My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I guess you can say that I am official now! This past Sunday, Bishop Duca celebrated the 11:00am Mass and officially installed me as the 11th pastor of Immaculate Conception Parish. Now, I have officially been the pastor since August 10th which was in my official

appointment letter. This past Sunday provided an opportunity for the community to come together with the Bishop to pray for the new pastor and for him to speak to all those who work with and advise him. I truly appreciate the warm welcome you have given me as well as the prayers that you have lifted up.

This past weekend was also the scheduled time for our Fall Festival. Even though we could not have all the events associated with the festival, we were still able to have our \$10,000 raffle and our first online auction. I am very happy to say that all 500 tickets for the \$10,000 raffle were sold by the end of the 4:00 p.m. Mass on Saturday, September 26th which was pretty amazing. Want to know the winner of the raffle? Turn to page 2! Thank you to all who sold and bought tickets as well, to the office staff and volunteers who organized everything and made sure people got their tickets. Due to your generosity for purchasing raffle tickets and participating in the online auction, approximately \$43,000 was collected for the Church this weekend. This money stays with the parish and goes towards maintaining and improving our facilities so that we can continue the mission to the serve the needs of our area and spread the Gospel message.

From looking back to looking towards this month, October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. The Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is on October 7th. Pope St. John Paul II in his encyclical Rosarium Virginis Mariae (On the Most Holy Rosary) states, "The Rosary belongs among the finest and most praiseworthy traditions of Christian contemplation. (#5 RVM)" He prayed the Rosary daily, and this month invites us to reflect on this important devotion. It gives us a chance to reflect on the life, mission, death, and resurrection of our Lord as well as how His Blessed Mother, Mary, journeyed, suffered, and accompanied Him. My encouragement for you this month is to say a decade a day if you are not already praying the rosary. If you pray it once or twice a week, try increasing it to three to five days a week. Also, more important than finishing a rosary is uniting yourself into the mystery you are focusing on and to connect with God in prayer! I hope to talk about this more throughout the month.

Finally, this month is also Respect Life Month. There is a list on Page 6 in the bulletin of events happening that involve our parish. This is another intention that you can lift up when you pray the rosary!



STUMP THE DEACON!

On September 23rd, we celebrated the memorial of Padre Pio. I understand he had the stigmata? What is that?

Fr. William Saunders wrote an article on this subject: What is the Stigmata? In his article he states: "The stigmata is the spontaneous appearance of the wound marks of our crucified Lord on a person's body. These marks include the nail wounds at the feet and the hands, the lance wound at the side, the head wounds from the crown of thorns, and the scourge marks over the entire body, particularly the back. A stigmatic (i.e. the person suffering from the stigmata) may have one, several, or all of these wound marks. Moreover, they may be visible or invisible, and they may be permanent, periodic, or temporary in appearance."

The wounds appear suddenly and conform to Christ's wounds that He endured during His passion. They bleed especially on days when our Lord's passion is remembered (such as Fridays and Good Friday) emitting clean and pure blood without harm to the person even though the blood flow may be great at times, and it can be very painful. Medication cannot heal these wounds.

On August 5, 1918, Padre Pio had a vision that he was pierced with a lance. Then about a month later, he received the wounds of Jesus in his hands and feet. Each day, he lost about a cup of blood, but the wounds never healed or festered, and a sweet odor came from his wounds, instead of the smell of blood. Padre Pio suffered with the stigmata for about 50 years.

Other stigmatics include St. Francis of Assisi, St. Catherine of Siena, St. John of God, Blessed Anne Catherine Emmerich and St. Faustina Kowalska. This number might be a bit dated (it's hard to find up-to-date statistics on this sort of thing), but according to a study in the early 20th century, out of 321 known stigmatics from the 13th century until then, only 41 of them had been men.
