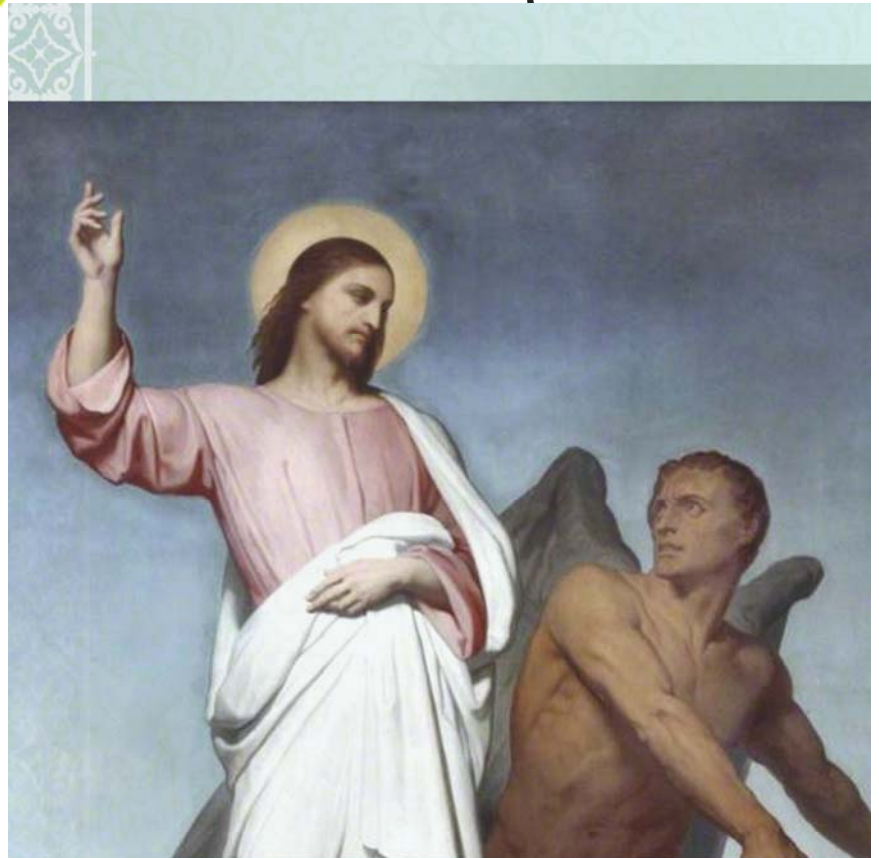

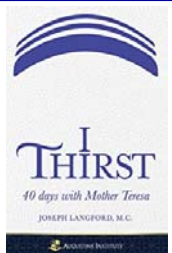

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

We enter into the season of Lent with a lot on our hearts and minds. This is a season about conversion, sacrifice, prayer, renewing, and hope! Lent helps to focus on ourselves and amending our lives to be more oriented toward the Lord. This season is also about offering our prayers and sacrifices for the conversion of our families, parish, communities, state, nation, and world. The goal is not just our own salvation but that we desire for all to come to know and follow our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

I am writing my article as the events are unfolding in the invasion of Ukraine. By the time this article is available to everyone, who knows what will have happened and where the world will be. Wherever we might be, it begins with each one of us following our Lord's call and uniting whatever is going on personally and in our world together in our prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Growing up, the focus of Lent was mainly about my conversion and relationship with the Lord with some focus on helping others. This was challenged as I started to grow in my faith and as a priest. This really becomes apparent at the Good Friday Liturgy during the Solemn Intercessions where people in many different situations are lifted up to the Lord.

My encouragement to each one of you, as well to myself, is to look at Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving to make sure they go beyond just ourselves but include our families, parish, communities, state, nation, and world. A suggestion would be to write down what you are offering your prayer and/or fasting for that particular day. You could even create a schedule and invite others to join you. I will be working on doing this in my own Lenten practices.

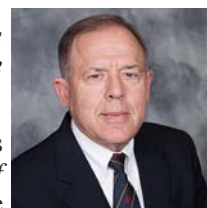
I would like to end my bulletin article with a prayer that I offered at Mass this morning. It comes from the Mass setting for the Preservation of Peace and Justice. May I invite you to take a moment to offer it now with me and possibly each day this coming week as we begin the season of Lent:

O God of peace, who are peace itself
and whom a spirit of discord cannot grasp,
nor a violent mind receive,
grant that those who are one in heart
may persevere in what is good
and that those in conflict
may forget evil and so be healed.
Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son,
who lives and reigns with you in the unity
of the Holy Spirit,
God, for ever and ever.

What is the purpose of dipping my hands in the holy water at the entrance of the church and making the sign of the cross?



Blessing ourselves with holy water helps us to remember our baptism. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* reminds us of the importance of water, "The symbolism of water signifies the Holy Spirit's action in Baptism, since after the invocation of the Holy Spirit it becomes the efficacious [effective] sacramental sign of new birth . . . into the divine life given to us in the Holy Spirit. As 'by one Spirit we were all baptized,' so we are also 'made to drink of one Spirit.' Thus the Spirit is also personally the living water welling up from Christ crucified as its source and welling up in us to eternal life" (CCC 694).

The *Catechism* goes on to state, "The gathering of the People of God begins with Baptism; a church must have a place for the celebration of Baptism (baptistry) and for fostering remembrance of the baptismal promises (holy water font)" (CCC 1185).

The Church has used holy water since the earliest days of Christianity. The holy water in the font is blessed by either a priest or deacon. We should also bless ourselves as we are leaving the church.

During the outbreak of COVID we emptied the water fonts at the entrance of the church to help prevent the spread of this virus. As COVID restrictions have been lifted, our holy water fonts are once again filled with holy water. However, many of us have gotten out of the habit of blessing ourselves as we enter the church. Let's try to get back in the habit.

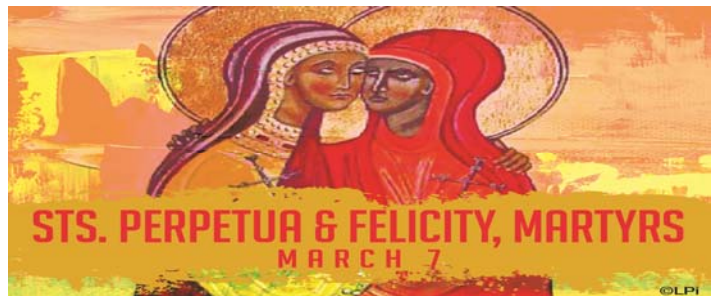
