





A Matter of Balance

Stump the Deacon!

Jesus tells His disciples "In praying, do not babble like the pagans, who think they will be heard because of their many words." Many Non-Catholic Christians believe that this means that Catholics should not pray the rosary because it is repetitious prayers. What should our response be?

Jesus is not condemning repetitious prayers per-se. Otherwise, He would be condemning Himself because in the Garden of Gethsemane He prayed multiple times that His cup, His passion, would pass Him by. (Matthew 26:39-45) The babbling that Jesus was talking about was the reciting of mindless prayers, a long list of "divine" names, hoping that one of them would force a response from one of their gods. They were empty phrases, thinking they would be heard only if repeated frequently. These prayers did not express any love for the true God. The rosary is one of the most powerful prayers against the forces of the devil. Numerous popes, saints and others have strongly encouraged praying the rosary. Even the Blessed Virgin Mary at Fatima recommended the rosary. She said that reparation made via the rosary holds back the hand of God from striking the world with His just punishments. By praying the rosary, we honor Jesus and His mother, strengthen our faith, and grow spiritually while fighting evil. Catholics are encouraged to pray the rosary daily, but you don't necessarily have to pray the entire rosary. One decade is better than none.
