

Don Antonio's Dispatch...

Today in Palestine and among the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre (the group to which I belong that promotes the well-being of Christians in the Holy Land), the Church celebrates Our Lady of Palestine. This is a way of the Church celebrating our Blessed Mother's special love for the land in which she grew up, and the people who still inhabit that land. Of the Christians who live there, many struggle to eke out a living day-by-day. Many rely on the tourism industry (directly or indirectly) which has been non-existent since the world shut down in March because of COVID. I know many of you donated to help them for the Pontifical Collection for the Holy Land. Maybe today you could pray a decade of the Rosary for them.

I know it's still a little ways away, but we're already planning for Christmas. Part of our planning ahead is realizing that things are going to need to be different because of COVID-19. I'll be working to make sure that we can disinfect our church after every Mass, and, unless something drastically changes, our plan is to continue to block off every other pew to promote social distancing

Our proposed Mass schedule is as follows:

4:00 p.m. Christmas Eve; 6:30 p.m. Christmas Eve; 12:00 Midnight Mass; 10:00 a.m. Christmas Day.

Usually our 4:00 p.m. Mass is pretty full (without social distancing), so we're going to be implementing a sign-up sheet for the two Christmas Eve Masses (4:00 p.m. and 6:30 p.m.). We don't expect there to be an overly large crowd for the other two Masses (midnight and 10 a.m.). If you plan on attending the 4:00 p.m. or 6:30 p.m. Mass, please call the parish office (810-235-8574) to reserve your spot(s). Seating will be limited to 110 people per Mass to ensure social distancing. I'll be working with ushers to maximize our seating potential at those Masses by having them seat you in a pew. Often times family comes to Mass as well, so please include any visiting family members in your sign-up. As is the case currently, your obligation to attend Mass is vitiated if you feel that coming to Mass would endanger your health due to COVID-19. But we're going to do everything we can to make it as safe and hygienic as possible.

Here's our *Catechism* paragraph for this week:

In response to the question about the first of the commandments, Jesus says: "The first is, 'Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one; and you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these."

The apostle St. Paul reminds us of this: "He who loves his neighbor has fulfilled the law. The commandments, 'You shall not commit adultery, You shall not kill, You shall not steal, You shall not covet,' and any other commandment, are summed up in this sentence, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore love is the fulfilling of the law." (n. 2196)



The hymn that we associate with this day is For
All the Saints. The melody, which is almost a marching tune, was written by the English composer Ralph Vaughan
Williams. In 1906, when he was the editor of a new hymnbook, he wanted to use this hymn but could not obtain permission to use it.
Not to be deterred, he wrote his own melody, and it has become one of the most famous of all hymns. Every hymn tune has a generic "name." But, For All the Saints has no name! Vaughan Williams called his hymn tune "Sine Nomine," which is Latin for "without a name."
