



**THE SPIRIT'S ACTIVE POWER** 

June 5, 2022

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Pentecost Sunday

The mystery of the Trinity refers to one God in three persons. We frequently acknowledge Jesus as "the second person of the Trinity," but referring also to the Spirit as a "person" comes less naturally. In religious art, the Holy Spirit often appears as a dove or, as in today's reading from the Acts of the Apostles, tongues of fire. Much rarer are images of the Spirit as a "person" in recognizable human form. Today's readings do not settle the issue of how to picture the Spirit, but they certainly give shape to the Spirit's active power in the world and in each human heart. In Acts, the Spirit enables people to speak and understand a variety of languages. Paul's letter to the Corinthians praises the Spirit for all kinds of spiritual gifts, services, and "workings." Finally, in John's Gospel, Jesus calls the Spirit our Advocate and our divine teacher.

# PENTECOST

### A CONSPIRACY OF LOVE

Our lives are a conspiracy of love. *Con-spriacy* means "breathing together." From the moment that the "Breath of God" first gives life to our body (Gen 2:7), we start a lifetime of breathing together with God. Pentecost celebrates God's new life transforming us—a change that demands leaving behind old ways and adopting God's ways—a new vision of the world, new values and new behaviors.

The outward signs of the first Pentecost experience—wind and fire (Acts 2:2-4)—are tokens of transformation. The wind blows where it wills, always fluctuating and changing independently of our control. Fire never leaves anything it touches the same. Like God's transforming power, wind and fire are safe in small doses, but dangerous, uncontrolled, and even devastating when experienced at full power.

#### God's Holy Breath: Mystery and Mission

The reality of the Holy Spirit, the divine power of life and the bond of love, is a theological mystery. That is, although we affirm *that* the Father and the Son share the same Holy Spirit or "Breath" of divine life that draws them together into a communion of love, we cannot explain how this happens.

The Holy Spirit is our way of experiencing how God dwells deep within us to empower us for living and to draw us together into a community through the power of love. Breath is the sign of life—we can't do without it—and vigorous breathing is a sign of vital power at work. When we detect the Holy Spirit, we know that God is somehow present and working.

God's Holy Breath always accompanies God's Word. Just as we cannot speak words without using breath, so likewise when God sends the Word, God also sends the Holy Spirit (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, #689). God's Holy Spirit empowers us to hear and understand God's Word, then to act on it in our lives.

Filled with the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, the disciples responded by their public witness to the Christian message and their community life of worship and solidarity. From that time onward, the Christian community has continued to proclaim the meaning of Jesus' saving work and to invite all humanity to believe and to share in the life of God.



## The Spirit at Work in Us

The disciples' transformation was based on their astounding experience of first meeting the risen Christ and then being empowered by God's Holy Spirit. Through baptism, the Holy Spirit also now dwells in us and transforms us from within into living images of God and Christ (Gen 1:26-27; 2 Cor 3:18). We are reminded of this transforming power when we imagine the Holy Spirit as fire. "As fire transforms into itself everything it touches, so the Holy Spirit transforms into the divine life whatever is subjected to his power" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, #1127). So whenever the fire of the Holy Spirit touches us, we cannot but be changed.

But unlike regular fire which usually destroys things, God's transforming fire changes us into something better. We become images of Christ by taking on the mind of Christ, his attitudes, his values and his behaviors to continue his mission of building God's covenant community of justice, love and peace on earth.

The Holy Spirit is always at work empowering us for new life in Christ and bonding us into the Christian community. This work is done through the theological gifts of faith, hope and charity that help us to live in right relationship with God and others, through the celebration of the sacraments that bond us into Christ and his community, and finally through particular personal gifts given to us as individuals to use to help build up the community (1 Cor 12:4-11). As the Holy Spirit works within us to help us put on the mind of Christ and live according to his gospel values, we become more receptive to the Holy Spirit's guidance and more eager to follow where the Spirit leads us.

