

# In the Classroom

What's coming in the next weeks...



## Preschool

- **Religion** – Students will participate in units on Advent and Christmas. Students will learn the story of Jesus' birth and religious traditions revolving around this special time of year.
- **Language Arts** – Students will be introduced to letters e, w, b, and j. Students will learn the letter names and their sounds. Students will be introduced to blending compound words. (cup...cake>cupcake, pop...corn>popcorn. Students will continue to work on rhyming.
- **Math** – Students will learn to identify 3D shapes. (Cubes, cylinders, spheres, and cones). Students will learn about the properties of these shapes and connect to real world objects. Students will begin to count and develop 1:1 correspondence to 6 & 7.
- **Science and Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year. Students will begin a unit on exercise. Students will learn about different ways to move your body when exercising (jumping, climbing, running) and how it affects the body. Students will learn about places people exercise, equipment used, and types of exercise.
- **Art** – Students are working with motor skill using scissors/pencils and paintbrushes starting a christmas project.
- **Music** – *Teacher did not submit*
- **Gym** – Students will participate in different types of activities that connect to the exercise study.

## Kindergarten

- **Religion** – Students will learn about the season of Advent. They will think of “gifts” to give to Jesus for his birthday. They will learn about St. Mary and that Jesus is her Son.
- **Language Arts** – Students will begin Unit 5 and will focus on the following letter sounds and their corresponding spellings: u, w, j, y, x, k. They will verbally blend three letter sounds to read CVC words containing the letters above, in combination with previous letters learned. They will also be introduced to new tricky words.
- **Math** – Students are finishing up chapter 4, comparing numbers to 10. They will begin chapter 5 and will focus on flat and solid shapes.
- **Science & Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year. Students will be learning about plants. They will learn plants are living things, what they need to live and grow, the life cycle of a plant, different types of environments plants grow in, parts of a plant, and how plants provide for people.
- **Art** – Students will be starting their Christmas project this week and they will be using a mixture of materials as they learn to develop design skills and further their fine motor skills.
- **Music** - *Teacher did not submit*
- **Gym** – Students will participate in various activities using scooters.

## Grade 1

- **Religion** – Students will learn about the season of Advent. They will think of “gifts” to give to Jesus for his birthday. They will learn who St. Mary is and how she shows us to live.
- **Language Arts** - Students are reading and spelling CVCe words, words with the double oo pattern, and tricky words. Students will begin learning about verbs and will practice identifying a verb in a sentence. Students will continue reading stories from “Fables” focusing on the moral of each story and answering literal, inferential, and evaluative comprehension questions.

- **Knowledge** - Students will finish learning about the Ancient Egypt civilizations. Students will begin using Venn Diagrams to compare and contrast different religions, focusing on Judaism, Christianity, and Islam.
- **Writing** - Students will continue working on a personal narrative. Students have brainstormed and planned their writing, and will begin writing a rough draft and start the editing process.
- **Math** – Students will continue addition and subtraction within 20, focusing on fact families and real world addition and subtraction problems.
- **Science & Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year. Students will wrap up learning about the Ancient Egypt civilizations, and begin learning about 3 different religions - Judaism, Christianity, and Islam.
- **Art** – Students will begin a Christmas project using several different art techniques as they further develop design skills and fine motor skills.
- **Music** - *Teacher did not submit.*
- **Gym** – Students will be learning tennis skills.

## Grade 2

- **Religion** – Today students made final preparations for First Reconciliation tonight @6:30 @St. Mary's Church. Starting Tuesday they will learn about the season of Advent. They will think of "gifts" to give to Jesus for his birthday. They will learn more about St. Mary and her feast days.
- **Knowledge** - Students will be finishing their Ancient Greek Civilization unit, focusing on Greek philosophers Socrates, Aristotle and Plato, and learning about the conquests of Alexander the Great.
- **Writing** - Students will write a book report that retells a story from their reader, *Bedtime Tales* and will learn about the parts of a friendly letter when they write letters to Santa.
- **Skills** - Students are reading and spelling CVVC and oi/oy pattern words and will learn about the "drop and add" rule when adding suffix -ing to magic -e words. Students will read *The Pancake Part I* and *The Pancake Part II*, focusing on the elements of fiction and will work on sequencing the story. Students will also understand the difference between antonyms and synonyms.
- **Math** - Students will begin their unit on length, exploring metric and customary measurements. They will estimate lengths and measure in meters and centimeters using meter sticks and rulers. Students will also compare and order lengths and solve real-world problems.
- **Science & Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year. Students are still exploring the characteristics of ancient Greek civilization and learning about important historical figures.
- **Art** – Students are working on their Christmas art project and will be using several different materials developing their concept of what art and design mean coupled with further development in their skill set.
- **Music** – *Teacher did not submit.*
- **Gym & Health** - Students will be learning tennis skills.

