DAY | REFLECTION - THE CELEBRATION OF SAINTS: INSPIRATION, PARTICIPATION AND INTERCESSION

"We, the Christian community, assemble to celebrate the memory of the martyrs with ritual solemnity because we want to be inspired to follow their example, share in their merits, and be helped by their prayers." - Saint Augustine

The Church celebrates the memory of the countless holy men and women from different origins and nationalities, heroes and heroines of Christian faith and witnesses of Christian charity through their lives.

Saint Augustine shares us three simple reasons why we do celebrate their memory:

first, for inspiration from their examples; second, for participation in their merits and lastly, for the intercession of our prayers.

First, as an inspiration from their example and in the light of the gospel reading in today's feast, the saints teach us to become real Christians and saints in the Kingdom of God in the making. The lives lived by the saints are not unattainable to us. By the fact they have passed through this life and bore the tests of this earthly exile, the saints tell us that we can remain faithful to God, who is our goal of this life, despite all the temptations. Jesus calls them "blessed" or "happy" because they remain to be on the side of God. Secondly, the celebration of the saints is a participation of their merits. This is an article of our faith, the "communion of saints". We are taught by our catechesis that our faith in the communion of saints is an ecclesiological reality that we do not only journey all alone on this earth. We participate in the goal reached by the saints in heaven. They who participate in the lumen gloriae, who is God, is also shared to us by their own prayers in that heavenly condition. This reality is described in the spirit of Christian hope. Saint John says that we shall become someday like Christ as we are eagerly awaiting for that moment in the future. We never lose hope therefore, because the glory of the saints is an assuring truth that someday we shall be like them, beholding the Holy Face of God. Lastly, the saints pray for us. They are our intercessors. Saints pray for us because their position in front of lumen gloriae gives them an opportunity to include our condition in the valley of tears. The vision of Saint John in the first reading provides us a picture of this glorious state of heaven where the eternal praise and glory of God is being be held and sang. In the same book somewhere an angel offers our prayers and in this very symbolic incense burned as a sweet smelling oblation is being offered by the Church triumphant in front of the Blessed Trinity. May we find the real essence of the celebration of the saints in heaven. May we start to move on this meaning and finding meaning in it, we find authentic Christian life.

NOVEMBER 2: ALL SOULS DAY—COMMEMORATION

In the Catholic Church, as in other religious communities, death has a central place. Death makes us focus on what matters in our lives and to wonder at the mystery of our coming into the world for such a relatively short time, only to leave it again. Any serious account of what it means to be human must grapple with death. In the Christian faith, the most familiar symbol is the Cross. It remembers the Son of God who shared our lives, our rejection and our death – in His case a tortured death on the cross. Death remains central to our faith. When we think of it, however, we are turned from defeat to victory, and from sadness to celebration through Christ's rising from the dead. Death has its say but it does not have the last word. When we die, we shall live with Christ in a new life. That faith turns cemeteries from the place of demons to the place of angels who were waiting for the apostles at Jesus' tomb. In the Christian faith, Christ offers life after death to all those who have faith in Him. That vision of death and life is represented in a Melbourne cemetery, where over the gate is the inscription, Janua Vitae – the gateway to life.

For that reason, the early Christians Church wrote the names of Christians who belonged to the Church on tablets and read them out in the Eucharistic liturgy. The names of people from the congregation who had died were also inscribed and remembered, especially those who had suffered for the faith during persecution. Preachers still sometimes say of people who have died that their names are written in the book of life. The practice of remembering the dead in the liturgy was retained in monasteries, where eventually one day a year was chosen to remember all those who had died. It was natural for communities to gather together in prayer to remember that they were bound together by memory and hope. This practice is maintained each year in a moving ceremony at some Vinnies shelters for people who are homeless, where wall plaques each year hold the names of people who would otherwise be forgotten. They are blessed, and each person is remembered by one of their colleagues or people who have accompanied them. We honour death to express our hope that life triumphs. On All Souls' Day, Catholics have long prayed to free people from the traces that sin has left on them and from their time of cleansing in purgatory. That focus, too, awoke compassion and solidarity through the conviction that our prayers and faithfulness to people who have died can bless them, just as they now bless us by their prayers and compassion. The day came eventually to be celebrated on 2 November each year.






Prayer Shawls will be available at the All Souls Mass on Thursday, November 2nd at 6:00 PM.



Uroczystość Wszystkich Świętych i Dzień Zaduszny

1 listopada Kościół katolicki obchodzi uroczystość Wszystkich Świętych. Dzień ten kojarzy się dla wielu ze zniczem,



z grobem bliskich osób, z cmentarzem, dla innych z wiązanką kwiatów, jeszcze dla innych z modlitwą i pamięcią o tych, którzy wyprzedzili nas w drodze do wieczności. Nie mniej jednak w tym dniu udajemy się z całymi rodzinami na cmentarz i nawiedzamy groby naszych bliskich, przyjaciół, rodziców, krewnych, znajomych, stawiając kwiaty, zapalając ten "płomyk nadziei", wierząc, że już cieszą się oni chwałą w domu Ojca Niebieskiego. Kościół w tym dniu oddaje cześć tym wszystkim, którzy już weszli do chwały niebieskiej, a wiernym pielgrzymującym jeszcze na ziemi wskazuje drogę, która ma zaprowadzić ich do świętości. Przypomina nam również prawdę o naszej wspólnocie ze Świętymi, którzy otaczają nas opieką.

Kształtowanie się uroczystości

W początkach chrześcijaństwa, w obawie przed bałwochwalstwem, nie oddawano czci nikomu ze stworzeń, ani ludziom, ani aniołom. Oddawano cześć jedynie Bogu w Trójcy Świętej Jedynemu.

