



He is rooting us in His freedom, for if we love, we are truly free – free from all that would harm us, free from all that would keep us from Him and His way. We are living in a time of fulfillment.

Just a bit of follow-up on last Sunday's bulletin article, Part One: I thought it might be good to offer a bit of follow up on last Sunday's bulletin article and how it originated. We have a policy in the Diocese that retirement age is 68, however, it is not necessary to retire at 68, in fact the Bishop, Personnel Board and parishioners of the Diocese are usually happy when you decide to continue in assigned ministry beyond retirement age. However, once you reach 75, it is the tradition to write the Bishop and submit your resignation from retired ministry. After this paragraph, you can write your personal wishes, and the Bishop contacts you and lets you know what he would like. Last year I wrote and offered my resignation and told him that if I retired from a parish assignment, I would like to offer my services to serve and offer Eucharist at Angola. He called me and said he would like it if I were to continue as Immaculate Conception. This January I pastor at wrote again, saying I would be 76 and offering my resignation from assigned ministry. What is the RCIA Rite of Sending? The Rite of Sending offers the parish community an opportunity to acknowledge the spiritual progress the catechumens and candidates have made, express approval of their election or recognition, and send them forth to the bishop with their support. To send a catechumen to the bishop means that a parish has discerned that the person is ready to enter the Catholic Church. In Sacred Scripture, the Book of Revelations makes reference to a "Book of Life," in which are written the names of those who have chosen to follow the Lord Jesus and be baptized. In this Rite, those preparing for Baptism are invited to come forward and sign a book which we call the "Book of the Elect" as a sign of their desire to be numbered among the chosen of God. Those already baptized had their names written in the Book of Life at their Baptism.

### Stump the Deacon!

During Mass, after the consecration of the Body and Blood of our Lord and the Lord's prayer, the priest drops a particle of the Sacred Host into the chalice. Why does he do this?

This practice may have started during the early years of the Church when there was only one Eucharistic celebration (one Mass) in each city on Sunday. As Christianity spread, it was physically impossible for everyone to attend that one Mass, so more Masses began to be celebrated throughout the area. To maintain the connection to the Bishop's Mass, a small portion of the consecrated Host was taken to each of the other Masses where the presiding priest would comingle the Host with the consecrated wine.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal states that this comingling of the Body and Blood of Christ signifies "the unity of the Body and Blood of the Lord in the work of salvation, namely, of the living and glorious Body of Jesus Christ." As the priest places the host in the chalice, he silently prays: "May this mingling of the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ bring eternal life to us who receive it." The Vatican Office of Liturgical Celebrations also states: "Its object is to show, that at the moment of Our Lord's Resurrection, His Blood was reunited to his Body; by flowing again in His veins as before. It would not have sufficed if His soul alone had been reunited to His Body; His Blood must necessarily be so likewise, in order that the Lord might be whole and complete..."

Just as a piece of the Host symbolizes the death of Jesus, the comingling symbolizes His resurrection. A body without blood is dead, but when Christ's body is "reunited" with His blood, Christ is risen.


