... for all peoples. (Isaiah 56:7)

Did you notice a theme in today's readings? Isaiah prophesies that the Temple, God's "house," will become a house of prayer "for all peoples," wherever they come from (56:7). Then Paul rejoices that Gentiles are coming to faith in Christ and entering the Church—God's house. And Jesus challenges his disciples to look at a Canaanite woman, a pagan, as someone beloved of God and deserving of his mercy. Through these readings, we can hear God asking us to reach out to those people who might feel they don't belong in his house. They may not be the people we expect to see at Mass on Sunday, but they are part of the "all peoples" whom God is longing to welcome into his kingdom. Here are three short stories that illustrate this point:

• Imran grew up in a devout Muslim household, but in college he became friends with some Christians whose faith and welcoming attitude moved him to start reading the New Testament.

· Mandy loved to party, but after one hangover too many, she found an AA group meeting in the local parish. There she met a parishioner named Joan who helped her get sober—and who introduced her to the Lord. Alan was a regular brawler in prison until his new cellmate convinced him to join a Bible study. The message of Jesus' forgiveness and love that he heard there pierced his heart. Now, instead of fighting, he tells other inmates about the Lord. Jesus' heart breaks for those who don't yet know him. He is always reaching out to them, calling them into his house. And he does that by leading them to believers who do know him. That's us. All we have to do is befriend those people and share with them how the Lord has touched our lives. We don't have to do it perfectly, either. We just have to try, and the Spirit will work through us. So who will God send to you today? "Lord, open my heart to share your love with the people you put in my path today." Psalm 67:2-3, 5-6, 8. Romans 11:13-15, 29-32 Matthew 15:21–28. The Word Among Us.

Mujer, ¡qué grande es tu fe! (Mateo 15, 28)

¿Puedes imaginar que tu petición sea rechazada por Jesús en tres ocasiones diferentes, como le sucedió a esta mujer? Primero, Jesús la ignoró. Luego dice que él no fue enviado a los gentiles, solamente a los judíos. Finalmente, sugiere que ella no es mucho más que un "perrito" (Mateo 15, 26). ¡Qué desalentador debe haber sido! Pero ella no aceptó su negación, y finalmente Jesús le concedió lo que pedía. Pero, ¿realmente piensas que Jesús iba a dejar a la hija de esta pobre mujer bajo el dominio de una posesión demoníaca? ¿No sería posible, más bien, que él estuviera aprovechando esta oportunidad para enseñarles algo a sus discípulos? Jesús les enseñó que la misericordia y el amor de Dios son para todos. Con sus palabras en este relato, parece enfatizar el hecho de que la mujer era pagana. Pero al final alabó su gran fe, dejando claro que cualquier persona que se vuelve a él con fe será bienvenida, no solo los "justos", no solo los fieles judíos.

Con seguridad Pedro recordó este episodio cuando fue invitado a compartir el evangelio con Cornelio, el centurión romano. Pedro entró en la casa del oficial, rompiendo con la tradición judía y le dijo: "Ustedes saben que a un judío le prohíbe su religión tener tratos con extranjeros o entrar en sus casas. Pero Dios me ha enseñado que no debo llamar profano o impuro a nadie" (Hechos 10, 28). Como resultado de la actitud de Pedro, estos fueron los primeros gentiles en recibir el bautismo, y la Iglesia se abrió a las personas de todas las razas y contextos.

Tal como lo hizo con Pedro y los otros, Jesús quiere expandir nuestra visión. El Señor quiere que todos se salven, no solo los que nosotros podríamos considerar dignos. De manera que hoy, mantente atento a situaciones en las que puedes compartir el amor de Cristo con alguien a quien de otra manera no te hubieras acercado. WILDFIRES RAVAGE MAUI, BUT THIS CATHOLIC CHURCH STILL STAND



The Church of Maria Lanakila miraculously survived the conflagration that destroyed much of the surrounding area – but survivors urgently need help.

When wildfires swept across the island of Maui in the state of Hawaii this past week, the historic town of Lahaina suffered grave damage. Shocking videos show vast areas of destruction, with every building in sight razed. At least 93 people are reported to have died in the conflagration.

also burned down. Maria Lanakila means "Victorious Mary" or "Our Lady of Victory" in the Hawaiian language. Remarkably, when some residents were allowed to return to Lahaina, their photos and videos revealed that Maria Lanakila church and its rectory remained standing — even though most of the nearby buildings had been leveled in the fires.

"For us, it's like a miracle," Msgr. Terrence Watanabe told the Honolulu Star Advertiser. "When we saw the church steeple rise above the town, it was a great sight to see."

Unfortunately, the parish's Sacred Hearts Mission School was partly damaged by the fires. And, of course, many parishioners have lost friends and family members in the tragedy, along with their homes and places of work.

Msgr. Watanabe, the pastor of St. Anthony of Padua parish — which stands on the opposite side of the West Maui Natural Area Reserve from Maria Lanakila Church — told The Pillar that affected islanders face numerous problems in the coming days, including lost phone service, homelessness, and unemployment since many businesses were destroyed.

"People are just shocked and kind of devastated," Msgr. Watanabe said in the interview. He added that though federal and state aid will eventually come to the area, it will take time. Asked to identify the most urgent needs, he responded:

Well, number one is prayers. That's the most helpful, obviously, at this point in time. And then I think, any kind of donations. Catholic Charities of Hawai'i has sent an urgent plea for help. Donations can also be made directly to Sacred Hearts School.