W Nowym Testamencie zauważamy pochwałę jaką sam Pan Jezus daje św. Janowi Chrzcicielowi, cześć z jaką wyraża się św. Paweł w listach do Rzymian i Hebrajczyków o Abrahamie i Melchizedeku. Najpierw przedmiotem kultu stała się Najświętsza Maryja Panna, jako Matka Syna Bożego. Zaczęto wznosić kościoły ku Jej czci, Kościół zaczął ustanawiać święta i układał modlitwy oraz pieśni o Matce Bożej. W tym samym czasie zauważamy też kult św. Michała Archanioła. Krwawe prześladowania Kościoła w I w. rozbudziły także kult męczenników. Dzień ich zgonu uważano za dzień ich narodzin dla nieba. Dlatego już od V w. kult prywatny przerodził się w urzędowy, powszechny. Kult Świętych pomnaża cześć Pana Boga. Świętych Pańskich czcimy ze względu na Pana Boga, którego oni "reprezentują". Tak więc nie bezpośrednio, lecz pośrednio przez nich kierujemy kult ku Panu Bogu. Kościół oddaje cześć świętym w różnym stopniu. I tak na pierwszym miejscu stawia Najświętszą Maryję Pannę, następnie świętych: Józefa i Jana Chrzciciela, dalej Apostołów, wśród których Święci Piotr i Paweł mają uprzywilejowane miejsce.

Wspomnienie Wszystkich Wiernych Zmarłych Kościół obchodzi 2 listopada i wtradycji polskiej dzieńten jest nazywany Dniem Zadusznym lub inaczej "zaduszkami". To wspomnienie wprowadził opat benedyktynów w Cluny we Francji, św. Odilon (Odylon). On to w 998 r. zarządził modlitwy za dusze wszystkich zmarłych w dniu 2 listopada. Termin ten i sama idea szybko rozprzestrzeniły się we Francji, Anglii, Niemczech, Italii. W XIII w. zwyczaj ten w Kościele rzymskim stał się powszechny. W XV w. wytworzył się u dominikanów w Wanencji zwyczaj ofiarowania w dniu 2 listopada trzech Mszy św. przez jednego kapłana. Papież Benedykt XIV w 1748 r. rozszerzył ten zwyczaj na całą W 1915 r., podczas I wojny światowej, papież Benedykt XV na prośbę opata - prymasa benedyktynów pozwolił kapłanom całego Kościoła odprawić w tym dniu trzy Msze św. Jedną w intencji przyjętej od wiernych, drugą w intencji wszystkich wiernych zmarłych, a trzecią w intencji papieża. Zwyczaj ten nie jest traktowany jako obowiązek. Kościół w tym dniu wspomina zmarłych pokutujących za grzechy w czyśćcu. Chodzi więc o których nie mogą wejść do nieba, gdyż mają pewne długi do spłacenia Bożej sprawiedliwości. Prawdę o istnieniu czyśćca Kościół ogłosił jako dogmat na soborze w Lyonie w 1274 r. i na XXV sesji Soboru Trydenckiego (1545-1563), w osobnym dekrecie o czyśćcu. Sobór Trydencki orzekł prawdę, że duszom w czyśćcu możemy pomagać. Cała wspólnota Kościoła przychodzi z pomocą duszom czyśćcowym zanosząc w tym dniu prośby przed tron Boży. Aby przyjść z pomocą zmarłym pokutującym w czyśćcu, żyjący mogą w tych dniach uzyskać i ofiarować odpusty zupełne. Nabożeństwo do dusz czyśćcowych było i jest bardzo żywe. Świadczą o tym uroczyście urządzane pogrzeby, często zamawiane Msze św. w intencji zmarłych, w Kościele rzymskim powszechne są Msze św. gregoriańskie (30 Mszy św. po kolei przez 30 dni). W Polsce istnieje nawet zgromadzenie Sióstr Wspomożycielek Dusz Czyśćcowych, założone przez błogosławionego o. Honorata Koźmińskiego - kapucyna.



Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

In our secularized culture, we all struggle with belief in God, at least to some degree. An atheist man named Robert Bridges once wrote to his friend, the Jesuit poet Gerard Manley Hopkins, asking how he could possibly learn to believe in God. Hopkins pithily responded: "Give alms." Would that help someone tempted by atheism today, like you and me?

I think so, and here's why. This week Jesus speaks of love for God and neighbor. These dual commands were nothing new when Jesus used them to sum up the Jewish law. What is new is the way he links them together in mutual dependency. In Jesus, God and man have become one. Human-love and God-love are now inseparably married forever.

The newness of the God-man means that there is now a permanently counter-intuitive way into the knowledge and love of God: love of our neighbor. To experience charity is to know God. That's what Hopkins was getting at for his friend. How we treat our fellow human beings is inseparable from faith in God. Do you want to have a stronger sense of God's loving presence and goodness? Commit to serving someone today and this week. Love him or her. Don't wait for love for God to appear in your heart before loving others. Jesus has united divine and human love. If you want to believe more in God, give alms.

Active Parishioner Status

In order to be considered as a godparent for the Sacraments of Baptism and/or a sponsor for the Sacrament of Confirmation, a person must be verified as an "active member" of a Catholic parish. While assessments of the inquiry will be made individually, the following factors are considered when making the determination of whether or not a person is an active parishioner. Is the person:

- Properly registered and supporting the Church?
- Faithfully attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days?
- Participating in parish activities when possible?
- Using the parish envelope system or electronic giving system in support of our parish?

Adult children living at home are required to register separately from their parents as parishioners.
