



New Spaces - New Protocols

The key to everything is patience. "You get the chicken by hatching the egg, not by smashing it." - Arnold H. Glasow. Remember that! This weekend is a big one as we attempt a St. Ann's Faith Formation Sunday with all the necessary choreography. We are implementing new protocols, on Sunday and the other days of the week with the intention of keeping our buildings reasonably secure and our parishioners safe. Please note the following, remembering that we will certainly need to tweak and adjust them according to real-life usage:

All Weekend Masses:

- The following doors will be opened at least thirty minutes before each Mass: the Main Church; the covered drop-off, the Narthex/Church door from the west parking lot; the Narthex/Church door from the McGivney Courtyard; and the main Parish Hall doors from the east parking lot.
- Ten minutes after Mass begins, all doors will be locked except for the entrances to the Main Church and the Narthex/Church from the McGivney Courtyard. Signs will be posted directing latecomers to the unlocked doors.
- Our Cana Room is available during weekend Masses for use by nursing mothers. Please tell an Usher if you would like to use the room and it will be unlocked.

Faith Formation Sundays:

- All Faith Formation for Children and Youth participants will gather in the Parish Hall before and after their classes. Parents should wait in the Parish Hall instead of gathering in front of classroom doors. We humbly ask parents to be on time for bringing and picking up your children.
- At 9:55 a.m., the main Parish Hall doors as well as the west Front Entrance doors (near the St. Carlo Acutis youth room) will be unlocked for those who attend the Saturday 5:30 p.m. or Sunday 11:30 a.m. Mass who need to drop off their children for Faith Formation. Wouldn't it be a wonderful world; however, if all our parents were parking and coming in for fellowship and Adult Formation!?
- At the ringing of the Faith Formation bell at 10:15 a.m., the main Parish Hall doors will be locked and opened only when the bell rings again at 11:15 a.m. Latecomers will need to enter through the west Front Entrance doors (near the Carlo Acutis youth room).

Little Lambs Nursery/Childcare

- Please remember that we offer childcare for little ones during the Sunday Masses and Faith Formation, as well as during other parish activities as publicized.
- Little Lambs can be accessed through the Parish Hall before and after Masses. During Masses, parents may use the secured entrance near the playground.

Wednesday Night Youth

• All parking, entering and exiting, drop-off and pick-up will happen in the east parking lot. Entrance into the main Parish Hall doors will be the only unlocked doors for youth to enter and exit on Wednesday evenings.

Pastor's Notes continued...

Parish Office Hours & Evening Group or Ministry Meetings

- The Parish Office will be accessible during business only through the Parish Office entrance facing the McGivney Courtyard.
- Please note that when a staff person is working alone, the Parish Office doors are locked but can be opened by pushing the intercom button and being buzzed in.
- With the exception of special and scheduled activities, all other facility doors will be locked during business hours except for the Blessed Sacrament Chapel entrance at the front of the church.
- A representative person of each group and ministry
 meeting outside Parish Office hours will be given keys to
 unlock the Parish Office entrance. Unless otherwise
 noted, the only entrance for meetings and activities after
 hours will be through the Parish Office doors. Groups and
 ministries must contact the Parish Office to put their
 regular or special activity on the parish calendar and to
 reserve a room and space. The reserved space will be
 unlocked and a reserved sign for the group will be on the
 requested room door.

The Blessed Sacrament Chapel

The new door from the west parking area into the Blessed Sacrament Chapel will be unlocked during parish business hours for prayer and making a visit to the Eucharistic Lord in the tabernacle. If you are a parishioner who wants to make a visit after hours, please call the Parish Office for the chapel door code. We will change the code every so often, but you'll then be on our list to call about the change.

Handicapped Parking and Accessibility

You will notice that our handicapped parking has been adjusted and expanded. Please be so kind to keep these places open for those with designated permits. Very soon we will have electric door openers on the following entrance and exit doors for those who need them: the north/Covered Drop-off; the Narthex/Church from the courtyard; the Narthex/Church from the west parking lot; and the main Parish Hall. Before we know it, these new ways will be very familiar to us. Of course, signs over entrances and rooms will help as soon as the manufacturing of the signs is completed. Thank you for helping make St. Ann's a safe home for all.


Where is That in the Bible?


You are invited to bring of you r own cross or crucifix to Mass next weekend to be blessed. Every Catholic should have a crucifix in their home.

MEET OUR NEWEST SAINTS

Carlo Acutis will be canonized as the first millennial saint. Carlo taught himself computer coding and used those skills to create an exhibition of Eucharistic miracles because he was convinced that would help people to realize that Jesus is really present in the Eucharist and come back to Mass. He died from leukemia on October 12, 2006, at the age of 15.


Pier Giorgio Frassati was known as a "Man of the Beatitudes" by Pope St. John Paul, for living the Gospel with radical charity and joy. A devoted lay Dominican, he dedicated himself to serving the poor and sick in Turin—often giving away his bus fare or food to those in need—while embracing life through mountain climbing and spirited friendship. He died on July 4, 1925 due to polio at the age of 24

SACRAMENTAL GUIDELINES

Sacrament of Baptism

Parents seeking Baptism for their child(ren) {under 7} need to start with the following steps:

• Take and read one of the Baptism @ St. Ann's handouts located in the church Narthex and the Parish Office, or printable from our website: stannsofcanyon.org. Then, to register for Baptism, parent(s) should attend a Baptism Registration Meeting, held after each Mass on the third weekend of the month. This session will provide you with everything else you will need to know.

Sacrament of Confirmation

Celebrated with students in the 8th grade (or older) every year during the Easter season. Students must have regularly attended Wednesday evening or Sunday morning Faith Formation classes in 7th and 8th grades, be currently enrolled and participating in St. Ann's Faith Formation, and participate in the Confirmation preparation program.

Sacrament of Marriage

Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance for an initial meeting with the pastor. All couples are required by the Diocese of Amarillo to complete pre-marital and Natural Family Planning classes. After they have fulfilled these requirements, a follow-up meeting with the parish liturgy coordinators is scheduled to finalize plans for the wedding.

Saturdays during Lent 3:00 - 4:30 p.m. or by appointment.


Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick
