MARY: THE MOTHER OF GOD

FOURTH EASTER SUNDAY REFLECTION

The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. (Psalm 23:1)

Shepherds know that their sheep need to feed on good, lush pasture to grow and flourish. Jesus, our Good Shepherd, knows what we need to flourish as well, so he promises that we will "find pasture" in him (John 10:9). On this Good Shepherd Sunday, let's take some time to follow Jesus into the "verdant pastures" promised in the responsorial psalm (Psalm 23:2).

Start by closing your eyes and taking some deep, calming breaths. Then picture Jesus in front of you, staff in hand. Let him look on you with loving eyes and a gentle smile. Stay with this image for a few minutes, and then watch as he turns and beckons you to follow him. Where is he leading you? Into the fertile pastures that lie deep in your soul, that place where he abides.

In this place of beauty and stillness, you quiet your mind and let the tension drain out of you. You lie down in the soft grass and let it cushion your head (Psalm 23:2). My dear child, Jesus tells you, let nothing disturb you. I have everything in hand.

After a time, Jesus leads you by the hand to a small lake nearby. You recognize the "restful waters" that the psalmist speaks of (Psalm 23:2). Jesus urges you to cup your hands and take a long drink. The water is cool, refreshing, and sweet to the taste, and you keep drinking. Finally, you feel completely rested and satisfied. The Lord has restored your soul (23:3).

The Good Shepherd came so that you "might have life and have it more abundantly" (John 10:10). This life grows and deepens in prayer. It's Jesus' own life in you. So let him lead you each day to the rich pastures where he is waiting for you. There you will find refreshment, restoration, and peace.

"Jesus, you are my Good Shepherd who leads and guides me. There is nothing and no one else I want but you." The Word Among Us

¡ Él llama a cada una por su nombre. (Juan 10, 3) El domingo del Buen Pastor a menudo trae a la mente imágenes de un gentil pastor con su cayado en la mano, sentado pacíficamente en praderas verdes, rodeado de ovejas inmaculadas y dóciles.

Pero esta imagen se queda corta en dos aspectos: Primero, el pastor y el rebaño a menudo están llenos de tierra. Segundo, Jesús se llamó a sí mismo "pastor" como una forma de reprender a los "pastores" judíos, los jefes religiosos que acababan de rechazarlo y expulsar a un hombre al cual él había devuelto la vista. Un verdadero pastor conoce bien a sus ovejas y las conduce con cuidado. Sus ovejas reconocen su voz y lo siguen. Y Jesús, el buen pastor, llega tan lejos que "da su vida por las ovejas" (Juan 10, 11).

En este pasaje podemos leer las palabras de Jesús como una corrección para sus oponentes, pero podemos aprender algo nosotros mismos también. Todos somos pastores para el pueblo de Dios de una forma u otra y estamos llamados a cuidar de su pueblo siguiendo los pasos de Jesús, nuestro pastor. Nuestro "rebaño" puede incluir a nuestros hijos, nuestros padres o nuestros alumnos de catequesis. Pero debemos recordar que esas ovejas le pertenecen a Jesús y no a nosotros. El Señor los valora a cada uno de ellos y desea que nosotros reflejemos su amor y autosacrificio.

Así que pregúntate: "¿Qué tan bien conozco a mis ovejas? ¿Sé los nombres de mis compañeros de trabajo o hermanos de la parroquia? ¿Conozco las dificultades que mi familia está enfrentando?" A veces estamos tan ocupados en nuestros propios asuntos que ignoramos el dolor, el cansancio o el temor de quienes están a nuestro lado. Pero siguiendo el ejemplo de Jesús, podemos dejar de lado nuestras preocupaciones, "llamarlos por su nombre" y escuchar sus necesidades. Quizá incluso podemos conducirlos a un lugar de paz. Así podemos ser pastores para las ovejas de Dios.

"Señor, te pido que hoy me ayudes a entregar mi vida por tus ovejas."







In addition, the mandatory renewal training must be completed every 5 years and a new background check submitted before the 5-year expiration of prior training.

JESUS WANTED TO BE PRESENT AT MY WEDDING

It was fifteen years ago, but I can remember it as if it were yesterday. In the early morning, I sat in a hotel room in Brazil, the sun streaming through the large open windows. It was my wedding day, and I was beginning this day that my fiancée and I had longed for with so much joy by praying with Scripture. So much preparation had gone into the plans for our wedding, which included getting special permission from the local archbishop to have our wedding celebrated within the Holy Mass. It was the custom in that diocese for the Sacrament of Matrimony to be celebrated outside the context of Mass. The permission was granted, and we had a dear priest friend of ours fly across the world to celebrate our nuptial Mass and witness our marriage. As I prayed that morning, I was filled with such gratitude and joy.

