Dear parishioners, family, and friends of St. Margaret,

Merry Christmas! What a joyful day it is to celebrate together the gift of Christ this year. As you know the business of the "holiday season" often finds us running around quite a bit to prepare for this very day. Now it is here, and hopefully all the preparation and business will lend itself to a time of rest in the Lord. Being together is so very important throughout the year, yet is it more the case during Christmas time.

As the days have become shorter and the memories of our youth and past come flooding in, it is good to be among those you love. The Christmas story reminds us of that great joy the comes with the birth of a new child. But this child is not only a small helpless child, it is the very coming together of God and Humanity. In Jesus, we now see the face of God in human form. It is not an imposing face, but one of a small little innocent child. How beautiful it is; that God could have come to us in any way, but chose to do so in this way.
