Definitions & Terms

Resident: Any person living within the boundary lines of Anderson Mill Limited District.

Residential Rate/Fee: Fees are set for individuals residing within the Anderson Mill Limited District's boundaries. These fees are applicable only for those with a primary address within Anderson Mill Limited District.

Proof of residency is required to access these rates and a valid photo ID with a current utility bill or other dated, legally binding document that lists the AMLD address. Must be renewed yearly.

Non-Resident: Any person whose primary residence is not within the designated boundaries of the Anderson Mill Limited District

Non-Resident Rate/Fee: Fees set for individuals not residing within AMLD's borders. These fees are applicable for all those whose primary residence is outside AMLD's boundaries.

Commercial Entity/Activity: Any for-profit business, person, or activity. All commercial activity on AMLD property must be authorized by the Board of Directors and/or the District Manager.

AMLD Deed Restrictions, ACC, and Policy Information

Deed Restrictions

Each home within Anderson Mill Limited District's boundaries are associated with a village deed restriction. For deed restriction information please visit the AMLD website, select "Limited District" and scroll down to "Deed Restrictions and Violation Reporting." On the web page you will find a map of the 31 villages throughout Anderson Mill Limited District, electronic files for each village's deed restrictions, FAQ's, and a reporting form.

A letter notifying home owners of any deed violations will be sent out, giving the owner 30 days to correct or resolve the violation. Legal action will be pursued if the violation has not been remedied. Residents can file complaints via the Violation Report Form found at the AMLD website. For more information or if you have questions, please visit www.amld.org or call the main office at 512-258-4104.

Anderson Mill Limited District has many villages, each with deed restricitons in place. The Austin City Council has recently passed phase one of HOME that would change city zoning, which does not change the deed restrictions in place for Anderson Mill Limited District villages. The deed restrictions for villages within AMLD state each lot is for "a single family residence". Some of the villages do allow for duplexes on specific lots that are clearly defined within the deed restrictions for that specific village.

Architectural Control Committee & Review Process

The Architectural Control Committee (ACC) is charged with the responsibility of reviewing and approving or denying plans and specifications for the construction and/or remodeling of property within the District as set out by the deed restrictions for the particular village in question. Each home in Anderson Mill Limited District is a part of an assigned village with unique deed restrictions for each village. Deed Restrictions can be found on the AMLD website. To get on the agenda, residents need to submit an Architectural Review Form to the main office. The form can be found on the AMLD website under the Architectural Control Committee tab. The completed forms and plans can be returned to the AMLD main office located at 11500 El Salido Parkway, Austin, TX 78750.





LIFEGUARD TRAINING

COURSE #1 APRIL 5, 6, 12, & 13 11AM - 5PM DAILY


APRIL 26, 27 & MAY 3, 4 NAM - 5PM DAILY

COURSE #3 MAY 27, 28, 29, & 30 10AM - 4PM DAILY

This Red Cross program teaches candidates the knowledge and skills needed to prevent and respond to aquatic emergencies. Successful candidates will receive Lifeguarding, including deep water, First Aid and CPR/AED certifications valid for 2 years.

LIFEGUARD TRAINING

You must attend all the dates within a course to get certified; please pick one of the courses you are able to attend all classes.

Prerequisites:

- 1. 15 years of age prior to the last scheduled class date.
- 2. Complete a swim-tread-swim sequence without stopping to rest.

-Jump into deep water and fully submerge. Swim 150 yards using breaststroke, freestyle, or a combination of both with rhythmic breathing. Goggles are allowed. Maintain a position on the surface of the water for 2 minutes treading water using only the legs. Swim 50 yards using freestyle, breaststroke, or a combination of both.

 Retrieve a 10lb brick from 12 ft depth of water. Swim 20 yards holding the brick with both hands. Exit the water without ladder or stairs. Timed event: 1 minute, 40 seconds.

Email aquatics@amld.org to arrange a time to complete the prerequisite swim test. Prerequisite swim test must be completed before being enrolled into the training course.




The Lifeguard Instructor Course trains instructors to teach the basic-level Red Cross Lifeguarding courses.

- Participants must be 17 years or older by the last scheduled day of the course.
 - Participants must also possess a basic level certification in Lifeguarding/First Aid/CPR/AED.
- Participants must complete the online Introduction to the Lifeguarding Instructor Course prior to the pre-course session.
- Participants must pass the pre-course session on the first day of the in-person classes. The pre-course session is comprised of skill assessment scenarios in which candidates must successfully perform the required lifeguarding first aid, CPR, and AED skills in each scenario.

