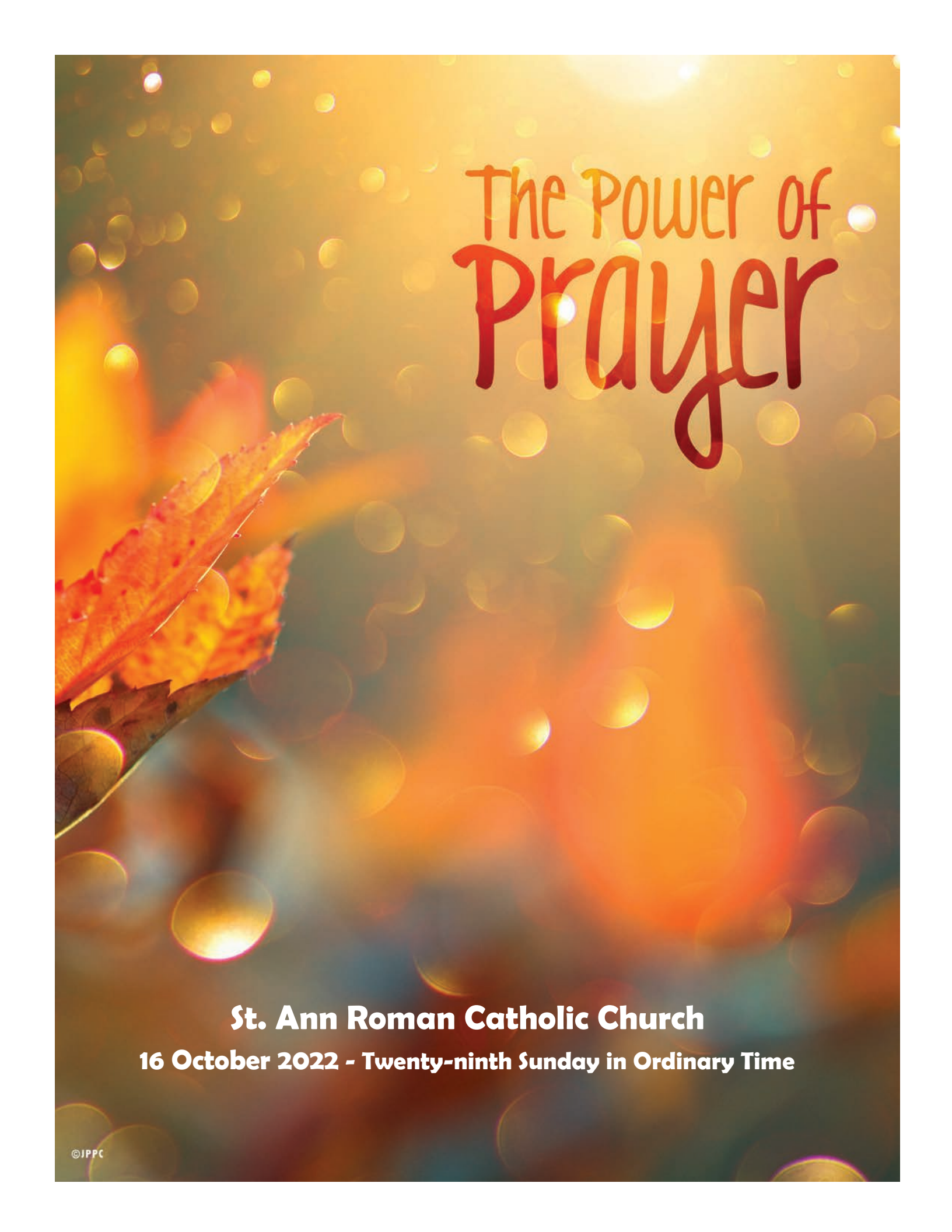

Respect Life Month – Each week in October we focus on different groups through whom Jesus comes to us. The past few weeks we have focused on: Migrants & Refugees (Sept.28); Children in the womb and their mothers (Oct. 2); Caring for Creation, Our Common Home (Oct. 4); and Welcoming the stranger (Oct. 9).

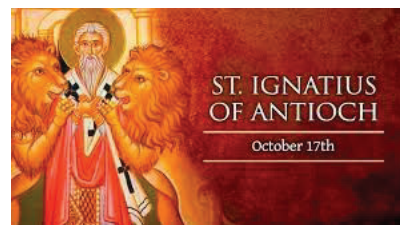


This week I invite you to join me in focusing on Jesus words, "I was hungry, and you gave me food" (Matthew 25:35).

The food insecurity that many of our neighbors face every month has been aggravated by the inflation of prices for basic necessities (food, diapers, toiletries, gasoline, fuel oil, etc.). We thank God for the local organizations which are providing food and other necessities for our neighbors, for example, The Phoenixville Senior Center, St Peter's Episcopal Church, the Kitchen at Ann's Heart, Alianzas, St. Ann's Pantry, etc. That said, the Phoenixville Area Community Services (PACS), located at 101 Buchanan Street, is the lead organization addressing food insecurity in our area. PACS reports that the need for food assistance rose 500% from the fiscal year ended 30 June 2019, compared to the need experienced for the fiscal year ended 30 June 2022. Stated another way, during the last fiscal year PACS served 55,000 individuals at their site, plus and an additional 5,000 persons per month through their several local community partner agencies. A local and practical way to practice Respect for Life is to support PACS and our other ministries that are feeding the hungry Jesus.

