Jesus warns us that we cannot serve God and money.

Doesn't he know I want to serve him? I just have bills
to pay! Is there a balance to be found?



How can a shady person possibly give good example? Jesus obviously thought that the example of a not so honest person would be a perfect illustration for a spiritual lesson about the kingdom of God! I guess we should expect such a choice for Jesus. So, what's the point of Jesus's parable? The dishonest steward is commended for his shrewdness - "foresight". A shrewd person grasps a critical situation with resolution and foresight. Jesus is concerned here with something more critical than a financial crisis. His concern is that we avert spiritual crisis through the exercise of faith and foresight. If Christians would only expend as much foresight and energy to spiritual matters which have eternal consequences as much as they do to earthly matters which have temporal consequences, then they would be truly better off, both in this life and in the age to come.

Don Antonio's Dispatch.....

Tuesday (20 September) is the annual Senior Appreciation Day Mass and Luncheon at St. John the Evangelist church in Davison. I will be attending, and I hope to see many of our parishioners there, as well. Seniors are a great blessing to our parish! They have great wisdom from their life experiences, and bring a sense of perspective. I am very blessed to have all four of my grandparents still living. I saw both grandparents a couple of weeks ago after I returned from Alaska, and (not to brag too much), they were overjoyed to see me and spend time with me, and know that I wanted to spend time with them. In many ways their love is like the love of the Most Holy Trinity: they don't need us to do anything for them, but simply want us to be with them.

In our society, seniors can sadly often be seen as throw -aways. More and more places seem to look to euthanasia and assisted suicide so that they don't have to "deal with" seniors. Seniors do not need to be "dealt with." They need our love and support. Sometimes there are tough decisions that family members need to make, like taking away a driver's license for the person's safety, or working with an assisted living location or nursing home when the person cannot take care of him/herself and the family cannot tend to all their medical needs. But we should always try to do what we can to spend time with senior family members. I know I still struggle with work and family balance, and my grandparents are very understanding, but let's make sure that we're trying to do what we can to spend time with our seniors rather than writing them off!

We're also beginning to pray our ARISE prayer for our faith sharing small groups. I'm new to ARISE, but I know that any group that helps us learn about our faith and discuss our relationship with Jesus is a great thing. If we don't know Jesus, then a lot of our Catholic "stuff" (going to Mass, confession, fasting, continuing to be formed in the faith, etc.) makes very little sense, and can seem like silly rules. But if we know Jesus, then we appreciate the ways the Church helps us to continue to develop our relationship with Him so that our life looks more and more like Jesus' life. If you haven't already, I hope you will consider joining an ARISE group.


