



In the Classroom

What's coming in the next weeks...



Preschool

- **Religion** – Students will begin a God Made My Friends Unit and learn about friends and God's role in creating them. Students will learn how to be a good friend.
- **Language Arts** – Students will continue to learn about school and will talk about our visual classroom schedule using words like next, before and after. Students will review letters “a”, “s”, “t” and “p” and their sounds. Students will work to put letters of their name in order.
- **Math** – Students will match numerals to amounts up to 3. Students will make sets of 1, 2, and 3 objects.
- **Science and Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year. Students will continue to learn about families and roles of family members as well as traditions families from different cultures may have.
- **Art** – Students will learn about and use primary colors and talk about the secondary colors they make when mixed.
- **Music** – Students are learning how to keep a steady beat and move to the music
- **Gym** – Students will use practice following directions by using a parachute and moving the parachute fast and slow high and slow.

Kindergarten

- **Religion** – Students are learning about the Good Shepherd, Jesus. They are also learning the Our Father and its meaning.
- **Language Arts** – Students will begin orally blending two syllables to form two-syllable words. Once they master two syllable words, they will begin orally blending two and three sounds to form two and three letter words. Students will continue to master pre-writing strokes to prepare them for letter writing.
- **Math** – Students will continue to count, order, recognize, and write numbers to 5.
- **Science & Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year. Students will continue their unit of study on nursery rhymes.
- **Art** – Students are working hard on their projects learning about the first elements of art.
- **Music** - Students are learning about sound qualities: tempo, pitch, timbre and duration
- **Gym** – Students will continue learning how to work as a team while practicing their locomotor skills in various activities.

Grade 1

- **Religion** – Students are learning that God is our Father and we are His Children. They are learning how we respond to God.
- **Language Arts** - Students are reviewing the sounds and letter names, as well as, practicing their handwriting strokes for each letter in the alphabet. Students will continue orally blending and segmenting single-syllable words, counting syllables in words, and reviewing tricky words.
- **Knowledge** - Students will wrap up their unit on Fables and Stories. Students will begin learning about 5 systems of the human body, and how these systems work together to help our bodies function. Students will begin exploring vocabulary words that connect to each body system.
- **Writing** - Students will be introduced to informational writing in Knowledge by creating a body systems journal, showing important facts they have learned from each story.

- **Math** – Students will wrap up their chapter on numbers 1-10 with a test. They will begin their chapter on addition and subtraction within 10 - focusing on the parts and whole of a number bond and how that relates to addition and subtraction.
- **Science & Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year. Students will begin learning about the human body.
- **Art** – Students are getting excited about their beach projects and discovering oil resist.
- **Music** - Student are learning how to play different rhythms and learning about singing.
- **Gym** – Students will learn the basics of badminton. Students will work on hand-eye coordination while practicing swinging, hitting toward a target and passing with a partner.

Grade 2

- **Religion** – Students will learn that God created all things out of love. They will then see that God made us in His image and likeness.
- **Knowledge** - Students will finish the Fairy Tales portion of Unit 1 and take a quiz. Students will move on to Tall Tales, exploring more vocabulary and the different elements of the stories (exaggeration, humor, setting, etc.).
- **Skills** – Students are reading and spelling beginning and ending blends/consonant digraphs, reviewing tricky words, and practicing fluency. We will also begin a chapter book study.
- **Writing** - Students are finishing their summer writing pieces, practicing sentence writing, and are being introduced to journal writing.
- **Math** - Students are concluding Chapter 1: Numbers to 1,000. Students have been reviewing place value, skip-counting, comparing/ordering numbers, and identifying number patterns. We will finish the chapter with a test.
- **Science & Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year. Students will learn about the American Frontier and "real-life heroes" in the Tall Tales portion of our unit in Knowledge.
- **Art** – Students are learning more about color combinations.
- **Music** – Students are learning how to play different rhythms and playing group rhythm games.
- **Gym & Health** - Students will continue their badminton unit.

Grade 3

- **Religion** - Students are discussing the 10 Commandments and the ways we can live them out.
- **CKLA** – Practicing long and short vowel sounds, writing alternate endings using different P.O.V.
- **Writing** - Students will begin planning and drafting their first narrative writing piece.
- **Math** – Students will be finishing up Numbers to 10,000. This includes counting, place value, comparing and ordering, and rounding to the nearest ten and hundred. They will begin addition within 10,000.
- **Science & Social Studies** will be integrated through our language arts program, CKLA, throughout the year.
- **Art** – Students are enjoying discovering water color and paper tearing techniques
- **Music** – Students are learning about rhythm notation, how to read different rhythms and play them with body percussion following a beat.
- **Gym & Health** – *Not Submitted*

Grade 4

- **Religion** – Students have begun finding the difference between souls, and how to practice morality.
- **Language Arts** – Writing personal narratives using C-E, character traits, and reviewing paragraph components of Topic sentence, supporting details, and a concluding sentence.
- **Math** – Students will finish chapter 1 “Working with Whole Numbers” and begin Chapter 2 “Multiplication and Division”.

