DAILY MEDITATION: MATTHEW 13:44-52

The kingdom of heaven is like a treasure buried in a field. (Matthew 13:44)

Today's Gospel begins with two parables that, taken together, illustrate a paradox about the kingdom of God. In the first parable, a man discovers, quite by surprise, a treasure "buried in a field" (Matthew 13:44). In the second, a merchant also comes across a great treasure—this time, a pearl—but only after searching very hard for it. So what is the kingdom of God like? Is it something we discover by grace? Or is it something we find through diligent seeking?

Jesus seems to be saying that it's both.

On the one hand, God in his infinite goodness pours grace into our lives whether we are seeking him or not. He buries rich treasure in the field of our lives—treasures of his kindness, his love, his presence—in the hopes that we will find them, and so find him. God provides these gifts for everyone, just as he causes the rain to fall "on the just and the unjust" (Matthew 5:45).

At the same time, there are some graces that we discover only as we seek the Lord. The very act of searching for God opens our hearts more fully to his grace. It stretches us and makes us more willing to let go of anything that would keep us from him. And the more we seek him, the more our capacity for his grace grows. As we "sell" what we have, we experience even more of his goodness, mercy, and joy.

God has so much that he wants to give us. But this all-powerful, ever-generous God will not force his grace upon us. We have to choose to receive it. Even the man who finds the buried treasure by surprise ends up selling all he has "and buys that field" (Matthew 13:44)!

Today, ask the Spirit to help you unearth the treasures of grace in your field. Ask him to help you "sell all you have" to find the Lord and his pearls of grace. Pursue him with all your heart! You won't be disappointed.

The Word Among Us

MEDITACIÓN: MATEO 13, 44-52

El Reino de los cielos se parece también a un comerciante en perlas finas. (Mateo 13, 45)

¿Qué buscas en la vida? Todos están buscando algo. Los niños anhelan un juguete especial. Los adolescentes buscan un novio o una novia o el éxito en el colegio. Las personas que trabajan pueden estar buscando la siguiente gran oportunidad en su carrera. Las personas de cualquier edad pueden estar deseando seguridad financiera o paz mental.

El Evangelio de hoy nos presenta a alguien que también buscaba: Un comerciante que buscaba perlas finas. Al igual que muchos de nosotros, este comerciante estaba buscando algo específico. Y en medio de su búsqueda, encontró algo mucho más maravilloso de lo que esperaba: Una sola perla con un valor inconmensurable, "una perla muy valiosa" (Mateo 13, 46). Al verla dejó de buscar esas "perlas finas" y se dedicó plenamente a obtener esa perla única y hermosa. Tanto así, que tomó la decisión radical de vender todo lo que tenía para poder comprarla.

Quizá este comerciante no pudo venderlo todo de una sola vez. Probablemente hubo momentos en los que dudó de sí mismo. Pero siguió intentando, día tras día, artículo tras artículo, hasta que finalmente la obtuvo, la perla de sus sueños. ¡Finalmente estaba satisfecho!

Jesús dice que este mercante nos demuestra cómo es el Reino de los cielos. Está compuesto de personas como nosotros, que buscan la felicidad. De alguna manera, las cosas que buscamos *pueden* hacernos felices. Pero encontrar a Jesús y ser parte de su Reino sobrepasa la felicidad que cualquier otra cosa mundana podría ofrecernos. En él encontramos la respuesta a nuestros deseos más profundos de amor y reconciliación, de seguridad y plenitud, de propósito y significado.

No tengas dudas, las cosas que anhelamos generalmente son cosas buenas, pero recuerda al comerciante. No había nada de malo con las perlas que él estaba negociando, pero las vendió todas para poder obtener esa perla de gran valor.

"Señor, te pido que me ayudes a verte como esa perla que no tiene precio y que vale todo en mi vida."

SANTA MARIA MAGGIORE



Santa Maria Maggiore is proclaimed by most scholars as the second most beautiful church in Rome. Only St. Peter's Basilica itself is said to be more grandiose. One of the four major basilicas in Rome, it was the first church to be dedicated to the Virgin Mary and possesses a rich history. Pope Sixtus III built the present church in 431 AD to honor Mary, but two significant buildings preceded it at the site. Interestingly, they too were built to honor great women. The first building at the site stood in honor of the Roman goddess Juno. Built in 375 BC, it served as a pagan site of worship for hundreds of years before its destruction.

Much more is known of the second temple at the site. In 358 AD, a wealthy, heirless patrician decided to donate his fortune to the church. After informing Pope Liberius of his intent, the two were visited by the Virgin Mary in their sleep that evening, who informed them that she would give them a sign. The next morning, August 5th, Pope Liberius woke up to find snow fallen on the Esquiline Hill. Taking the snow in the heat of the summer to be the promised sign, Pope Liberius drew a plan for the church in the miraculous snow. Later, he used the donated money to build a church on the site dedicated to Mary. It stood for less than 80 years, after which it was replaced by Pope Sixtus III's present church.

