

Ho, ho, homoousios!

December 6th marks the feast day of good ol' St. Nicholas. Many legends have cropped up around this great 4th century saint. More commonly known for his good deeds and generosity to the poor (hence his continuation as Santa Claus), my

personal favorite story about him involves his legendary status as a fiery theologian.

At the council of Nicaea, held in 325 AD, St. Nicholas was present as the Bishop of Myra. This council was so important because the bishops around the known world were debating the question: Was the Son equal to the Father? Orthodox bishops said, "yes." The Son is "consubstantial" with the Father (homoousios, in Greek). That is, they are of the same substance. They are one in being. The Father is God and the Son is God.

Unfortunately, a popular heretical priest named Arius persuaded many bishops to say, "no." Arius said the Son of God was a mere creature and therefore, could not be equal with God the Father. He was either heteroousios (of a different being altogether), or at best, the Son was homoiousios, (of like substance, but definitely not of the same substance). In other words, the Son was like God but not actually God. The difference in spelling between homoousios and homoiousios is just one letter (in English, "i", but in Greek, the iota), but the difference in meaning was huge!

So at this council of Nicaea, Arius stood amidst the bishops arguing for his heretical position- that the Son was not fully God. At some point St. Nicholas had had enough of it. Burning with zeal for the full divinity of Jesus Christ, he stood up and punched Arius in the face!

So what's the moral of the story? Well the next time we recite the Nicene Creed and get to the word, "consubstantial" make sure you say it correctly. If you don't, Santa Claus might come punch you in the face!

## STUMP THE DEACON!

On December 8<sup>th</sup>, we celebrated the Feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. What is the history of this Feast?

On December 8, 1854, Pope Pius IX proclaimed, "...the most Blessed Virgin Mary, in the first instance of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege granted by Almighty God, in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, the Savior of the human race, was preserved free from all stain of original sin, is a doctrine revealed by God and therefore to be believed firmly and constantly by all the faithful." Many believe that the Immaculate Conception relates to the conception of Jesus. True, Jesus was conceived without original sin, but the Feast Day celebrated on December 8<sup>th</sup> of each year relates to Mary's conception in her mother's womb.

Even though it was only declared a doctrine of the Church in 1854, the Church celebrated the Feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary in the 7<sup>th</sup> century in Palestine as the "Conception by St. Anne of the *Theotokos* (Mother of God)" on December 9<sup>th</sup>. When the observance spread to "the west," the date of the feast was ultimately changed to December 8<sup>th</sup>, nine months before Our Blessed Lady's birthday of September 8<sup>th</sup>.


During the Middle Ages many theologians, including St. Anselm of Canterbury, St. Albert the Great, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Bonaventure opposed the doctrine. They felt there was no justification for this opinion; Mary had to have been touched by original sin for at least an instant in her mother's womb. Blessed John Dun Scotus (1266-1308) disputed this; he laid the foundation of the Immaculate Conception of Mary so well and sufficiently that from that time on, the idea of Mary's Immaculate Conception prevailed. The Council of Basel in 1439 affirmed this, as did the Council of Trent (1545-1563) which explicitly declared that Mary was free from original sin.

In 1830, Mary appeared to St. Catherine Labouré. Mary was standing on a globe, with dazzling rays of light streaming from her outstretched hands surrounded by the inscription "O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee." As a result of this apparition, the Miraculous Medal was born which acknowledged her Immaculate Conception.

In 1858, Our Lady appeared to Bernadette Soubirous in Lourdes, France. Many people, including Church officials, doubted her. Bernadette did not know who the Lady was, so her family and friends asked Bernadette to ask her who she was. Our Lady's reply was, "Que soy era Immaculada Conceptiou," which means "I am the Immaculate Conception." When Bernadette told the parish priest Mary's reply, he was convinced that Bernadette had been seeing Our Blessed Lady because the proclamation four years earlier was not well known. Bernadette was only 14 years old, uneducated and could not have known about Pope Pius' declaration.

We are truly blessed that the patroness of our parish is Our Lady under the title of the "Immaculate Conception."

## Where is the Stress Less Christmas? by Stephanie Gaudin

What a special time Advent is that the Church has set apart for us to get ready for Jesus. It is important that we prepare ourselves - our hearts for His coming.

Realistically, do we use Advent for this? For most of us it is a time to "get ready" alright. There is shopping, decorating, parties, and school events, etc. In other words we "get ready" for a very stressful time.

Will we ever get rid of the stress of the holiday? Probably not. After all, I imagine that the first Christmas was a little stressful for Mary and Joseph. Even with the tremendous faith that they had, having your first baby far from home in a stable full of animals AND knowing that He is the Son of God and probably not being real sure what all that would bring, might be a little stressful.

How can we have a meaningful, less hectic, joyful Advent and Christmas season? Here are a few tips:

- Make realistic expectations for the holiday season.
- Make a list and prioritize the important activities. This can help make holiday tasks more manageable.
- SET REALISTIC GOALS FOR YOURSELF! Be realistic about what you CAN and CANNOT do.

- Help others. This will make you feel good and bring in what Christmas is all about.

I hope that we all will have an Advent/Christmas season full of God's love and peace.






