Don Antonio's Dispatch...

Here we are in the first full week of Lent. Hopefully, your Lenten sacrifices (giving up something and/or doing something extra) are going well. Often times it can help if we let one or two other people who can help, keep us accountable. You might consider sharing your Lenten sacrifice with a good friend, and ask them to check up on your progress each week. Our FORMED platform is one great way to grow in your relationship with Jesus during Lent. Don't forget to sign-up (if you haven't already) at <u>spxparishflint.formed.org</u>, and follow the instructions to register.

There is no saint on the general calendar, but, as I mentioned before, there is a saint for every day of the year. So this week I'm focusing on St. Maud. St. Maud was the daughter of a powerful Saxon count. While she was growing up, she lived in a monastery where her grandmother was an abbess. In 913, she married Henry, Duke of Saxony, who later became king of Germany, making her the queen. She promoted devotion and humility in her prayers and meditations. She visited the sick regularly, taught the poor, and gave support to prisoners. She had three sons: Otho (who later became emperor); Henry, Duke of Bavaria, and St. Brunn, Archbishop of Cologne. Her sons actually took money from their mother, saying that she was squandering the state's money on the poor, but later repented and gave it back. She gave alms to help the poor, and founded many churches and five monasteries. She died on 14 March (the day she is remembered still) 968.
