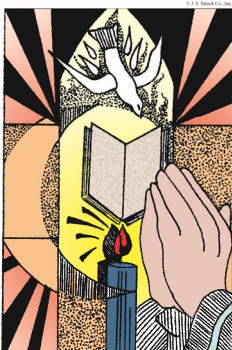

May God continue to bless you for your spiritual and financial generosity and may our Blessed Mother always intercede for you.



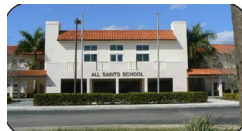