Parishioners gather

As reported by the Associated Press, parishioners of Maria Lanakila gathered on Sunday about 10 miles from the church, to attend a Mass that was presided by the bishop of Honolulu, the Rev. Clarence (Larry) Silva. They prayed for the dead and missing and gave thanks for the survival of their church. The bishop read a message from Pope Francis to the congregation.

Survival and hope

The Catholic Church has a rich history in Hawaii. The parish of Maria Lanakila is an important part of that history, having been founded shortly after Catholic priests arrived in Maui in 1846. The current church was built on the foundation of the original church in 1927. It was formally named part of the Lahaina National Historic Landmark District in 1962.



Many locals already see the survival of Maria Lanakila Church as a sign of hope. "I firmly believe that Lahaina will be restored," one commenter on TikTok said. "This is confirmation. He's calling us to be saved. The doors of the church (are) open." And a Facebook commenter said, "May she be the beacon of hope to the people of Lahaina!!!!"

Another Facebook commenter no doubt spoke for many when she wrote: "Prayers of love, hope and strength to endure this tragedy."





Pope Pius X in the Vatican Gardens in 1913

Saint Pius X (1835 – 1914) was born in Venice, the postman's son, and was named Giuseppe Sarto. At the age of twenty-three, he was ordained a priest, and nine years later, he was appointed pastor of Salzano. Here, he became known by his parishioners for his goodness and concern for the poor. He lived with his two sisters, who kept the house for him. The two women were often hardpressed to have food on the table and clean clothes for their brother as he would give away much of his clothing and food to the needy. In 1884, Father Giuseppe was made bishop of Mantua, a diocese in disarray, with a negligent clergy and two towns in schism. He was so successful in this charge that Pope Leo XIII appointed him cardinal and promoted him to the metropolitan see of Venice. His simplicity and forthrightness stood out in a see that prided itself in pomp and magnificence. Upon the death of Leo XIII, Cardinal Giuseppe Sarto was elected pope and took the name of Pius X. The motto of his pontificate was Instaurare Omnia in Christo (To renew all things in Christ). He encouraged daily communion, increased devotion to Our Lady and piety among the faithful. He wrote the famous encyclical Pascendi Dominici Gregis (On the Doctrines of the Modernists), in which he denounced and exposed the errors of modernism. Already during his lifetime, Almighty God used him as an instrument of miracles. In one such instance, a man in a public audience pointed to his paralyzed arm and asked Saint Pius X, "Cure me, Holy Father". The pope smiled, stroking the arm gently. "Yes, yes", he said. And the man was healed. Saint Pius X died in 1914 of bronchitis and was canonized in 1954 by pope Pius XII. Source: Saint Pius X – EWTN Global Catholic Television Network

Dear Parishioners.

I am writing this letter to announce a "Keep Cool Campaign" for a new air conditioning system at Christ Our Light Catholic Church.

Why are we holding a special campaign for the air conditioning system?

Since June 19, 2023, you have experienced an onset of extremely dangerous heat conditions and heat warnings are issued across Texas. Here at our church, we were pretty warm because our air conditioning was running at half capacity. We were not only friendly; we were pretty warm. The problem is that our air conditioning is a patchwork of repairs and parts between 5 and 25 years old. Monthly repairs are already expensive and costing the parish an exorbitant amount of money. It's time to replace the whole system.


In addition, most of the electrical supplies and electrical panels are severely out of date. We will need to replace and relocate the church electrical distribution panel to the sanctuary area. The new air conditioning system will provide a cool and comfortable environment. In addition, the humidity problem will be taken care of because over a long period of time, the humidity can cause bigger problems for our church.

We hope to have the new air conditioning system and electric work installed by the end of the year depending on the campaign donation, permits, approvals and inspections by the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston and the City of Navasota. Estoy escribiendo esta carta para anunciarles una "campaña para mantenerse fresco" para un nuevo sistema de aire acondicionado en la iglesia de "Christ Our Light."

¿Por qué estamos teniendo una campaña especial para el sistema de aire acondicionado?

Desde el 19 de junio de 2023, ustedes han experimentado una variación de extremadas y peligrosas condiciones y alertas de calor en Texas. Estuvimos bastante calientes aquí en nuestra iglesia porque nuestro aire acondicionado estaba funcionando la mitad de su capacidad. No solamente éramos amigables, pero estábamos muy bochornosos. El problema es que nuestro aire acondicionado tiene una serie de reparaciones y partes que datan de 5 y 25 años. Las reparaciones mensuales son en sí caras y le cuestan a la parroquia una exorbitante suma de dinero. Es tiempo de remplazar todo el sistema.

Añadiendo a ésto, la mayor parte de las partes y los paneles eléctricos ya están severamente caducos. Necesitaremos reemplazar y distribuir los paneles del sistema eléctrico de la iglesia hacia la área del santuario. El sistema nuevo de aire acondicionado proveerá un ambiente frío y confortable. En adición el problema de la humedad será resuelto por un largo tiempo, la humedad puede causar mayores problemas a nuestra iglesía.

Esperamos tener el nuevo sistema de aire acondicionado y el trabajo eléctrico instalado para fines de año dependiendo de la donación de la campaña, los permisos, las aprobaciones y las inspecciones de parte de la Arquidiócesis de Galveston-Houston y de la Ciudad de Navasota. Ustedes pueden hacer su compromiso o pagos en línea del sistema de donación de la iglesia "Keep Cool Campaign" o usar los sobres de la Iglesia.
