Advent #4 – Realization

As we begin this Fourth (and final) Week of Advent, we have moved through a period of Expectation, a time of Preparation, and a sense of Exultation in the hope of the coming of Our Lord. Well, during this Fourth Week, we finally come to the Realization of that hope.

During the Fourth Week of Advent, the pace seems to quicken and the excitement seems to be amplified as the coming of the Christ is “just around the corner.” We may even feel like “last-minute shoppers on Christmas Eve” (which may be some people’s reality as well).

The Fourth Week of Advent is often overlooked as it can be as short as just a few hours (in years when Christmas falls on a Monday). This year, however, we get to enjoy the second longest Fourth Week of Advent – six days. This gives us plenty of time to enjoy the fulfillment of our Expectation, the fruits of our Preparation, the reason for our Exultation, and the Realization of our hope.

Our readings for this Sunday bring us to the cusp of the Nativity of our Lord. First, in our reading from the prophet Micah, we hear of the glory of the town of Bethlehem. We know that Bethlehem is the “City of David.” [cf. 1 Sam 17:12] Later this week, we will hear of St. Joseph taking Mary to Bethlehem to satisfy the census. There, in Bethlehem, Jesus will be born. Our reading from the prophet Micah demonstrates that this is the plan of God and the Will of God.

In response to the Will of God, Jesus becomes human and in the response to the Will of God, Jesus offers Himself as a sacrifice for our sins. In our

second reading from the Letter to the Hebrews, the author helps us to understand the Realization of the Will of God: “Then [Jesus] says, ‘Behold, I come to do your will.’ [...] By this ‘will,’ we have been consecrated through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.” [Heb 10:9a, 10]

All those who acquiesce to the Will of God become part of His plan for salvation, and we know that Mary is a great model for us of choosing to follow the Will of God. In the Gospel for Monday of this week, we hear Mary say to the angel Gabriel, “Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word.” [LK 1:38] Her willingness to be part of God’s plan is recognized by her cousin Elizabeth as she says to Mary, “Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled.” [LK 1:45]

The stage is set. The time is right. At the end of this week, the Son of God will become the Son of Man – the Realization of thousands of years of Expectation, centuries of Preparation, and the beginning of our Exultation. “For now his greatness shall reach to the ends of the earth; he shall be peace.” [Mic 5:3b-4a]

May you have a blessed, happy and peace-filled Christmas season!

FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT AUDACITY

There is a spirit of audacity in our readings today. During a time of injustice and threat of invasion, the prophet Micah boldly announces that the God of insignificant Israel will raise up a leader from backwater Bethlehem, and this leader will bring justice and peace to the whole world. In the Gospel, Elizabeth and Mary, marginalized women, brazenly celebrate that their sons will be world-changing instruments of God. We further learn that this audacity is rooted in trust in God. The author of Hebrews describes the faithful obedience of Jesus. Mary is shown as the exemplar of faithful trust in God. This is the way God often seems to work, in the ordinary and marginalized in our world. Those who seem weak have learned to trust in God's strength. Second Reading — We are children of God when we believe in the name of God's Son, Jesus Christ, and love one another just as he commanded us (1 Jn 3:1-2, 21-24) or *Colossians 3:12-21 [12-17]*.

Gospel — Joseph and Mary find the lost Jesus in the temple in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking questions (Luke 2:41-52).

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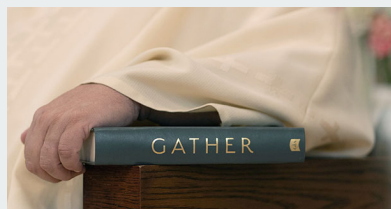

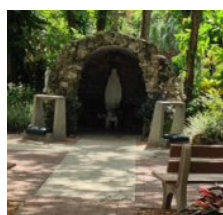

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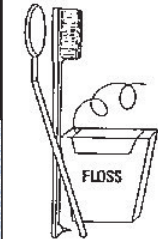
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