CONSUMER CULTURE – Tomorrow (Oct. 17) we will celebrate the Memorial of St. Ignatius of Antioch who wrote letters to several Christian Churches as he was being led to Rome for martyrdom. His consuming Christ's Word and Body & Blood each Sunday gave Ignatius the capacity not to be consumed by the hatred of his captors or by the violence of the mob even as he was being consumed by wild beasts in the Colosseum of Rome in the year 108. This elderly bishop was tossed as a tidbit to the crowd's ravenous appetite to be entertained at the expense of the suffering of others. Not so unlike ourselves today when through social media and gossip we gorge upon and revel in the "train wrecks" that our brothers and sisters sometimes make of their lives.



Ignatius caught that he had been baptized into Christ: into Christ the Person and into Christ the Process. Because of this Ignatius was able to write: "I would prefer to die in Jesus Christ than to rule over all the earth. I seek him who died for us, I desire him who rose for us. **I am in the throes of being born again.** Bear with me, my brothers; do not keep me from living, do not wish me to die. I desire to belong to God; do not give me over to the world, and do not seduce me with perishable things. Let me see the pure light; **when I am there, I shall be truly a man at last.** Let me imitate the sufferings of my God. If anyone has God in him, let him understand what I want and have sympathy for me, knowing what drives me on."



I think Ignatius learned to see his life as a series of endings and beginnings, of dyings and of being born anew from his teacher St. Paul the Apostle, for instance from Paul's letter to the Church in Ephesus: "(God is)

building up the body of Christ until we all attain to the unity of faith and knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the extent of the full stature of Christ,... living the truth in love, we should grow in every way into him who is the head, Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, with the proper functioning of each part, brings about the body's growth and builds itself up in love, from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, with the proper functioning of each part, brings about the body's growth and builds itself up in love" (Eph. 4:13ff).

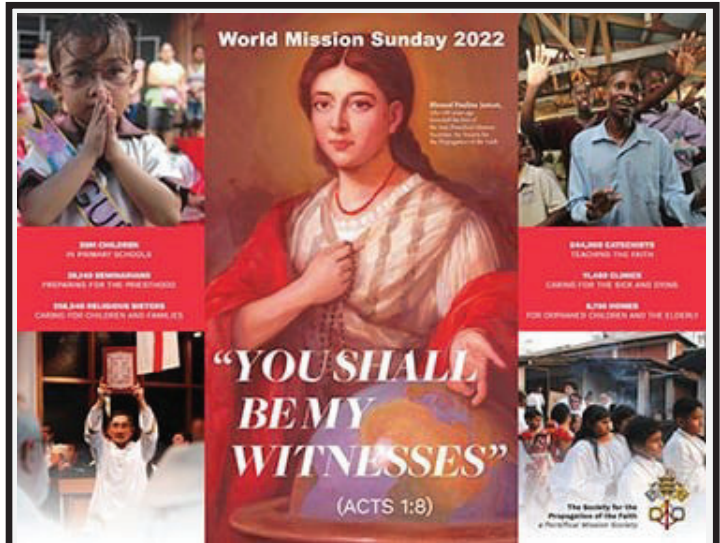

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

On October 23rd, we will join Catholics around the world to celebrate World Mission Sunday to highlight and support the Missions of the Church. This year's theme is "You shall be My Witnesses." (Acts 1: 8) Pope Francis has used this theme to call every Christian to bear witness to Christ, to participate in a Mission of universal evangelization, and to seek strength and guidance from the Holy Spirit.

Since its beginning in 1822, the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, one of the Pontifical Mission Societies, has provided millions of dollars to support new and growing Churches in the United States alone. Your prayers and generous support today sustain priests, religious, and lay pastoral leaders in 1,111 Mission dioceses in Asia, Africa, and the Pacific Islands as well as parts of Latin America and Europe. This support is essential to their vital work among some of the poorest communities to proclaim the Gospel, build the Church, and serve a variety of temporal needs.

Blessed Pauline Jaricot began this work 200 years ago at the young age of seventeen. Pope Francis reminds us, "She accepted God's inspiration to establish a network of prayer and collection for missionaries so that the faithful could actively participate in the mission 'to the ends of the earth.'" Her vision would lead to World Mission Sunday, which helps the Pope support Missionary activity. When you contribute to the World Mission Sunday collection, you make it possible for the Holy Father to provide for the formation of our seminarians and religious men and women. You assist in building the schools and orphanages that care for children in places few visit. Missionaries can build churches in areas with scarce resources, buy food and the bare essentials that make it possible to proclaim the Gospel and celebrate the Sacraments.

I personally encourage your generosity on World Mission Sunday and share my gratitude for your openhearted response on this special day. While your prayers remain your greatest gift, your financial support is life-giving to our brothers and sisters in the world's most vulnerable communities. It enables missionaries to work and witness to Christ, as it enables each one of us to be the Lord's witnesses.

CYO Winter Registration

Registration for Winter Sports (Basketball, Cheerleading, and Volleyball Clinic) is now open at www.hfscyo.com Basketball Registration is for members of the Holy Family CYO parishes – St. Ann's, St. Mary's and St. Joseph's. Members of St. Basil's, including those attending Holy Family School, must register for basketball with St. Basil's CYO. If St. Basil's CYO is not offering a basketball season, then you may register with Holy Family. The basketball registration fee is \$125 for grades 5-12, \$100 for grade 4 and NO CHARGE for grade 3 (Instructional Only). The Cheerleading registration fee is \$35. Registration for basketball grades 4 through 8 will close on Tuesday, November 1st. Late registrations will only be accepted for divisions where we have availability and a late fee will be incurred. 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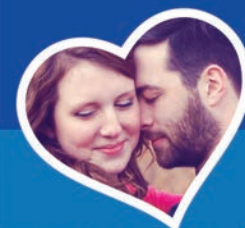
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
