

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Easter Mercy

As we continue through this Easter Season we have the opportunity to reflect on so many wonderful aspects of our Easter Lives. Certainly one of the important aspects of that life is the Mercy of God. This Second Sunday of Easter is also known as Divine Mercy Sunday. In the



Gospel today, Jesus calls His disciples to share His mercy. The message of The Divine Mercy is simple. It is that God loves us – all of us. And, He wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others. Thus, all will come to share His joy.

The Divine Mercy message is one we can call to mind simply by remembering ABC:

A - Ask for His Mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly, repenting of our sins and asking Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world. **B** - Be merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us. C - Completely trust in Jesus. God wants us to know that the graces of His mercy are dependent upon our trust. The more we trust in Jesus, the more we will receive.

This Sunday is a good day to remember and give thanks for the mercy we have received - from God and from others, and to pray that we, in our own unique ways, can share that mercy as only we can.

CommUnity Hands held an orientation meeting the Saturday before Holy Week as they prepared to begin



again with their ministry to the needy of our community. An ecumenical ministry which began in October, 2010, it became a wonderful ministry which was growing and growing until the 2016 flood. After the flood, because of so

Stump the Deacon!

During the Easter Vigil, several adults were baptized. That was very beautiful because they sought baptism themselves. So, why do we baptize infants rather than letting them make their own decision later?

Baptism of infants has been a practice of the Church since its beginning. Jesus said "Let the children come to me, and do not prevent them; for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these."

Every child is born with original sin. They did not bring this stain upon themselves, but we can remove it by baptizing them. This will open up the gates of heaven for them and help them begin their journey to that final reward. Without baptism, one cannot receive any of the other sacraments and receive the graces that come from them.

Baptism makes a child part of the Body of Christ. Should we exclude babies from the Body of Christ simply because they cannot choose if for themselves? Of course not! That would be like denying a sick child medicine because he cannot choose to take it himself.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (#'s 1250-1251) declares:

The sheer gratuitousness of the grace of salvation is particularly manifested in infant Baptism. The church and the parents would deny a child the priceless grace of becoming a child of God were they not to confer Baptism shortly after birth. Christian parents will recognize that this practice also accords with their role as nurturers of the life that God has entrusted to them.
