

LOOKING THROUGH STAINED GLASS



A Column by Fr. Tom



Sacramentum Caritatis #5

After exploring some general considerations about the Eucharistic liturgy, Pope Benedict XVI takes us through an exposition of some of the elements of the Mass.

"First of all, there is a need to reflect on the inherent unity of the rite of Mass. [...] The liturgy of the word and the Eucharistic liturgy, with the rites of introduction and conclusion, 'are so closely interconnected that they form but one single act of worship.' There is an intrinsic bond between the word of God and the Eucharist. [...The] word of God, read and proclaimed by the Church in the liturgy, leads to the Eucharist as to its own connatural end." [SC 44]

The first element of the Mass that Pope Benedict explores is the Liturgy of the Word. "Let us never forget that 'when the Sacred Scriptures are read in the Church, God himself speaks to his people, and Christ, present in his own word, proclaims the Gospel'." [SC 45] As the homily is part of the Liturgy of the Word, Pope Benedict reminds his ministers that the "homily is 'part of the liturgical action', and is meant to foster a deeper understanding of the word of God, so that it can bear fruit in the lives of the faithful." [SC 46]

"[The presentation of the gifts] is not to be viewed simply as a kind of 'interval' between the liturgy of the word and the liturgy of the Eucharist. To do so would tend to weaken, at the least, the sense of a single rite made up of two interrelated parts. This humble and simple gesture is actually very significant: in the bread and wine that we bring to the altar, all creation is taken up by Christ the Redeemer to be transformed and presented to the Father." [SC 47]

As we continue through the movements of the Mass, Pope Benedict begins to focus on the Liturgy of the Eucharist, and he begins with the most important part of this Liturgy, the Eucharistic Prayer. "The Eucharistic Prayer is 'the center and summit of the entire celebration.' [...] In a particular way, Eucharistic spirituality and theological reflection are enriched if we contemplate in the anaphora [the Eucharistic Prayer] the profound unity between the invocation of the Holy Spirit and the institution narrative [the words of Jesus from the Last Supper]." [SC 48]

As Jesus comes to us in very real way in the Eucharist, Pope Benedict gives some special exhortations about the reception of the Eucharist and our appreciation of this gift. "Make every effort to ensure that this simple act [the reception of the Eucharist] preserves its importance as a personal encounter with the Lord Jesus in the sacrament. [...] Furthermore, the precious time of thanksgiving after communion should not be neglected: besides the singing of an appropriate hymn, it can also be most helpful to remain recollected in silence." [SC 50]

Following the "time of thanksgiving," we are called to translate our worship into mission. "After the blessing, the deacon or the priest dismisses the people with the words: *Ite, missa est.* [Literally, "Go, it is the dismissal."] These words help us to grasp the relationship between the Mass just celebrated and the mission of Christians in the world." [SC 51]

After reviewing some elements of the Mass, Pope Benedict XVI will next focus on what true "active participation" is, which we will begin to explore with him in our next column.




