LENT – What is it For?



COMING TO SEE, PART 1 – I frequently hear parents say how they are coming to see the truth of what they had heard all their lives, namely, that their children are gone from home before they (the parents) know it. As we go through life, there are any number of things we become able to see that were not “see-able” for us earlier in our journey.



COMING TO SEE, PART 2 – About 30 years ago I heard that the purpose of Lent is Baptism. While it sounded true to me, I was not at that time in a position to see how or why it was true. Now years later, through grace, I have been led to the position from which I am able (a bit) to grasp and to be grasped by the connection between Baptism and Lent.

To baptize means to sink into. In our baptism each of us was into Christ so that Christ might begin to sink into us, become part of us, become eventually the very heart of us. Most of us were relatively unconscious when we were sacramentally sunk into Christ as infants at the baptismal font, and the point is for us to become progressively more conscious of and conformed to the One in whom we “live and move and have our being” (Acts 17:28).



ANNUAL RENEWAL – For this reason our Tradition invites us each Easter Sunday, after having heard the Good News of the Resurrection for the first time---eg., as a 7 year old, or 23 year old, or 55 year old, or 92 year old---to stand on our own two feet and to make our own (as consciously as we are able at point in life) the promises that were made for us at our Sacramental Baptism. Since this is such a big deal, our Tradition has

developed an entire season called Lent to help us drill down into our souls and to prepare for this annual renewal of our Baptismal Focus and Commitment for the twelve months following Easter 2022.

LENT



Christ calls us to grow in grace throughout our lives and so become the kind of persons who are able to see God and who want to accept the invitation to walk in the Light Who is Jesus. And so we live each day on the road, open to rethinking what matters and adjusting our behavior accordingly. Such penitential living neither begins in Lent nor is confined to Lent; rather, during Lent we intensify or “take up a notch” our daily practice of the normal penitential actions of prayer, fasting and works of charity. Further, during Lent we practice such instruments of conversion and transformation in a more visibly communal manner with our sisters and brothers in and as the Body of Christ.

LENT: GLOBAL & NATIONAL



The Bishops of the United States prescribe, as minimal obligation, that all persons who are fourteen years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, on all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.

Further, all persons eighteen years of age and older, up to and including their fifty-ninth birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light.

All the faithful are encouraged, when possible, to participate at Mass and to receive the Holy Eucharist daily, to celebrate frequently the Sacrament of Penance, to undertake spiritual reading especially the study of the Sacred Scriptures.

I encourage everyone and every home to participate in CRS/Rice Bowl which helps many hungry persons here in our own Archdiocese as well as countless others throughout our nation and our world. In addition to participating in CRS/Rice Bowl digitally, physical materials may be obtained in chapel or through the parish office.

What is the goal of this Synod? The objective is to provide an opportunity for the entire People of God to discern together how to move forward on the path towards being a more synodal (Christian) Church in the long-term. Pope Francis characterizes the two interrelated goals of this process of listening: "to listen to God, so that with him we may hear the cry of his people; to listen to his people until we are in harmony with the will to which God calls us."

Who can participate? All the baptized are invited to participate in this Synodal Process.

What is the role of the parish? St. Ann's will be offering the Disciple Maker Index (DMI) survey from March 2 to April 4 both on the parish website <https://churchofsaintann.org/> and as a hardcopy survey that can be filled out in-person (copies are on the Chapel shelves). You can also take the survey through the Archdiocesan website at <https://archphila.org/synod/> by clicking on the link for your home parish.

How can I participate? The two primary ways you can participate are:

1. Complete the **Disciple Maker Index Survey** which will be offered at St. Ann's from **March 2 to April 4**. This is an opportunity for every Catholic to provide personal feedback towards this process.
2. Attend one of many Engagement Sessions held in-person and virtually throughout the Archdiocese in March and April. These facilitated sessions will allow the People of God to engage with one another and listen to each other's journey.
