PASTOR'S CORNER

Spiritual Lessons from St. Francis de Sales "Different Forms of Love"

There are two forms of love. One is called love of benevolence (unselfish) and the other love of concupiscence (selfish). The love of concupiscence is that by which we love something for the benefit we expect from it. The love of benevolence is that by which we love a thing for its own good.

If When a person to whom we wish good already possess it, then we wish it for him by the pleasure and satisfaction which we have because he already possesses the good, we wish him. Thus, the love that arises here is called a gratifying love. Gratifying love is nothing but an act of the will by which it unites and joins itself to the pleasure, satisfaction and good of another. Love of desire is that we wish good for a person, who does not possess it yet.

When the love of benevolence is practiced without response from the person loved, it is called simple benevolent love. When there is mutual response, it is called love of friendship. If we love a friend simply without preferring him to others, it is simple friendship. If we prefer him, then such a friendship is called affection. When we do not prefer a friend to others by this affection, it called simple affection. On the contrary, if we prefer a friend very much above others, then this friendship is called deep affection.

The esteem and deep friendship we have for a friend is great and unequalled. Still it can be compared with others. In this case it is called eminent friendship. If this eminent friendship is beyond any comparison, then it is called incomparable, supreme and super eminent affection. In a word, it is a charity that is due only to God. The word charity is kept for the love of God as the highest and supreme affection.
