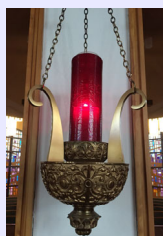

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT WATCHFUL CONFIDENCE

We the Church enter into Advent and the new liturgical year with a call for a watchful confidence. Our readings were originally addressed to communities undergoing great loss and confusion. Jeremiah speaks confidently of God fulfilling the ancient promises to Israel, even during a time of foreign invasion. Paul speaks of God leading the Church into holiness, while the community longs for the coming of Jesus. In the Gospel passage from Luke, Jesus speaks of powerful signs and of great confusion to come, but emphasizes that we may look forward knowing that God brings not cause for despair, but

hope. We celebrate Advent to remind each other of God's faithfulness. We are to be watchful, to see how God is stirring up our world. God disturbs both our pride and our complacency, and brings us healing and justice. We prepare ourselves to welcome Jesus, confident that God indeed fulfills all these divine promises. Copyright © J. Advent #1 - Expectation

As you are probably aware, this Sunday is the First Sunday of Advent. As in years past, during this Advent time, we offer some reflections that will hopefully allow us to prepare for the coming of the Lord in a new way – into our Church, into our lives, and into our hearts.

This year, we will do so by exploring the following four themes: Expectation, Preparation, Exultation and Realization. These four themes are inspired by the readings for Mass on the four Sundays of Advent. They also bring us from the most remote to the most intimate moments leading up to the Nativity of the Lord.

We begin with Expectation. In truth, the expectation of the coming of the Messiah began during the time of King David. At that time, the prophet Nathan told David that he would have an heir whose kingdom would never end. [cf. 2 Sam 7:13-14] Instead of an everlasting kingdom, after Solomon the kingdom first divided, then the two new kingdoms were conquered and the people were exiled to foreign lands. It seemed that the hope of an everlasting kingdom was over.

However, throughout the years that followed, God spoke through many of the prophets reminding the people of His promise of an everlasting King, a Messiah. The many prophecies about the Messiah that ensued kept the Expectation alive. In this Sunday's first reading, we hear from the prophet Jeremiah about the expected Messiah: "The days are coming, says the LORD, when I will fulfill the promise I made to the house of Israel and Judah. In those days, in that time, I will raise up for David a just shoot..." [Jer. 33:14-15a]

After the coming of the Messiah, Jesus, a new period of Expectation began. The people were beginning to expect a *second* coming of Jesus in glory. As we read in Paul's First Letter to the Thessalonians: "May the Lord make you increase and abound in love for one another and for all, just as we have for you, so as to strengthen your hearts, to be blameless in holiness before our God and Father at the coming of our Lord Jesus with all his holy ones. Amen." [1 Thes 3:12-13]

Like the first coming of the Messiah, Jesus' return did not happen right away, but we have hope that one day Jesus will come. We know that the Messiah has come and that He is Jesus. We also know that He will come again at the end of time. So what do we do in the meantime?

Our answer lies in the Gospel. Jesus tells us in the Gospel that we should "be vigilant at all times and pray..." [LK 21:36] This is the same stance that the Jewish people took in Expectation of the Messiah. They were constantly on the watch for the coming of the Messiah, and much of the Scriptures are filled with their fervent prayers that God will bring His mighty power to save them.

The season of Advent is our season to focus on watching and praying for the coming of the Lord. Let us always remember: We are not only watching for Christ's coming 2000 years ago or many years from now; we are watching and praying for Christ to come to us NOW. Advent is *our* season of Expectation.

WORLD DAY FOR THE ABOLITION OF THE DEATH PENALTY

CITIES FOR LIFE

Our Catechism teaches us that the use of the death penalty is only allowed in those cases where non-lethal means are insufficient to defend and protect peoples' safety from an aggressor. In this case, the death penalty would be allowed but according to Pope St. John Paul II, "this is very rare and practically non-existent." In our state, juries can choose life without parole for convicted killers and this has worked well. They are locked up for life and none has escaped, a severe punishment. Society is well protected.

Given the development of the doctrine involving the death penalty, in August 2018, Pope Francis revised the instruction concerning the execution of human being in stating: "the death penalty is inadmissible because it is an attack on the inviolability and dignity of the person", and furthermore called for the Church to work with determination for its abolition worldwide.



Please light a candle on November 30th, at 5 PM for those being executed and the victim's families, and to end the death penalty.

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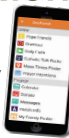
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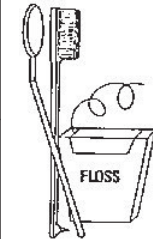
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
