

God forbid! (Matthew 16:22)

Isn't that the way these things often happen? One minute, you're filled with good and holy thoughts. Then the next minute, someone says something that upsets you, and you respond with anger, jealousy, resentment, or some other negative emotion. We all know what that's like!

So it should be no surprise to see Peter "rebuke" Jesus, the man he had just proclaimed to be "the Messiah, the Son of the living God" (Matthew 16:16, 22). When he hears Jesus predict his coming death, Peter becomes upset. In a flash, he loses his peace and clarity. Instead of humbly asking Jesus what he means, he tries to tell Jesus what he should and should not do. And that passionate response earns Peter a stern rebuke of his own: "Get behind me, Satan!" (16:23).

So how can we get to the point where we can hold onto our peace and our trust in the Lord no matter what happens? The answer lies in today's second reading: "Be transformed by the renewal of your mind" (Romans 12:2). We can change. We can learn how to put aside our fallen sinful thoughts and ideas and take on Jesus' way instead. Or as Jesus told Peter, we can learn to think "as God does" (Matthew 16:23).

For Peter, this meant accepting that the way of Jesus, the Messiah, is the way of self-giving love, not self-preservation. For us, it may mean asking for the grace to embrace Jesus' call to forgive "seventy-seven times" (Matthew 18:22), or to turn the other cheek (5:39), or to choose not to be served "but to serve" (20:28), or any of Jesus' other teachings that we find difficult.

Today's story about Peter shows us that this kind of change is not a once-and-done event. It happens over time, often with stops and starts. But it does happen, day after day, decision after decision. We can be transformed!

"Jesus, teach me how to think and act as you do!"

The Catholic Church celebrates today the birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary on its traditional fixed date of September 8, nine months after the December 8 celebration of her Immaculate Conception as the child of Saints Joachim and Anne. The circumstances of the Virgin Mary's infancy and early life are not directly recorded in the Bible, but other documents and traditions describing the circumstances of her birth are cited by some of the earliest Christian writers from the first centuries of the Church.

These accounts, although not considered authoritative in the same manner as the Bible, outline some of the Church's traditional beliefs about the birth of Mary.

The "Protoevangelium of James," which was probably put into its final written form in the early second century, describes Mary's father Joachim as a wealthy member of one of the Twelve Tribes of Israel. Joachim was deeply grieved, along with his wife Anne, by their childlessness. "He called to mind Abraham," the early Christian writing says, "that in the last day God gave him a son Isaac."

No lo permita Dios, Señor. (Mateo 16, 22)

Tú no confías que alguien es "el Hijo del Dios viviente para inmediatamente después reprenderlo (Mateo 16, 16). ¿Qué puede haber provocado una reacción tan fuerte por parte de Pedro? La noticia de que Jesús iba a "padecer y... ser condenado a muerte" por los jefes religiosos de Jerusalén (16, 21).

Desde luego, Pedro tenía la más pura de las intenciones cuando reprendió a Jesús; él no podía soportar la idea de que su amado Maestro y amigo sufriera un destino tan horrible.

Pero también podría haber un motivo más profundo detrás de las acciones de Pedro. Quizá estaba tratando de mantenerse a salvo él también. Si podía ayudar a Jesús a evitar la cruz, él mismo no tendría que enfrentar la suya.

Pedro había pasado suficiente tiempo con Jesús para comprender que ser discípulo significaba arriesgarse al desprecio y la incompreensión de la gente. Significaba entregar su vida a Dios por el bien de las personas que lo rodeaban. Si Jesús estaba destinado a la cruz, entonces Pedro tendría que aceptar un destino similar. Era mejor proteger a Jesús de cualquier mal para así protegerse a sí mismo también.

Pero Jesús no iba a aceptar esta protección, así que le dijo a Pedro que quien quisiera ser como él, debía tomar su cruz y seguir su ejemplo (Mateo 16, 24).

Es tentador mantener cierta distancia con Jesús para que él no pueda acercarse demasiado y pedirnos mucho. Jesús lo dijo claramente: Ser su discípulo conlleva un costo. No siempre es fácil seguir al Señor y obedecer sus mandamientos. Pero la gloria de conocer el amor de Jesús y la alegría de compartir su misericordia con los demás supera cualquier sacrificio que tengamos que hacer. Finalmente Pedro aprendió esto, y nosotros podemos aprenderlo también.

De manera que toma tu cruz e intenta esforzarte por seguir el camino trazado por Jesús del amor generoso.

"Señor, te pido que me enseñes a donarme a mí mismo como tú lo hiciste."

Palabra Entre Nosotros

Joachim and Anne began to devote themselves extensively and rigorously to prayer and fasting, initially wondering whether their inability to conceive a child might signify God's displeasure with them.

As it turned out, however, the couple were to be blessed even more abundantly than Abraham and Sarah, as an angel revealed to Anne when he appeared to her and prophesied that all generations would honor their future child: "The Lord has heard your prayer, and you shall conceive, and shall bring forth, and your seed shall be spoken of in all the world."

After Mary's birth, according to the Protoevangelium of James, Anne "made a sanctuary" in the infant girl's room, and "allowed nothing common or unclean" on account of the special holiness of the child. The same writing records that when she was one year old, her father "made a great feast, and invited the priests, and the scribes, and the elders, and all the people of Israel."

"And Joachim brought the child to the priests," the account continues, "and they blessed her, saying: 'O God of our fathers, bless this child, and give her an everlasting name to be named in all generations' . . . And he brought her to the chief priests, and they blessed her, saying: 'O God most high, look upon this child, and bless her with the utmost blessing, which shall be forever.'"

The protoevangelium goes on to describe how Mary's parents, along with the temple priests, subsequently decided that she would be offered to God as a consecrated Virgin for the rest of her life, and enter a chaste marriage with the carpenter Joseph.
