

Most Holy Trinity Sunday



The mystery of the Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and life. God reveals himself as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The doctrine of the Trinity includes three truths of faith.

First, the Trinity is One. We do not speak of three gods but of one God. Each of the Persons is fully God. They are a unity of Persons in one divine nature.

Second, the Divine Persons are distinct from each other. Father, Son, and Spirit are not three appearances or modes of God, but three identifiable persons, each fully God in a way distinct from the others.

Third, the Divine Persons are in relation to each other. The distinction of each is understood only in reference

to the others. The Father cannot be the Father without the Son, nor can the Son be the Son without the Father. The Holy Spirit is related to the Father and the Son who both send him forth.

All Christians are baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. The Trinity illumines all the other mysteries of faith.

Saint of the Week

Saint Ephrem, Deacon and Doctor of the Church c. 306–373 | FEAST DAY JUNE 9

Known to Syrian Christians as "the harp of the Holy Ghost," this Mesopotamian from Nisibia was baptized at 18 and may have accompanied his bishop to the Council of Nicaea in 325. He served as head of the cathedral school and left Nisibia only after it became Persian. In 363 he moved to a cave overlooking Edessa but preached frequently in the city and wrote many poems, hymns and biblical commentaries; he organized a choir of women to sing his hymns during liturgies. About 370 he visited St. Basil in Caesarea. The winter before his death, he earned praise for managing relief supplies during a severe famine in Edessa. Ephraem is the only Syrian father declared a doctor of the church.



Home Parish: Sacred Heart Church, Richmond, TX

Seminary: Holy Trinity Seminary, Irving, TX

I grew up in Sacred Heart Church in Richmond, TX, since it was across the street from my dad's clinic. I attended Catholic School from kindergarten through high school at Holy Rosary Catholic School in Rosenberg and Pope John XXIII High School (now St. John XXIII) College Preparatory) in Katy. I was trained as an altar server in my parish in fifth grade and have continued to do that in college at after I graduated. I also joined a Boy Scout troop, reaching the rank of Eagle Scout at the end of high school. In high school, I helped to lead daily prayer. I attended university at Texas A&M University where I had the opportunity to live and do behind-the-scenes work at St. Mary's Catholic Center. I graduated with a B.S. in Engineering Technology, specializing in Manufacturing and Mechanical Engineering Technology.

I like to center my prayer around the liturgy. I was introduced to praying Morning Prayer as a freshman in high school and committed to praying Morning, Evening, and Night Prayer and attending daily Mass in college. I also like to use Gregorian chant and sacred polyphony (e.g. Palestrina) and even other church music to aid my prayer. I have found that God has been walking with me in all of the people that I know, especially in the generosity of my family and my friends and I strive to imitate that generosity in service.

My call to seminary and priesthood has developed gradually. I think that my experiences as an altar server began to sow the seeds of a vocation. In junior high, I saw the U.S. Bishops' film *Fishers of Men*. The scene where the priest went to anoint the teenager at an accident scene really struck me because it showed the importance of even the little actions of a priest. I was also blessed with a very faithful, hard-working and friendly parish priest, Fr. Howard Drabek. I had a high school theology teacher who encouraged me to discern the priesthood. Finally, in college, my foundation was supplemented at St. Mary's Catholic Center, under now-Bishop David Konderla, especially after living and working at the center for three years.

Favorite Scripture: Ps. 16:11: "You will show me the path of life, the fullness of joy in your presence, the delights of your right hand forever."

This verse concludes a psalm expressing trust in God's providence. It reminds me that even with all of the attractions that the world has to offer, I can find true joy only in the presence of the Lord, especially in prayer. Furthermore, I know that God will lead me through life's difficulties, not abandoning me to destruction, but guiding me to the fullness of joy, namely: everlasting life with Him in heaven. I consider a theme of my discernment to be abandonment to God's will.

If you are a parent or grandparent or even just an admirer of a young child, your refrigerator door may be the showcase of one or more paintings or drawings. To a visitor, that work of art may be just a mass of scribbles, but to the one who loves the child it is a masterpiece. We love the gift because of the person who made it and gave it to us. It is precious to us because it was a gift from the heart. The motive of the child was pure and loving.

Perhaps our gifts to God are similar. We're such amateurs, such babies. God could accomplish his work so much more efficiently by himself. Our works, even if monumental by human standards, are just scribbles if God would judge them in relation to his ability. Because he loves us, though – and loves us far more than a parent or grandparent loves a child – He looks at our works with eyes of love. He sees our hearts and knows we are motivated by love and faith, and he is pleased. He is so pleased that, if he had a refrigerator, he'd use it to display our works done for his glory.

God has given us gifts to use for this purpose – to glorify him by serving others. In 1 Peter 4:10 we read, "Each one should use whatever gift he has received to serve others, faithfully administering God's grace in its various forms." God has seen to it that each of us has something to offer. He gives us the privilege of serving and then provides all that we need to do so.

Just as the budding art student improves with the help of a teacher and with appropriate tools to create his work, so does God teach us through his Word how to fulfill our purpose and how to improve our service. So also he gives gifts of time and money and talents and then his Word and Sacrament to strengthen us for service.