Santa Maria Maggiore complex structure represents every major time period between the 5th and 13th centuries. The first feature which stands out prior to entry of the basilica is the bell tower. Built in the 1370's, its height of 75 meters makes it the highest in all of Rome. Standing on top of the Esquiline Hill, the tower overlooks all of Rome. The façade was designed in 1743 by Ferdinando Fuga, which covers a 14th century mosaic which was part of the previous entrance to the church. Also included in the entryway to the church is the Holy Door, its use reserved strictly for holy days.

Upon entry of the church, the expansive central nave stretches out in front of the viewer. Its ceiling was decorated in the 1400's with the first gold brought back to Europe from the New World. Lining the nave are beautiful mosaics dating back to the 400's when Pope Sixtus III built the church. They depict Old Testament stories of the history of the Israelites and are arranged chronologically from the front of the church to the rear. Dominating the front side of the nave is a triumphal arch covered with intricate mosaics arranged in four rows which depict scenes from Jesus' childhood. Beneath the triumphal arch, is the high altar which is above a relic which contains five pieces of wood said to be from the manger in which Christ was laid in Bethlehem. Behind the triumphal arch is the central apse, whose mosaic, dating to the late 13th century, is absolutely incredible. Mary and Jesus sit together at the center of the half-dome enthroned.

Below the mosaic are four-pointed windows, which are the earliest examples of gothic architecture in Rome. Lining the central nave are the Sistine Chapel, the Pauline Chapel, and the Sforza Chapel. The Sistine, or Holy Sacrament, Chapel was built in the 16th century, and each year, on August 5th to honor the miracle of the snow, white rose petals are showered from its ceiling. It contains a statue depicting St. Cajetan holding the Holy Child by Bernini, whose tomb is also in the church. The Pauline Chapel lies on the left side of the central nave, and was built by Pope Paul V in 1611. It contains an icon of the Virgin Mary said to be carried by Pope St. Gregory through the city to drive out the plague in 593. It was last used in a procession to battle a deadly outbreak of disease in 1837 when Pope Gregory XVI carried it to drive cholera out of the city. The Sforza Chapel was designed by Michelangelo in the 16th century and is adjacent to the Pauline Chapel.





A Noble Basque



Inigo de Loyola was born in Azpeitia in the Basque province of Guipuzcoa in northern Spain. He was the youngest of 13 children.

At the age of 16, Inigo left his home to serve as a page for Juan Velazques, treasurer of the kingdom of Castile. He was frequently at court and developed a taste for the material world.

During his difficult recovery, Inigo asked for books about chivalry, his favorite reading. There weren't any at the family castle where he convalesced, so he had to settle for a book about the life of Christ and biographies of the saints, topics which he found unexpectedly riveting.

The soldier had always dreamed of imitating heroes, but now, the heroes had names like Francis of Assis and Catherine of Siena. Ignatius also noticed something strange happening to him. God, he realized, was working within him — prompting, guiding, inviting.






In March of 1522, Ignatius was well enough to leave home with a newfound zeal to serve God. He came to the shrine of Our Lady of Montserrat and kept a vigil all night. He left his sword at the altar and gave his fine clothes to a poor man. He cast aside his life as a noble soldier and dressed himself in rough clothes and sandals so as to take up the life of a poor pilgrim.





Ignatius continued his education at the University of Paris. It was here where he introduced classmates to the Spiritual Exercises.





Themes for the 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A

The readings for the Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time for Year A are about the wisdom of God which is very different from the wisdom of the world. The first reading recalls how Solomon requested the gift of understanding instead of material goods or power. The psalm reminds us that God's commands are more precious than gold. The second reading tells us to work for God's purpose. And in the gospel Jesus gives us more parables related to the Kingdom of God, including the treasure in the field, the pearl of great price, and treasures new and old.

- The Kingdom of Heaven's Value: The gospel highlights the immense value of the Kingdom of Heaven, comparing it to a treasure hidden in a field and a pearl of great price. It emphasizes the worthiness of sacrificing everything to possess and experience the Kingdom's blessings.
- · Joy and Sacrifice: The response of the person who discovers the treasure and the merchant who finds the valuable pearl exemplifies the joy and willingness to sacrifice worldly possessions in order to obtain the Kingdom's eternal riches.
- Discernment and Understanding: Jesus emphasizes the importance of discernment and understanding in relation to the mysteries of the Kingdom. He likens the scribe instructed about the Kingdom to a householder who brings out treasures both old and new, suggesting the need to appreciate the timeless truths of Scripture while also being receptive to new revelations from God.
- · Separation of the Righteous and the Wicked: The parable of the dragnet highlights the final separation of the righteous and the wicked at the end of the age, emphasizing the importance of making choices that align with God's righteousness and the consequences of rejecting the Kingdom.
- Scribes as Teachers of the Kingdom: Jesus elevates the role of the scribes in teaching the Kingdom of Heaven, indicating the significance of sharing the truths of the Kingdom and its implications with others.
- The Call to Hear and Understand: Jesus concludes by urging His disciples to become like scribes trained for the Kingdom, emphasizing the need for attentive listening, understanding, and the application of Kingdom principles in their lives.

These parables tell us how precious the Kingdom of Heaven is. Jesus is explaining that it is more important than anything else in our lives. The men in the parables sold EVERYTHING they had to get the treasures.