A Very Special Guest

I opened my Bible to the Gospel passage my fiancée and I had chosen for our wedding and had memorized during our engagement, John 2:1-11, the wedding feast at Cana. As I read the familiar words, I closed my eyes and felt the gentle breeze on my face. The air smelled fresh and clean. I imagined myself as an observer at that Jewish wedding feast. In my mind's eye, I looked around the room and visualized the people who were there, the jars along the side of the wall filled with water that would be transformed by Jesus into the finest wine, the dancing, the music, the food, the joy, and the bride and bridegroom beaming with love.

A thought suddenly occurred to me: "Who were this bride and bridegroom? Who were these people who knew Mary and Jesus and invited them to their wedding?" As I sought to create an image of the happy couple, I wondered whether they were important people, local authorities, or perhaps active members of the synagogue. What families had they come from? Were their parents perhaps noble acquaintances of the Lord and his mother? The more I thought about these questions, the more amazed I became. "Who were these people who deserved such an honor as to have Jesus himself attend their wedding?"

The Wedding Gift of Grace

I had no sooner realized the awesome privilege of the wedding couple at Cana when the Holy Spirit spoke to my heart and inspired me to wonder, "Who am I that Jesus himself is coming to my wedding?" In just a few short hours, Jesus himself would be truly present at Mass—in Word and in Sacrament. As my husband and I pledged to give all of ourselves to one another forever, Jesus would strengthen our self-giving through his grace which was poured out in his Death and Resurrection and re-presented in the Eucharist. Jesus was coming to our wedding to personally give us the grace we would need to live our vocation well. He was coming not just to turn water into wine for a party, but to transform wine into his own Blood to nourish and help us to remain in him and to be faithful to each other for life. Wow, I remember thinking, now almost in tears. Jesus himself was coming to my wedding this very day! I still remember that meditation as clear as a bell.



I marvel that I was loved and worthy of Jesus attending my wedding, just as that bride in Cana was honored with his presence thousand years ago. It was amazing to think that Jesus *wanted* to be present at my wedding. The Mass has remained one of greatest gifts my husband and I cherish in our marriage. We have lived in many places and travel often. It is so beautiful that we assist at Mass with our children wherever we go, no matter the language. I am in awe each day thinking that Jesus invites us to table to feed us and refresh us on our journey. There is room for us at his table. There is also room for you.

MARRIAGE PREPARATION CLASS

Our PREPARATION OF MARRIAGE program here at Christ Our Light works with the state of Texas and the Twogether In Texas Program. We have gone through a lengthy review process to gain our qualification to provide the marriage program course to you. Once you have completed your preparation of marriage program, we will then log into the official Twogether In Texas Program website with the state of Texas. We input your name and your future spouse's name. The state's site then generates a unique certificate for you two that includes your registration number. Having this number indicates that you have been registered as completing the course with Texas. Any Texas clerk of court will then have record that you and your spouse have completed the course. We receive your certificate immediately from the State of Texas, and will then email you an electronic copy of your official Twogether In Texas Premarital Program certificate. The Twogether In Texas certificate will give you 1) Up to \$60 off of your marriage license and 2) Waiting the 72 hours requirement waiting period with the State of Texas. Our Lady of Banneux: The Village, Priest, and Vow That Changed the World

Today marks the 88th anniversary of the Blessed Mother visiting a brokenhearted Belgian village called Banneux. Though the apparition has been approved by the Church, it is barely known—even though what unfolded there spurred one of the greatest accounts in Church history of Our Lady's intermediary work through a single man—Washington D.C. native Venerable Aloysius Schwartz.

What follows is the incomprehensible story of how Our Lady of <u>Banneux</u>—or the Virgin or the Poor—worked through a lonely seminarian who changed the course of the world by making a promise to his Queen.

In the 1950s, in the midst of battling prolonged illnesses, a language barrier, persistently miserable weather, and a concentration camp-scarred seminary rector, Al Schwartz—the lone American seminarian with the Société des Auxiliaires des Mission (the Samists)—often traveled southeast by train through Belgium's green-blanketed farming communities to reach tiny Banneux. Not a single Belgian mapmaker even thought to include it. It was a town World War I German soldiers didn't notice on their westward march right through it.

But the town drew Al, in the manner a sunflower bends to the sun's rays. By the time he was in his second year at the Catholic University of Louvain, Banneux had become a part of his soul. He desired union with Mary, who rose in him there like a small flame of consolation during tough seminary days.

Before he returned to America to become ordained in the summer of 1957, Al caught a train to Banneux one last time where he gave Mary his life—at the same spot where she appeared to 12-year-old Mariette Beco twenty-four years earlier. He vowed to Mary that everything he did in the days that followed would be as her slave. It could be argued, with great success, that the language of heaven that Mary brought to the peasant Mariette was designed not for her, but for the seminarian, Al, who is now on the path to canonization.

During the early years of his priesthood, Fr. Al spent unmeasured hours in contemplation of Mary's few words to the young girl. As he turned the messages from Mary's eight apparitions over in his head, he pieced together a holy system that would bestow incomprehensible inheritances on generations of the poverty-stricken and humiliated. Hundreds of thousands of the poorest people in the world would be given new life because of "Fr. Al."
