Faith Formation: Read Chapter Three of Four Signs of a Dynamic Catholic by Matthew Kelly Jose Ortiz will lead

- Chapter 3 is on study and learning. The challenge is for each of us to read daily. Increase the holiness in yourself and you become a better version of yourself. The book had several questions to consider including: Is there more to Catholicism than attending mass? How can we challenge ourselves to be better versions of ourselves?
- What time in your life have you been hungry for answers? Some answers:
 - Times of loss, sadness or uncertainty
 - When trying to explain something. One might not have the answer. Knowledge leads to wisdom
 - o Can't learn everything. Not knowing is an opportunity to work on it together.
- What is the best Catholic book you have read? Some answers:
 - Thomas Merton The Seven Story Mountain
 - The Life of Christ by Bishop Fulton Sheen
 - o The Bible Timeline
 - The Holy Longing
 - John Shea's books
 - Joseph Girzone's books
- What questions about Catholicism do you want the answers to and how are you going to find the answers? Some answers:
 - Look up keywords in the Catholic Catechism
 - O How are the Catholic church leaders promoting tolerance?
 - Relativism (no right answers, what you think is OK) makes it harder to know how to respond. One can share one's thoughts and why you think that. The church teaches that

there are some absolutes. We need to dig deeper to know more. Some topics that fit here are abortion, anything with ethics is challenging. Vatican II provided for people to have an informed conscious and make a decision. (How is this different than relativism? – the informed conscious includes the churches teachings and includes God; If one's decision is against something – there may be penalties associated with that decision). For more on moral conscience see Catholic Catechism starting at paragraph 1776.

- Was there a time in your life when you weren't interested in finding the answers? Some answers:
 - Global Warming need to know about it to make informed decisions. Find out what the church says (Laudto Si)
 - Handout Re-Discover Catholicism every year at Christmas

Busy time of year with the port and 5K. I attended a diocese meeting on Assisted Catholic living ministries in the diocese. Monthly costs are high and it's hard to find help. St Francis in Richmond has 85 beds filled and could handle 25 more residents if they could hire the staff. We also heard from the neighbors program in Richmond. The neighbors program provided volunteer assistance to the elderly and others who need assistance. All of our ministry's programs can use more help – especially people.

- Haiti Twinning Ministry
 - Run/Walk with the Son for Haiti 5k:
 - * Haiti 5K is this weekend, Dec. 4. All events are going to be held outdoors in the first section of the parking lot. Raffle tickets sold on line. Silent Auction on Race Day.
 - * We still need volunteers to help with set-up and clean-up. Set-up starts at 7 a.m. and clean up at 11:30. Please check with Virginia Cotter, vlcotter@verizon.net, if interested. We have approximately 260 runners for the 5K.
 - * Received a letter from Bishop Desinord Jean see attached following minutes
 - * Connie Topp, one of the 5K pioneers wrote a very nice article on the race and St. Kateri's Haiti Ministry in Smoke Signal, the Running Man newsletter. The article is posted on the Haiti bulletin board.
 - Student Sponsorship Program:
 - * Our online Student Sponsorship Drive begins Dec. 4. Postcards have been mailed to all parish families.
 - * Due to Haiti travel restrictions, St. Michel is taking the student photos for this year's sponsorship. We expect to receive photos in December. Please contact Judy Townsend at judy.townsend@verizon.net, or 757-876-2417 if interested in getting a student photo. Sponsorships make great gifts!
- o Kairos: The Kairos team will be meeting December 4th virtually with the prisoners in residence.
- o Port:
 - Ray would really like a planning helper for Port. He's put in a lot of years.

Port kept 54 people out of 34-degree weather and had very strong support from the parish.
 The next PORT is the last week in January.

Emergency Assistance Program

- The SKT-EAP Fund currently has \$4,099.95 available. We were able to help a widow (57) with her utility bills and prevent one from being cut off, we paid off 3 and part of a 4th for a total of \$300. She was a referral from the United Way of the Virginia Peninsula.
- The EAP is working on two more situations where help is needed. This is a new program, and we need to let people know it's up and running.

- Status and plan for Hospitality Committee Kathy
 - Needs to recruit more people, but plans are to be ready to support the Parish Lenten Soup Supper (will do the serving). Will need to work on who supplies the soups.
 - Would like to start up funeral receptions. Will need to keep it simple and have people serve the food. If we can't have food in the church, may start to provide food to take to the family

My Brothers and Sisters, I send you warm greetings from the Diocese of Hinche, especially from your friends in Boucan Carré. I take this opportunity to express my profound gratitude to Fr Bob Spencer, the Haiti Committee, and the parishioners for your generous support to the people of Boucan Carré.

We are grateful to all who carry us in their hearts and prayers and to all who provide their support which is crucial to us.
