### Faith Formation at St. Pius X

Today is the day for the "long reading" that often causes little children to squirm. For the in-betweens and the mature members of a congregation, it can be distracting and squirm-inducing as

Obviously, if you are unable to stand for the entire reading of the Lord's Passion, as is true for so many who have weak knees or painful backs, remember this: do what your body allows you to

The Palm Sunday readings may be long, but they are packed. From the processional reading (with palms) to the gospel narrative, we get to step right into what Jesus did for us. The depth of his loving act on our behalf raises in our hearts a sense of gratitude, wonder and awe. From his Agony in the Garden, to Mary's suffering at the foot of the cross, the pain of our humanity is on full display. In these moments, we can see that we have a Savior who understands us. He took our sin and our suffering upon his own shoulders and we can see the price he paid for bearing the weight of them, for us.

Anyone who has ever suffered, gets it, because suffering is not easy. Our own suffering connects us intimately with Jesus. He gave himself for us. We give ourselves to him. Not because we have to—there's no quid pro quo here--but because our natural response to such a loving act is to love in return. How beautiful it is that we can offer our sufferings for each other, just like he offered his for us!

Jesus loves us with such a radical, unconditional love. When we find the path in our own lives to loving like that, we will enter even more deeply into our relationship with him. As we come to practice it ourselves, we will grow ever closer to him.

### **Moving into Holy Week**

This week, particularly the Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday) are considered our highest holy days. This is it. The time has come. These days carry us right to the side of Christ, which means in order to follow this path, we should do our best to set aside non-essential work and worries and concentrate on him as best we can.

On Good Friday, when we venerate the cross of Jesus, imagine yourself laying all of your worries right there. Just pour them out at the cross and let them go. Prepare yourself by reflecting on whatever is burdening you and ask Jesus to take it, or heal it. Surrender your control over whatever you lay before him.

This beautiful moment we have can be very powerful. Enjoy it. Be grateful for it, but most of all, don't miss it!



### "And sing the love amazing..."

"Were You There When They Crucified My Lord" is a beloved Passiontide spiritual that was composed and sung by enslaved African-Americans in the 19<sup>th</sup> century. The lyrics and tune were mostly unknown until 1940 when it was included in a major American hymnal. Since then, the spiritual can be found in nearly every Christian hymn book. It is the only African-American song included in the Liturgy of the Hours. The text dwells on the details of the Crucifixion. Though simplistic in words, the theology is orthodox—the effect upon the singer is emotional.




