PARISH PROTOCOL DURING THE COLD AND FLU SEASON (Advent to Holy Week)

This seems an appropriate time to suspend the reception of the chalice at Mass as we enter the cold and flu season. If you have a bad cold or flu, you are dispensed from the Sunday Mass obligation. Also, simply acknowledge people at Mass with a friendly nod or gesture if you have a cold. Hand disinfectant is available at all the doors of the Church.

We celebrated the birth in Bethlehem, the arrival of the magi, and now, thirty years later, the baptism of the Lord by his cousin, John the Baptist. John is the bridge between the Hebrew Scriptures and the Gospels. He witnessed to the Truth; and so do we in our daily Christian lives. Next week we return to so-called Ordinary Time. For the faithful Christian, however, nothing is ever ordinary!

The Gospel from Luke for this weekend needs some nuance. While other details are provided in the Gospel of John, two important things in the biblical tradition are highlighted today. First, note that "heaven was opened." When heaven was "closed," there is not only no rain, but also no word from God to be proclaimed by the prophets to the people of Israel. Those years were prophetically dry; parched like the dry earth awaiting the spring rain. Secondly, unlike the Transfiguration on Mount Tabor (Matt. 17:5, Mark 9:7, Luke 9:35) where the heavenly voice spoke to Peter, James and John, here the voice from heaven *speaks to Jesus*; "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." With this affirmation of the Father, Jesus is driven then into the desert, but I'll save that exposition for another time.

St. Margaret School will have an Open House scheduled for the last Sunday of the month (Jan. 27) followed by Catholic Schools Week. Take note that we have moved Grandparent's Mass to May, to ensure better weather. Did you know that local public school students have scored significantly lower on standardized tests in both Math and ELA than Saint Margaret's students?
