

Consideration of our Christian Commitment: Ordinary Time Budgets

As we celebrate this Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Gospel Sunday speaks of Jesus sending out his disciples two by two. He told them not to carry any money in their belts. They trusted in Providence, carried out their mission and returned to him all excited. We also trust in Providence, but that does not mean we have no budgets in the parish. We trust that Providence and the Stewardship of parishioners will help us meet it. Our fiscal year runs from July 1 through June 30, and we thought this would be a good time to share the parish budget with you. Stewardship comes from grateful hearts, not budget needs, but at the same time we like to let you know how the parish is doing financially.

To the right column are three columns: the first, listing line items; the second, last year's budget; and the third, this year's budget. While the budget has more detailed line items, we grouped some together to make the budget fit on one page.

The General Receipts (Income) line items are pretty much self-explanatory. Other earnings would be sacramental offerings, Diocesan collections retained, etc. Extraordinary Receipts are more or less "in and out" items such as collections taken for the missions, income from Religious Ed, money received from our savings accounts to pay for building programs and other expenses. These items are not true "income" as we understand the word.

Under Expenditures, we have salaries (clergy salaries are priests, deacons and replacement help.) and other expenses. Contracted services include maintenance on air conditioning systems, computers, etc.

Parish Share is the Diocesan tax which is based on a three year average of parish income. It helps support the Diocese which in turn provides services for us on different levels.

Pastoral Services are expenses incurred with Religious Ed, RCIA, Adult Formation, Youth Ministry, Social Responsibility, Sunday Nursery, Receptions, Socials, Outreach and the Pastor's Discretionary Fund.

Capital Expenses are usually associated with new things on campus, such as work on the pavilion, Faith Formation Center and additions to facilities on campus. The extraordinary expenses pretty much correspond to Extraordinary Income above. Lower receipts and expenses for the new fiscal year (2018-2019) reflect the income level of many after the flood of August 2016.

We are doing well. I thank you for your Stewardship of Finance which comes from grateful hearts. Let us thank the good Lord who accompanies us through life. Love,

Stump the Deacon!

In Matthew 23:9, Jesus says "Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven." How then can we call our priests "father?"

When Jesus said call no one "father" except God in heaven, He did not mean this literally. Jesus' point was that we must not confuse the type of fatherhood God has (which is ultimate and unlimited) with other forms of fatherhood (which are limited and conditional). Otherwise, we could not call our biological father by that name, which would be absurd. Not to be able to use the biological term "father" would erase the earthly analogy of God's divine fatherhood.

Limiting the use of "father" would also contradict many scriptural passages. "Honor your father and your mother" (Commandment #4). Jesus criticized the Pharisees and scribes for not honoring their "fathers" and mothers in Mark 7:11-12. Furthermore, calling spiritual leaders "father" was common in the early church communities. St. Stephen addresses "My brothers and fathers" (Acts 7:2). St. Paul uses the same terms in Acts 22:1. And, St. Paul states "I became your father in Christ Jesus through the Gospel" (1 Cor 4:15). St. Paul calls himself "father" because he recognized his cooperation with God in leading the spiritual life of the communities entrusted to him.

Jesus uses this type of language to make a point in a striking, memorable way. Both biological fathers and spiritual fathers bear the authority of God and participate in the one Fatherhood of God. Biological fathers are responsible for raising their biological children; spiritual fathers (our priests) are responsible for raising their spiritual children.
