Budget Report

Attached to this bulletin is a financial report with the final numbers from 2025-2026 as well as the approved budget for 2026-2027 (our fiscal year is from July 1 – June 30). Because of your sacrificial giving (sacrificial because all giving requires that we re-allocate our precious monies from something we may want for ourselves to our need to give), we end last year “in the black” and begin a new year with great hope that we will be able to meet and even surpass our projections for the new fiscal year.

You will see on the opposite side and the report that we now have a debt to tackle, something we expected when we began our “A Light on a Hill” capital campaign and construction project. The expertise of our Finance Council (David Baumann, Jeff Haggard, Kim Hall, Nicole Houle, Annie Miller, Geoff Phemister, and *ex officio* Roger Cross) has recommended a reasonable plan to have our debt fully retired in approximately 15 years through budgeted monthly payments. However, St. Ann's has a great history of paying off debt early and we will throw every extra dollar towards the principal, from fundraising to the proceeds from our monthly second collections, to be debt free as soon as possible.

We are blessed and we are growing. If you are not yet a regular contributor to the mission of St. Ann's, we strongly remind you that to be a disciple of Christ in Christian community is to be a giver and not merely a taker. The More You Know.....



September is traditionally dedicated to Our Lady of Sorrows, and the Church celebrates her memorial on September 15, the day after the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross.

Under this title, we honor Mary's deep sorrow as she remained faithfully united to Jesus throughout His Passion and Death. Mary teaches us that suffering, when united with Christ, can become a path to grace, hope, and deeper faith.

The Seven Sorrows of Mary are:

1. The Prophecy of Simeon – Simeon foretells that a sword will pierce Mary's heart.
2. The Flight into Egypt – Mary flees with Jesus to protect Him from Herod.
3. The Loss of Jesus in the Temple – Mary experiences three days of anguish before finding her Son.
4. Meeting Jesus on the Way to Calvary – Mary encounters Jesus carrying His Cross.
5. The Crucifixion of Jesus – Mary stands at the foot of the Cross and witnesses His Death.
6. Jesus Is Taken Down from the Cross – Mary receives the lifeless body of her Son.
7. The Burial of Jesus – Mary watches as Jesus is laid in the tomb.

In sacred art, Our Lady of Sorrows is often shown with tears and a sorrowful expression, with her heart pierced by seven swords. The swords represent the Seven Sorrows that pierced her heart, recalling Simeon's prophecy: "And you yourself a sword will pierce." (Luke 2:35)

As we reflect on Mary's sorrows this September, may she teach us to remain faithful to Christ in times of suffering, to stand firm in our trials, and to trust in the hope of the Resurrection.

Prayer for a New Bishop

Almighty and ever-living God, in your faithfulness, grant to the the Diocese of Amarillo a shepherd whose watchful care and kindly zeal will continue the good work of his predecessors. In your love for us, give us a shepherd who will lead us in being Christ's heart of mercy, voice of hope, and hands of justice.

Let him who is chosen to be our shepherd strive to live more and more each day with holiness of life and heroic virtue so that he will lead your holy people in all truth. Prepare him, we humbly pray, to fill our minds and hearts with the truth of the Gospel, the power of the sacraments, and the desire to actively work to build up your holy Church.

Loving God, grant our Holy Father Pope Leo wisdom in discernment as he chooses a new bishop for this local church. By your divine providence, grant us a shepherd after the heart of Jesus, the Good Shepherd, whose benevolent care and zealotness will strengthen the people of God.

We ask this through the intercession of our Lady of Guadalupe, and Saint Laurence, patron saint of the Diocese of Amarillo, and in the name of Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

SACRAMENTAL GUIDELINES

Sacrament of Baptism

Parents seeking Baptism for their child(ren) {under 7} need to start with the following steps:

Take and read one of the Baptism @ St. Ann's handouts located in the church Narthex and the Parish Office, or printable from our website: stannsofcanyon.org. Then, to register for Baptism, parent(s) should attend a **Baptism Registration Meeting**, held after each Mass on the third weekend of the month. This session will provide you with everything else you will need to know.

Sacrament of Confirmation

Celebrated with students in the 8th grade (or older) every year during the Easter season. Students must be enrolled and regularly attended St. Ann's Faith Formation Sunday morning Faith Formation classes for 2 years, usually 7th & 8th grade, and encouraged to attend Youth on Wednesday evenings, must be currently enrolled and participating in St. Ann's Faith Formation and meet all Confirmation preparation requirements.

Sacrament of Marriage

Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance for an initial meeting with the pastor. All couples are required by the Diocese of Amarillo to complete pre-marital and Natural Family Planning classes. After they have fulfilled these requirements, a follow-up meeting with the parish liturgy coordinators is scheduled to finalize plans for the wedding. Couple will need newly issued Baptism record with notation of Confirmation.

Sacrament of Penance
