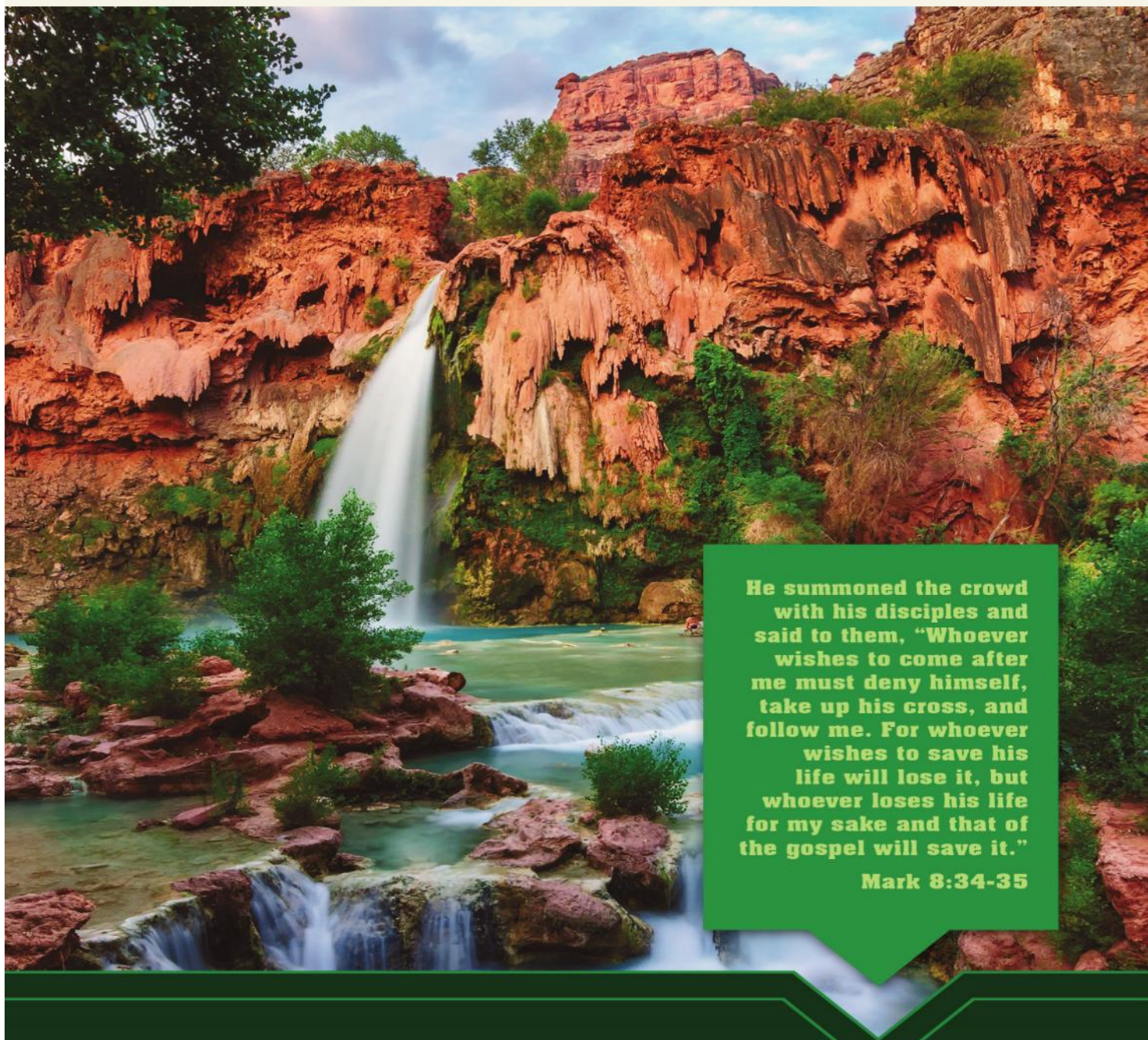

Congratulations to Jeff Smith, who was instituted as a Lector on 31 August at the Cathedral in Lansing, as well as to his wife, Carla. All deacons (and priests) have to receive this permanent ministry of lector before they can be ordained. It was a beautiful Mass with Bishop Boyea, and we're happy for Jeff and Carla as they continue to discern a vocation to the diaconate.

This Tuesday the Church celebrates the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross. We celebrate the fact that sin and death were conquered by the Cross of Jesus, as well as the finding of the True Cross by St. Helena, mother of the Emperor Constantine. In addition to our regular Masses, there will be an Extraordinary Form Mass at 6 p.m.

The day after we celebrate the Exaltation of the Cross we remember the Blessed Virgin Mary as we celebrate Our Lady of Sorrows. While the Cross won for us salvation, I cannot even imagine the pain that Mary underwent as she saw her son and God die on the cross. Some mothers in our parish have had to undergo a similar torture in their own lives, and I know that they can identify with Our Lady of Sorrows. We pray especially on this day for all mothers (and fathers) who have had to bury a child.

Last, but not least, this week is Homecoming Week for Powers Catholic High School. Powers Catholic is our local diocesan Catholic high school, and we are proud to support it. As an alumnus of a Catholic high school, I have reaped the benefits that Catholic schools provide. As our secular society continues to grow farther and farther away from God, I encourage all of our parishioners with school-aged children to consider a Catholic education at any of the fine Catholic schools in our area.

Here's our *Catechism* paragraph for the week:

The *fruits* of charity are joy, peace, and mercy; charity demands beneficence and fraternal correction; it is benevolence; it fosters reciprocity and remains disinterested and generous; it is friendship and communion: "Love is itself the fulfillment of all our works. Faith Formation at St. Pius X

I am always impressed with St. Paul's attitude as he travels through the various towns we read about in the New Testament. His subsistence is dependent upon his trade (he was a tentmaker) and the financial support of those in the communities he visits.

In his First Letter to the Corinthians, Chapter 16:2, he gives this instruction:

"On the first day of the week each of you should set aside and save whatever he can afford . . . I shall send those whom you have approved with letters of recommendation to take your gracious gift to Jerusalem."

To the people of Corinth (2 Cor 11:9), he said:

"And when I was with you and in need, I did not burden anyone, for the brothers who came from Macedonia supplied my needs."

I'm sure the financial relief Paul received was appreciated and helped the apostles focus on the mission at hand.

St. Paul's perspective is wide, and I am always inspired by him. He thanks the people of Macedonia who repeatedly gave to him. He also told the people of Philippi (4:18), "I am very well supplied because of what I received from you."

The same is still true today. The material support given to the Church is very appreciated and continues to allow us to serve the poor, evangelize, form disciples, and assist those in need.

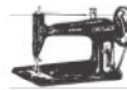