- **Science** – Students have been learning how to find speed and acceleration when given information about distance and time.
- **Social Studies** – Students will understand elements of geography and study the Lewis and Clark Expedition
- **Art** – Students have started working on their dragon projects and planning the colors they want to use.
- **Music** - Students are learning how to write, read and recognize rhythms with different time signatures and adding more rhythm vocabulary.
- **Gym & Health** – Students will continue their unit on Badminton.

Grade 5

- **Religion** – Students have begun learning about signs and how the Church uses signs to bring us closer to God.
- **Language Arts** – Students will be finishing their personal narratives unit, and will write their own personal narratives, showcasing the grammar skills they have learned over the course of the unit.
- **Math (Smith)** – *Not submitted*
- **Math (Lewis)** – *Not submitted*
- **Science** – *Not Submitted*
- **Social Studies** – Students are learning about the Ancient Mayan civilization, specifically the Mayan sport of Pok-ta-Pok, their hieroglyphics, and their calendar. They will also be taking a quiz over the first two chapters on Wednesday.
- **Art** – Students portraits are looking fantastic and they are enjoying personalizing their art to reflect their personalities.
- **Music** - Students are writing, reading and recognizing different rhythms with all the basic rhythm notation. They will be playing rhythms with two different voices.
- **Gym & Health** – Students have shifted from kickball into badminton.

Grade 6

- **Religion** – Students are doing a deep-dive into the book of Genesis, beginning with Creation.
- **Language Arts** – Students will finish reading *The Tragedy of Julius Caesar*. Students will also continue studying Greek and Latin roots, and compound and complex sentences.
- **Math** – Students will begin a unit on comparing positive and negative numbers and locating positive and negative numbers on a number line. They will also explore how to find the absolute value of a number.
- **Science** – *Not submitted*
- **Social Studies** – Students are taking a quiz Monday over the different forms of government in Ancient Greece, we will be finishing our chapter on Ancient Greece and start Sparta towards the end of the week.
- **Art** – Students are still working with the newspaper and art paper animal project.
- **Music** - Students are learning about song structure and form. They will be able to understand how a song is composed and recognize its different sections, including mood, instruments and genre.
- **Gym & Health** – Students will continue playing Badminton.

Grade 7

- **Religion** – Students will attend Adoration for the first time this year on Friday. They will continue their study of the types of prayer and even work toward writing their own.
- **Language Arts** – Students will finish reading *Hello, Universe*, write an essay on theme, and continue a grammar unit on types of sentences.
- **Math** – Students will apply their knowledge of adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing integers to perform operations on positive and negative rational numbers.
- **Science** – Students will continue observing their terrariums and begin a unit on weather and climate.
- **Social Studies** – Students will begin Chapter 2: European Exploration and Colonization of the Americas.
- **Art** – Students are exploring the ideas of abstract principles and creating material for their project.
- **Music** - Students are learning about song structure and form. They will be able to understand how a song is composed and recognize its different sections, including mood, instruments and genre.
- **Gym & Health** – Students will continue their badminton unit.

Grade 8

- **Religion** – Students will attend Adoration for the first time this year on Friday. They will then begin to study the start of the Church.
- **English** – Students will study Vocabulary Unit 5, subjects, verbs, conjunctions, phrases and clauses.
- **Reading** – Students will study imagery, description and characterization.
- **Math (May)** – Students will apply properties of exponents to simplify exponential expressions. Students will begin to learn about how scientific notation is used to represent very large and very small numbers.
- **Math (Poux)** – Students will finish Unit 1 material and take their first test later this week. In unit 2, they will work with linear functions.
- **Science** – Students will finish a unit on the Theory of Plate Tectonics.
- **Social Studies** – Students will continue their study of the Civil War.
- **Art** – Students are creating the abstract works needed to make the next project.
- **Music** - Students are learning about song structure and form. They will be able to understand how a song is composed and recognize its different sections, including mood, instruments and genre.
- **Gym & Health** – Students will continue their badminton unit.