## Grade 3

- **Religion** - Students are learning about the Liturgical Year, the season of Advent, and Evangelization.
- **CKLA** – Students will begin their unit on The Human Body and tour each body's system to learn about its function
- **Writing** - Students will begin an opinion writing piece and also continue to learn how to write in cursive
- **Math** – Students recently completed a chapter on multiplication facts and will begin a new chapter on multiplying two numbers with and without regrouping.
- **Science & Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year.
- **Art** – Third grade have started designing their Christmas art projects and will be using Acrylics and construction paper to create their own designs. Students are learning core design concepts as they develop their own critical thinking skills throughout the creative process.

- **Music** – Teacher did not submit.
- **Gym & Health** – Third grade will participate in a unit on Tennis.

## Grade 4

- **Religion** – Students will learn about the Liturgical Calendar, Advent, and the Virtues.
- **Language Arts** – Fourth Grade will begin their Poetry unit and continue to learn word morphology
- **Math** – Students will begin a unit on fractions.
- **Science** – Students are continuing their unit of the types of energy and are learning about energy transmitted through sound, light, and heat.
- **Social Studies** – Students finished their Middle Ages Unit and will begin learning about Dynasties of China, the Silk Road, and traditional literature
- **Art** – Students will be starting their Christmas projects incorporating several mediums and materials to produce a personalized art piece. The Students will further their design confidence and skill set as they execute this project.
- **Music** - Teacher did not submit.
- **Gym & Health** –

## Grade 5

- **Religion** – Students will learn about the Liturgical Calendar, Advent, and the Necessity of Baptism.
- **Language Arts** – Students will finish reading *Don Quixote* and write an essay focusing on how the characters are developed throughout the novel.
- **Math** (Smith / Wolfe) – Students will compare, order, and round decimals. They will also rewrite three place decimals as mixed numbers in simplest form.
- **Math** (Lewis) – Students just began a chapter on decimals before the break and will begin the week by continuing to work on comparing decimals and converting fractions to decimals.
- **Science** – Students will learn about different types of matter in ecosystems and how the types of matter interact.
- **Social Studies** – This week we will be starting our new Unit about the Renaissance. This week we will cover the beginning of the Renaissance, Artisans and Artists, and the Cradle of the Renaissance.
- **Art** – Students have been designing this Christmas project for a few weeks and have reached the mid-way point. The materials they are using are newly introduced and it has been both a learning experience and an exciting material to work with and learn about.
- **Music** - Teacher did not submit.
- **Gym & Health** – Students will start their tennis unit for the month of December.

## Grade 6

- **Religion** – Students will learn about the Liturgical Calendar, Advent, and the life of Abraham.
- **Language Arts** – Students will begin a new non-fiction text unit on Chocolate.
- **Math** – Students will solve real-world problems involving unit rates, distance, and speed.
- **Science** – Students learn about the distribution of Earth's resources and how human activities affect these resources.
- **Social Studies** – This week we will learn about Thomas Hobbes and John Locke. While completing an activity comparing those two to previously learned Enlightened thinkers.
- **Art** – Teacher did not submit.
- **Music** – Teacher did not submit.
- **Gym & Health** – Students will be learning how to play Tennis.

## Grade 7

- **Religion** – Students will continue to study Scripture with a focus on the Gospels. They will begin to talk about our saint of the Month, The Blessed Virgin Mary. They'll talk about the doctrines and dogmas surrounding our Blessed Mother.
- **Language Arts** – Students will complete vocabulary unit 7, finish a unit on verbs, and read *The Outsiders*.
- **Math** – Students will continue their study of proportional relationships, specifically direct and inverse proportions.
- **Science** – Students will finish a unit on the Earth-Moon and Sun system.
- **Social Studies** – Students will continue to learn about the Revolutionary War.
- **Art** – Students are using a newly introduced material for this next project and are exploring texture scale and visual aesthetics with this Christmas project.
- **Music** - *Teacher did not submit.*
- **Gym & Health** – Students will work with representatives from the Cincinnati Tennis Foundation to learn and hone their tennis skills.

## Grade 8

- **Religion** – Students will continue learning about the early Church. They will begin to talk about our saint of the Month, The Blessed Virgin Mary. They'll talk about the doctrines and dogmas surrounding our Blessed Mother and discover many of her appearances throughout the world.
- **Language Arts** – Students will be reading *A Christmas Carol*. Watch for field trip permission slips to come home soon to see the play at Playhouse in the Park.
- **Math (May)** – Students will continue their study of slope and writing equations of lines in slope-intercept form. Students will also be graphing linear equations given an equation of a line in slope-intercept form.
- **Math (Poux)** – Students have begun work on the first chapter in Unit 3 where they will work once again with the rules of exponents.
- **Science** – Students will begin a unit on force and motion.
- **Social Studies** –
- **Art** – Students are working with a guided drawing and painting project for this seasonal piece and are learning about scale. The students are working with a variety of materials and painting techniques.
- **Music** - *Teacher did not submit*
- **Gym & Health** – Students will work with representatives from the Cincinnati Tennis Foundation to learn and hone their tennis skills.
