CONSIDERATION OF OUR CHRISTIAN COMMITMENT: FOURTH WEEK OF LENT

This Sunday we begin the Fourth Week of Lent. The Gospel speaks of coming to the light and seeing more clearly. It is good to recognize how God calls us to be more fully alive. We die to self, not just to die, but to be more fully alive. It is good to see how life in the parish is growing and deepening as we journey through Lent, especially with our Elect and Candidates for Full Communion.

This weekend we celebrated the St. Joseph Altar which is a real work of love on the part of so many. They began making cookies back in January, and as we neared this weekend, workers were filling the hall nearly every day. It has been well attended over the years by friends of the parish and of St. Joseph who come from all over to look at the altar, offer a prayer, and share anything from a cookie to

dinner with us. We thank all those who work so graciously on this altar each year. It is a great expression of faith, prayer and working together. It was dedicated this year in memory of **Sylvia Pulizzano** who worked on the altar for many years and also served as the second chairperson for the Adoration Chapel. Sylvia was always ready to serve in a good, graced, quiet way and we appreciate the altar being dedicated this year in her memory.



The church pews have been a matter of concern for some time now and I am happy to say that a study has been ongoing for the past few months as to what kind of pews might best serve our needs. A committee has visited churches, both Catholic and non-Catholic around the state, looking at pews manufactured by the company we are considering hiring and also looking to see how different styles last and look through the years.