- Where and how have I recently experienced the promptings of the Holy Spirit in my life?
- How have I most experienced the Holy Spirit drawing me into a deeper relationship with God and Jesus and the Holy Spirit?
- What gifts has the Holy Spirit given to me for building up the Christian community and how have I used them?



When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim. —Acts 2:1-4

# Come Holy Spirit

Veni Sancte Spiritus, ("Come Holy Spirit") is the Sequence Prayer before the Gospel in the Mass for Pentecost. Originally an ancient Latin hymn, it reminds us that whenever we pray, we should call upon God and Jesus to send us their Holy Spirit, the bond of love between them, to join us to them and to empower us for a life of witness and service leading to a life with God that will never end.

Come, Holy Spirit, come! And from your celestial home Shed a ray of light divine!

Come, Father of the poor! Come, source of all our store! Come, within our bosoms shine.

You, of comforters the best; You, the soul's most welcome guest; Sweet refreshment here below;

In our labor, rest most sweet; Grateful coolness in the heat; Solace in the midst of woe.

O most blessed Light divine, Shine within these hearts of yours, And our inmost being fill!

Where you are not, we have naught, Nothing good in deed or thought, Nothing free from taint of ill.

Heal our wounds, our strength renew; On our dryness pour your dew; Wash the stains of guilt away:

Bend the stubborn heart and will; Melt the frozen, warm the chill; Guide the steps that go astray.

On the faithful, who adore And confess you, evermore In your sevenfold gift descend;

Give them virtue's sure reward; Give them your salvation, Lord; Give them joys that never end. Amen. Alleluia.

## Pentecost Sunday

Acts 2:1-11 | 1 Cor 12:3b-7, 12-13 or Rom 8:8-17 | Jn 20:19-23 or Jn 14:15-16, 23b-26

#### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

"Peace be with you." On hearing those four simple words, the fear that had paralyzed the disciples gives way to rejoicing. We, too, can feel paralyzed at times – by fear, yes – but also indecision, conflict, negativity, and perhaps even headlines that remind us how fractured our world has become. Yet here is Jesus, wishing us peace and giving us the gift of Pentecost: our Advocate, the Holy Spirit. As Jesus breathes on the disciples, he confers upon them a Spirit of peace that will allow them to push past their fears and build up the Church. "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." We, too, can turn to the Holy Spirit in times of trouble to help us move forward in faith, sharing peace and reconciliation with those we encounter.

#### GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Sometimes after a tiring or stressful day, I head up to my room, kick my feet up, and mindlessly scan social media or whatever other distractions might pop up on my smartphone. A friend read somewhere that doing so amounts to effectively putting your time in the shredder! Today's readings challenge me and all of us to dig deeper. Why not, instead, find a quiet place to pray, asking the Holy Spirit for a refresh as we move into the next part of our day, which is indeed the first minute of the rest of our lives. There's nothing wrong with downtime! But in the Holy Spirit, we can find a source of inspiration, energy, and creativity. As St. Paul writes to the Corinthians, "There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit." Just as Jesus sent out the disciples, he sends us out to share our gifts to build up the Church.

ring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord"

(Ephesians 6:1-4).



## God waits for our "Yes"

God loves us and wants us to be happy with Him in Heaven forever, but He won't force

Himself on us. Out of respect for our free will, God asks that we cooperate with His grace to save us, but leaves it up to us to say, "Yes!"

Cultivate your faith. The better we know our Catholic Faith the easier it is to

know how to live it. The Catechism of the Catholic Church summarizes all major teachings of the Catholic Church. Read an article in it each day and learn a new term from the glossary weekly. Then, there will be no guessing about what Catholics believe.

Keep your conscience in shape.

A well-formed conscience signals us when a choice is virtuous (good) or sinful (bad). Review what

Commandments and
the Beatitudes require.
Meditate on the
examples of Jesus and
Mary in the Gospels
and how your behavior
compares.

Stay close to the Sacraments. Through the Sacraments we directly encounter Christ. Attend Confession monthly and

Mass at least weekly. This is the best way to stay close to God and His Heart.

