What a Pastoral Council Is and Is Not

Next weekend we will hold our annual election/selection for our Parish Pastoral Council. Per the Council's constitution, one member will be elected by popular vote while another member will be chosen by lot. An additional possibility is the appointment of one or more members by the pastor as allowed by the constitution. As you give some thought and prayer to your vote, please see the following explanation of the Pastoral Council's role summed up by another parish on their website:

- A Pastoral Council is Consultative not Legislative: It is an advisory body on pastoral matters. Consensus on issues is sought by the pastor, but the burden of decision-making falls ultimately on him.
- A Pastoral Council is Constructive not Destructive: It is not a forum for
 personal complaints, agendas, or special interests but rather is positive in
 outlook and guided by the Holy Spirit, the vision of the universal and local
 Church, as well as the lived experience of the parishioners and the common
 good of the parish in mind.
- A Pastoral Council is Pastoral not Financial: Its work is pastoral and does not ordinarily extend to matters pertaining to budget, facilities, or to the work of the Finance Council.
- A Pastoral Council is Based on Discernment and not Theoretical: The members of the Council are first and foremost people of prayer who seek the Spirit's guidance and direction rather than just what is practical or easy.
- A Pastoral Council is made up of responsible Catholics in good standing who
 are good stewards of their time, talent and treasure, respectful of
 confidentiality, imaginative and visionary, and willing to contribute to
 deliberations.

We thank all the candidates who have said they'd be willing to serve – every person well qualified to meet the above expectations.
