We warmly welcome new members to St. Stephen. To register, please stop by the Parish Office during regular business hours.

Active Parishioner Status

In order to be considered as a godparent for the Sacraments of Baptism and/or a sponsor for the Sacrament of Confirmation, a person must be verified as an "active member" of a Catholic parish. While assessments of the inquiry will be made individually, the following factors are considered when making the determination of whether or not a person is an active parishioner. Is the person:

- Properly registered and supporting the Church?
- Faithfully attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days?
- Participating in parish activities when possible?
- Using the parish envelope system or electronic giving system in support of our parish?

Adult children living at home are required to register separately from their parents as parishioners.

- English baptisms are celebrated at 2:30pm on the first and third Sunday of every month.

Farm Update

I've previously shared that it will come at a cost, but there certainly will be benefits to completing this demolition.

Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

We start telling lies around the age of three, the experts tell us. It's understandable. Lying is a god-like power. Whatever I want, I need only say it, and the world rearranges itself accordingly. It's amazing at first. But soon reality snaps back and I'm faced with a dilemma. If I remain committed to my lie I start to fracture into pieces. My words and reality drift apart, and I find myself lost in a lonely world of further falsehoods and fear of being found out.

How marvelous, then, that Jesus begins his ministry by proclaiming: "Repent!" We tend to think it means "stop doing bad things" but it doesn't. It literally means "go beyond the mind you have." Think in a new way. It's painful to admit, but some portion of my mind is addicted to lie-telling, usually to protect my ego or make life easier. To repent means to admit this tendency, to say, "I'm done lying," and to move beyond my split mind into a complete commitment to the truth. Perhaps that's why at Mass we together proclaim, "I have sinned in my thoughts, and in my words…" Repentance and truth-telling work together.

Those who know the twelve-step process of addiction recovery know this process well. The fourth step requires radical truth-telling: listing our moral defects. This isn't being scrupulous. Rather it is freedom from falsehood, and entrance into the real world. This week, I invite you to join me in this practice. Get your phone or piece of paper. Answer the question: what are your true moral defects? Write them down. Remember, the Lord knows them already and loves you. We have a sacrament where this truth-telling is celebrated: Confession. Perhaps it is finally time to go beyond our childish lies.

Michael reminded everyone, "A pilgrimage is a beautiful ancient tradition of faith. It's a kind of public manifestation of our faith."

"It is up to us, the believers to show others that Jesus Christ is alive and present in the Eucharist", said Fr. John Zurek at St. George Church. Indeed, our Car Caravan Pilgrimage proved to be a great example of this "public manifestation" of faith in our Tinley/Orland Park communities.

As we traveled to the churches on the pilgrimage route: St. George, St. Stephen, St. Elizabeth Seton, and St. Julie we captured the attention of many neighbors in our communities.

Following the Tinley/Orland Park police escorts, The Knights of Columbus on Bikes (motorcycles) from Father C.C. Boyle Council 4698 led the seventy-six cars that processed together in the caravan.

The afternoon concluded with a celebration of the Eucharist at St. Julie Church. Choir members from several parishes worked together under the direction of John Ligda, music director at St. Julie. Fr. Tirso, the pastor was the main celebrant joined by priests and deacons from all seven parishes.

Our hearts were a blaze with love for Jesus in the Eucharist!

O co proszę? O zerwanie z wszelką przeciętnością i o nową gorliwość ewangeliczną



EWANGELIA (MK 1, 14-20) JEZUS WZYWA LUDZI DO NAWRÓCENIA I POWOŁUJE PIERWSZYCH APOSTOŁÓW

Gdy Jan został uwięziony, Jezus przyszedł do Galilei i głosił Ewangelię Bożą. Mówił: «Czas się wypełnił i bliskie jest królestwo Boże. Nawracajcie się i wierzcie w Ewangelię!»

Przechodząc obok Jeziora Galilejskiego, ujrzał Szymona i brata Szymonowego, Andrzeja, jak zarzucali sieć w jezioro; byli bowiem rybakami. I rzekł do nich Jezus: «Pójdźcie za Mną, a sprawię, że się staniecie rybakami ludzi». A natychmiast, porzuciwszy sieci, poszli za Nim.

Idąc nieco dalej, ujrzał Jakuba, syna Zebedeusza, i brata jego, Jana, którzy też byli w łodzi i naprawiali sieci. Zaraz ich powołał, a oni, zostawiwszy ojca swego, Zebedeusza, razem z najemnikami w łodzi, poszli za Nim.

Zauważę, że przepowiadaniu Dobrej Nowiny od samego początku towarzyszy cierpienie i prześladowanie (w. 14). Czy chcę jak Jan iść drogą Jezusa? Wyznam Jezusowi moje oddanie, ale także moje lęki i opory.

"Czas się wypełnił i bliskie jest królestwo Boże" (w. 15). Pomyślę, że Jezus kieruje te słowa wprost do mnie. Mój najważniejszy czas już się wypełnił. Jezus przyszedł dla mnie. Dla mnie cierpiał, umierał na krzyżu i zmartwychwstał. Ze swej strony uczynił wszystko, co mógł.

Królestwo łaski jest tak blisko mnie jak tylko jest to możliwe. Ode mnie zależy moje wieczne szczęście. Czas mojego życia jest czymś bardzo względnym wobec czasu wiecznego królestwa.

Poproszę Jezusa, aby Jego słowa "Nawracajcie się i wierzcie w Ewangelię" przeniknęły mnie i głęboko przejęły (w. 15). Jakie odczucia wywołuje we mnie wezwanie do nawrócenia? Jaki powinien być mój pierwszy krok w stronę nawrócenia?

Będę wpatrywał się w Piotra, Andrzeja, Jakuba i Jana. Wyobrażę sobie, jak zarzucają sieci, jak przy łodzi zajęci są pracą, która była całym ich życiem, zawsze blisko ojca. Spotkanie z Jezusem tak głęboko ich porusza, że zostawiają wszystko i idą za Nim (ww. 16-20).

Wrócę pamięcią do osobistych spotkań z Jezusem, które przemieniły moje życie. Zapytam siebie, jaki jest obecnie poziom mojej "pierwotnej miłości" do Jezusa. Czy się pogłębia? Czy nie osłabł? Czy nie wracam do moich "sieci", które kiedyś dla Niego zostawiłem?



Będę szczerze rozmawiał z Jezusem o mojej wierności i niewierności.

Zaproszę Go na nowo w moje życie. Będę prosił, aby rozbudził we mnie silne pragnienie nawrócenia I zerwania z nieuporządkowanymi przywiązaniami. Będę częściej wyznawał: "Chcę być wolny dla Ciebie!".
