Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process through which people may join or complete their initiation into the Catholic Church. The RCIA is for three groups of people: those who are not baptized; those who were baptized into another Christian denomination and wish to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church; and baptized Catholics who were never formed in the Catholic faith and have not received the sacrament of Confirmation nor Eucharist.

RCIA consists of four periods of formation which are marked by rituals that celebrate what has been completed and call a person into the next phase. There is no specific length of time for each period. The RCIA is a journey which gives a person time for prayer, study, and conversion so as to hear the Word of God and embrace the call to discipleship and holiness.