Perform Works of Mercy. God uses these opportunities to conform us more fully to Christ. Find ways to serve your parish in time, resources, or gifts. It is Jesus who ultimately receives our gift (Matthew 25:40).



# Why do Catholics use the different titles when we address the clergy?

After Jesus ascended, the Church grew so quickly that the spiritual needs of the Christian community demanded a global hierarchy of clergy to minister to them while maintaining the unity of the Faith. In response, the Apostles ordained deacons to assist so they could


Today, there are different titles for different roles and levels of authority. For example, we are most likely to encounter ts ("Father"), deacons, and

priests ("Father"), deacons, and bishops ("Your Excellency," or "Your Grace").


#### Three invaluable lessons from the Sacred Heart devotion

Attaining holiness can seem overwhelming and complicated, but Jesus makes it simple: "Learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart" (Matthew 11:29). Follow the lessons of His Sacred Heart.

Focus on Jesus. We often get in trouble when we lose sight of who Jesus is (God) and how much He loves us. Actually, God is always close and loves us with an infinite, intense, burning love. Keep an image of the Sacred Heart nearby for when you feel discouraged or disconnected from Him.



"Love is not loved!" Jesus wants our love but is often rejected by our sins. Love Jesus for those who won't. Spend time with Him and thank Him for what He's done for you. Offer Him your sufferings for a soul in need.



# the cost of discipleship

Jesus' listeners often got swept up by his charismatic manner and professed eagerness to follow him. But they weren't always prepared for what it took to be a true disciple.

In this Gospel passage, a young man asked to follow Jesus but was deflated when Jesus pointed out that He had no home and none of the things considered necessary for a happy life. Jesus warned that it wouldn't always be comfortable to follow him.

The timing wasn't right for the second man. He promised to follow Jesus but

said he needed to fulfill his duty to his dying father first. In truth,

> Jesus sets the priorities we follow. Our duty is to obey. Finally, Jesus used the example of plowing a field to make His point. If you look back while plowing it can ruin the job. He used that example to help the third man

have a singleness of purpose to be His disciple. We will have to make sacrifices to follow Jesus. But He promises us that the rewards will be worth much more.

June 4 - St. Francis Caracciolo (1608). St. Francis was born in the Abruzzo region in Italy. He went on to found the Minor Clerks Regular with St. John Adorno. The Order was approved in 1588, and St. Francis became its superior for life.

June 6 - Mary, Mother of the Church (2018). On the Cross, Jesus gave us His mother to be our mother (John 19:27). Even in Heaven, she prays and cares for us as our spiritual mother.

June 19 - Corpus Christi Sunday.

On this solemnity, we celebrate the transformation of the bread and wine into Jesus' Body and Blood in the Holy Eucharist. This solemnity was established by Pope Urban IV in 1264 in response to the need for a Eucharistic feast day.

June 23 - The Nativity of St. John the Baptist (1st century). Before St. John was born, his father, Zechariah received a message from the angel Gabriel foretelling his birth. His doubt was punished by his being struck speechless until John's birth.



#### Why are there different lists of Apostles?

Ever wonder why there seem to be different Apostles in different Gospels? For instance, there's a "Judas, not the Iscariot" at the Last Supper (John 14:22) who isn't mentioned anywhere else.

Likewise, Nathanael. who asked "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" (John


1:46), is absent in the other Gospels. Usually, the difference is because some of the Apostles had two names. For example, St. Matthew the tax collector. before joining Jesus, is "Levi" (Mark 2:14; Luke 5:27). The "other" Judas is called Thaddaeus. Nathanael is in the other Gospels, too, but under his Jewish surname, Bartholomew (Bar-Tolomai, "son of Tolomai").

Considering that half of the Twelve Apostles would have shared a name with another Apostle, some may have changed names to avoid confusion, e.g. Judas-not-the-Iscariot changing his name to Thaddaeus. All these differences show that the Apostles, who came from diverse backgrounds, were called for one mission of building up the Kingdom. Likewise, God calls us to build up the Kingdom, and gives each an important role in it.

