



PASTOR'S CORNER

WHO OWNS THE GARDEN?

Have you ever wished you could see the Garden of Eden? The idea fills every Christian with awe. Have you ever wondered who was the rightful owner of the Garden? Did God give it to Adam?

Genesis 2:15 says, "The Lord God then took the man and placed him in the Garden of Eden, to cultivate it and care of for it." Humans were not given the garden for ownership but for stewardship. This is our true place in the world: God is the owner of all creation, and we are His stewards who are responsible for caring and tending His creation. God created us to enjoy the work required to tend and cultivate the world He gave us. So, if this is true, then why do I at times feel overwhelmed by work? In Genesis 3: 17-19, God curses the ground because of Adam's disobedience: "Cursed is the ground because of you! In toil you shall eat its yield all the days of your life."

Although Adam was no longer welcome in the garden, God never stopped loving humans. Reflecting upon the above made me realize that God does want us to enjoy our work. We can feel a sense of accomplishment when we do our best to complete a project. This feeling can be a great source of joy, especially if we use our eyes of faith and recognize that when we are finished, we can look to God and say, I am working diligently to attend Your Garden; this is my gift to you. You have provided me with the skills and ability, and I desire nothing more than to use them to please You. I acknowledge that all I have belongs to You. Therefore, my only desire is to be a good and trustworthy servant.

We also know that God gave us a free will, so that we are not slaves but are free to choose between good or evil. The creator is the owner. God, as our creator, is actually the owner of our body and soul. Because we are stewards of these facilities, we therefore have the responsibility to tend, cultivate and to preserve them to return to God. I believe we all have a hidden underlying desire which calls us to return to Heaven to be with our wonderful creator. Jesus came into the world to show us the path back home. Why was this necessary?

One obstacle blocked our access into Heaven. Adam's disobedience brought sin into the human race. Jesus overcame the bondage of sin and reopened the gates of Heaven by dying on the cross for us. He also gave us the Sacraments of Penance and the Eucharist to give us the nourishment to make our return trip to Heaven. These two Sacraments feed and strengthen our soul's natural desire to return to be with God in Heaven.

Why is sin so deadly? Who is the creator of sin? We will look at these questions in Part Two.


