What is Lent?

Lent is a 40 day season of **prayer, fasting, and almsgiving** that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ.

Many know of the tradition of abstaining from meat on Fridays during Lent, but we are also called to practice self-discipline and fast in other ways throughout the season. Contemplate the meaning and origins of the Lenten fasting tradition in this reflection. In addition, the giving of alms is one way to share God's gifts—not only through the distribution of money, but through the sharing of our time and talents. As St. John Chrysostom reminds us: "Not to enable the poor to share in our goods is to steal from them and deprive them of life. The goods we possess are not ours, but theirs." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2446).

In Lent, the baptized are called to renew their baptismal commitment as others prepare to be baptized through the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, a period of learning and discernment for individuals who have declared their desire to become Catholics.

La Cuaresma es un período de 40 días de **oración, ayuno y limosna** que comienza el Miércoles de Ceniza y termina al atardecer del Jueves Santo. Es un período de preparación para celebrar la Resurrección del Señor en Pascua. Durante la Cuaresma, buscamos al Señor en oración leyendo la Sagrada Escritura; servimos dando limosna; y practicamos el autocontrol a través del ayuno. Estamos llamados no solo a abstenernos de lujos durante la Cuaresma, sino a una verdadera conversión interior del corazón mientras buscamos seguir la voluntad de Cristo con más fidelidad. Recordamos las aguas del bautismo en las que también fuimos bautizados en la muerte de Cristo, morimos al pecado y al mal, y comenzamos una nueva vida en Cristo.

Muchos conocen la tradición de abstenerse de carne los viernes durante la Cuaresma, pero también estamos llamados a practicar la autodisciplina y ayunar de otras maneras durante la temporada. Contempla el significado y los orígenes de la tradición del ayuno cuaresmal en esta reflexión. Además, la limosna es una manera de compartir los dones de Dios, no sólo mediante la distribución de dinero, sino también compartiendo nuestro tiempo y talentos. Como nos recuerda San Juan Crisóstomo: "No permitir a los pobres compartir nuestros bienes es robarles y privarlos de la vida. Los bienes que poseemos no son nuestros, sino de ellos" (Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, n. 2446).

En Cuaresma, los bautizados están llamados a renovar su compromiso bautismal mientras otros se preparan para ser bautizados a través del Orden de Iniciación Cristiana de Adultos, un período de aprendizaje y discernimiento para las personas que han declarado su deseo de convertirse en católicos.

Reflection: 8th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C

- **First Reading** – Sirach 27:4-7: Speech reveals faults and true character. Just as a tree's fruit shows its care, words show thoughts. Do not praise someone before hearing them speak.
 - **Responsorial Psalm** – Psalm 92: It is good to thank and praise the Lord, whose kindness and faithfulness are constant. The righteous flourish and bear fruit, proclaiming God's justice and reliability.
 - **Second Reading** – 1 Corinthians 15:54-58: Through Jesus, we have victory over death. Be steadfast and devoted to the Lord's work, knowing it is not in vain.
 - **Gospel** – Luke 6:39-45: Jesus teaches that we must address our own faults before correcting others. A person's actions reflect their inner character, just as a tree is known by its fruit.

WORDS REVEAL OUR TRUE SELVES

On the 8th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C, we reflect on the power of our words. Sirach 27:4-7 teaches that our words reveal who we really are. Good words show a good heart, while bad words reveal inner problems. Our speech can lift others up or tear them down.

Luke 6:43-45 also talks about the connection between our hearts and actions. Jesus compares people to trees, saying that good trees bear good fruit. This means our actions and words reflect our inner goodness. If our hearts are good, we will naturally do and say good things.

We need to be careful with our words. Speaking kindly and truthfully can show our faith and love for others. Harsh or dishonest words can hurt people and damage our witness as Christians. Reflecting on how we speak helps us grow in holiness.

LAS PALABRAS REVELAN QUIÉNES SOMOS

El octavo domingo del Tiempo Ordinario, año C, reflexionamos sobre el poder de nuestras palabras. Eclesiástico 27,4-7 enseña que nuestras palabras revelan quiénes somos realmente. Las buenas palabras muestran un buen corazón, mientras que las malas revelan problemas internos. Nuestras palabras pueden elevar a los demás o derribarlos.

Lucas 6,43-45 también habla de la conexión entre nuestro corazón y nuestras acciones. Jesús compara a las personas con árboles, diciendo que los buenos árboles dan buenos frutos. Esto significa que nuestras acciones y palabras reflejan nuestra bondad interior. Si tenemos un buen corazón, naturalmente haremos y diremos cosas buenas.

Debemos ser cuidadosos con nuestras palabras. Hablar con amabilidad y sinceridad puede mostrar nuestra fe y amor por los demás. Las palabras duras o deshonestas pueden herir a las personas y dañar nuestro testimonio como cristianos. Reflexionar sobre cómo hablamos nos ayuda a crecer en santidad.

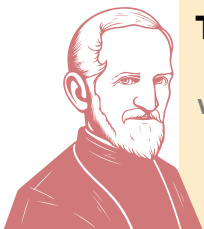

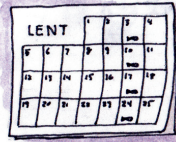

Ash Wednesday

This Wednesday is the first day of Lent, Ash Wednesday. Lent is a special time when we prepare ourselves for Good Friday and Easter Sunday.

It is good for us to remember that we will die one day. It helps us realize that God put us here and that we need Him all the time. If we remember how much we need God then we will think of Him more and love Him more.

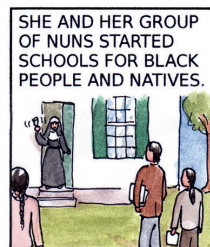
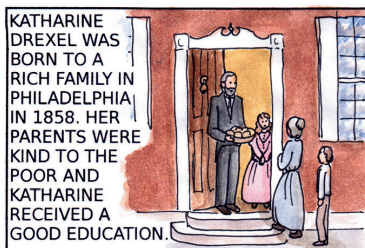

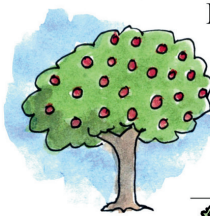