#### ¿Por qué usamos distintos títulos los católicos para dirigirnos al clero?

## Tres inapreciables lecciones de la devoción al Sagrado Corazón

"¡El amor no es amado!" Jesús quiere nuestro amor pero es a menudo rechazado por nuestros pecados. Amen a Jesús por los que no lo hacen. Pasen tiempo con él y agradézcanle lo que ha hecho por ustedes. Ofrézcanle sus sufrimientos por un alma que lo necesite.

# scrituras Lucas 9:51-62,

# el precio del discipulado

Los que escuchaban a Jesús a menudo se dejaban llevar por su carisma y declaraban su entusiasmo por seguirlo. Pero no siempre estaban preparados para

lo que conlleva ser un auténtico discípulo.

En este pasaje evangélico, un hombre joven pidió seguir a Jesús pero se decepcionó cuando Jesús le indicó que él carecía de hogar y de las cosas consideradas necesarias para una vida feliz. Jesús le advirtió que no siempre sería cómodo seguirlo.

El momento no era oportuno para el segundo hombre. Prometió seguir a Jesús pero dijo que debía cumplir la obligación debida a su padre moribundo. Lo cierto es que Jesús establece las prioridades que seguimos. Nuestra

> obligación es obedecer. Finalmente Jesús usó el ejemplo del arado de un campo para insistir en su mensaje. Si al arar se mira hacia atrás se puede arruinar el surco. Usó este ejemplo para ayudar a que el tercer hombre entendiera que para ser

discípulo de Jesús nuestro objetivo debe ser único. Tendremos que hacer sacrificios para seguir a Jesús. Pero nos promete que las recompensas valdrán mucho más.



4 de junio - San Francisco Caracciolo (1608). San Francisco nació en la región italiana de los Abruzos. Fundó la Orden Regular de Clérigos Menores con san Juan Adorno. La orden fue ratificada en 1588 y san Francisco fue el superior por vida.

10 de junio - María, Madre de la Iglesia (2018). Cuando estaba en la Cruz, Jesús nos dio a su madre para que fuera nuestra madre (Juan 19:27). Incluso desde el Cielo reza y se ocupa de nosotros como nuestra madre espiritual.

19 de junio - Domingo de Corpus Christi. En esta solemnidad celebramos la transformación del pan y el vino en el Cuerpo y la Sangre en la Sagrada Eucaristía. Esta solemnidad fue establecida por el papa Urbano IV en 1264 como respuesta a la necesidad de una festividad eucarística.

23 de junio - El nacimiento de san Juan Bautista (siglo I). Antes de que san Juan naciera, su padre Zacarías recibió un mensaje del ángel Gabriel profetizando su nacimiento. Por dudar fue castigado con la mudez hasta el nacimiento de Juan.



#### ¿Por qué hay & distintas listas R de Apóstoles?

¿Se ha preguntado alguna vez por qué parece que hay distintos Apóstoles en los distintos Evangelios? Por ejemplo, hay un "Judas, no el Iscariote" en la Última Cena (Juan 14:22), que no se menciona en



ninguna otra parte. Así mismo, Natanael que preguntó "¡Acaso puede salir algo bueno de Nazaret?" (Juan

1:46), está ausente de los otros Evangelios. Generalmente la diferencia radica en que algunos de los Apóstoles tenía dos nombres. Por ejemplo san Mateo, el recaudador de impuestos, antes de conocer a Jesús es Leví (Marcos 2:14; Lucas 5:27). El "otro" Judas se llama Tadeo. Natanael está en los otros Evangelios también, pero con su apelativo judío, Bartolomé (Bar-Tolomai, "hijo de Tolomai").

Teniendo en cuenta que la mitad de los Doce Apóstoles habría compartido un nombre con otro Apóstol, es posible que alguno cambiara el nombre para evitar confusiones, por ejemplo, Judas "no el Iscariote" a Tadeo. Todas estas diferencias muestran que los Apóstoles, que provenían de entornos diversos, fueron llamados para una misión, la de construir el Reino. Dios nos llama también a nosotros para construir el Reino y nos da una importante función en esta misión.

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
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
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
