

Don Antonio's Dispatch...

Happy Divine Mercy Sunday! As you have noticed or shortly will notice, I'm not here this weekend; I'm on vacation. Please make sure and warmly welcome Fr. David Harvey back, who will be covering our weekend Masses.

The beautiful gift of Divine Mercy is something that is a perennial focus of the Church, but has especially become more popular in the past few years. Mercy is one of the expressions of God's love for us. He gives His grace (His life) to us, so that we can recognize where we have not lived up to being disciples of Jesus, and then forgives us when we turn back to Him with sorrow for our sins and a desire to avoid our sins in the future. Mother Angelica, and I think she got this from St. Faustina, said that our sins are like a drop in the ocean of God's mercy. God's mercy is so much more powerful than anything we can do, as long as we turn back to the Lord for forgiveness.

If you haven't ever prayed the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, it's a beautiful and brief set of prayers that connect us with God's mercy. You can learn more about it at: http://www.thedivinemercy.org/message/devotions/ praythechaplet.php.

People have started dropping off religious articles, books, and pamphlets in our narthex. While I appreciate their good intentions, it can often make our narthex look cluttered. Please check with Fr. Anthony or Michelle Ruth in the office before putting anything in the narthex (including posters). Thank you for your cooperation!

Last, and not least, this Sunday our Orthodox brothers and sisters celebrate Easter. For the calculation of Easter, we use the Gregorian calendar (the calendar as we know it know; Pope Gregory XIII updated it in 1582 to adjust for a lack of accuracy from the previous Julian calendar). The Orthodox, however, for Easter still use the Julian calendar, so their Easter is almost always different than ours (last year, however, it was the same). Differing dates for Easter have existed since at least AD 325. when the Council of Nicea decreed that Easter would be celebrated on the first Sunday after the first full Moon after the vernal (Spring) equinox. Before that, some Christians followed the date of Passover for the celebration of Easter and would celebrate it whenever 14 Nissan (on the Jewish calendar) fell. They were called Quartodecimans (from the Latin for the number 14). But the Church (almost fully united at that point) eventually felt that, because Christ rose on a Sunday, it should always be celebrated on a Sunday. So in 325 it was adjusted. One day, perhaps all Christians can celebrate Easter on the same day in both East and West. Until then, Happy Easter to the Orthodox! $X \rho \iota \sigma \tau \sigma \zeta A \nu \epsilon \sigma \tau \eta! A \lambda \iota \theta \omega \zeta \alpha \nu \epsilon \sigma \tau \eta!$ (Christ is risen! He is risen, indeed!)


Religious Education Department