Participants are expected to be able to perform all skills near standard and quickly correct errors to meet the standard to continue in the instructor course.

PARENT & CHILD AQUATICS

The purpose of Parent & Child Aquatics is to familiarize children with the water and teach swimming readiness skills. Provide safety information for parents and teach techniques parents can use to orient their children to the water. An adult is required to participate with the child, multiple adults welcome. Each course includes 8 lessons.

Pre-Requisites are required for this course, Please see the website for more info.

AGES 6MO - 3 YEARS

PRESCHOOL 1

The purpose is to familiarize children with the aquatic environment and help them acquire rudimentary aquatics skills. Help participants begin to develop positive attitudes and safe practices in and around the water. Each course includes 8 lessons.

All skills may be performed with assistance.

Pre-Requisites are required for this course. Please see the website for more info.

AGES 4 - 5 YEARS

PRESCHOOL 2

Participants must demonstrate abilities from Preschool 1 and/or pass the exit skills assessment. The purpose is to familiarize children with the aquatic environment and help them acquire rudimentary aquatics skills. Help participants begin to develop positive attitudes and safe practices in and around the water. Each course includes 8 lessons. Note: Upon passing this course, students' progress to Level 3.

All skills are performed independently.

Pre-Requisites are required for this course. Please see the website for more info.

AGES 4 - 5 YEARS

STROKE CLINIC: SWIM TEAM READINESS & PERSONAL WATER SAFETY

Participants must demonstrate abilities from Level 4/5 and/or pass the exit skills assessment. Help participants refine their performance of all six swimming strokes: front crawl, back crawl, butterfly, breaststroke, elementary backstroke, and sidestroke. Help participants swim the strokes with greater efficiency and effectiveness over longer distances. Refine flip turns, open turns, and starting block entries. Introduction to survival swimming, HELP & Huddle positions. Each course includes 8 lessons.

Pre-Requisites are required for this course. Please see the website for more info.

AGES 6 - 12 YEARS

LEVEL 1/2: FUNDAMENTAL AQUATIC SKILLS

No skill prerequisites. The purpose is to familiarize children with the aquatic environment and help them acquire rudimentary aquatics skills. Help participants begin to develop positive attitudes and safe practices in and around the water. Each course includes 8 lessons.

Skills are performed independently.

Pre-Requisites are required for this course. Please see the website for more info.

AGES 6 - 12 YEARS

LEVEL 3: STROKE DEVELOPMENT

Participants must demonstrate abilities from Level 1/2 and/or pass the exit skills assessment. Participants build on previously learned skills to achieve basic water competency in a pool environment. Refinement of front and back crawl. Introduction to rotary breathing, elementary backstroke, breaststroke kick and headfirst entries. Each course includes 8 lessons.

Pre-Requisites are required for this course. Please see the website for more info.

AGES 6 - 12 YEARS

LEVEL 4/5: STROKE REFINEMENT

Participants must demonstrate abilities from Level 3 and/or pass the exit skills assessment. Improve participants' proficiency in performing front/back crawl, elementary backstroke, and breaststroke. Introduction to sidestroke and butterfly. Each course includes 8 lessons.

Pre-Requisites are required for this course. Please see the website for more info.





Anderson Mill Neighborhood Association

The AM Neighborhood Association (AMNA) is an organization just for the residents of Anderson Mill. AMNA is a nonprofit that serves as a collective voice for residents. AMNA's primary function is to bring neighbors together & foster a sense of unity & cooperation to improve our neighborhood's quality of life. The association serves as a liaison between residents & local authorities, advocating for shared interests, concerns, & needs. AMNA publishes a free monthly newsletter for residents packed with neighborhood news, events, & useful information

In the last two years, AMNA has produced two garden events with Master Gardeners, which spawned a Garden Club that now meets once a month. We brought neighbors together for a Dinner in the Park social & National Night Out parties. AMNA organized the first-ever Neighborhood Yard Sale last April and most recently submitted an Urban Forest grant application to the City of Austin to start reforesting our parks and trails. We are waiting to hear if our grant application is approved so AMNA & our partner, the AM Limited District, can plant 35 trees. While waiting, AMNA has raised almost \$3,000 through our Adopt-A-Tree program. On November 3rd volunteers planted three trees in Harper Park as hands-on practice at the Tree Planting and Tree Care Clinic

Tennis, Pickleball & Racquetball Courts

Tennis courts are located at El Salido Park, Anderson Mill Park, Pecan Creek Park, and Old Stage Park. The pickleball nets are located on the lakecreek tennis courts. The tennis, pickleball and racquetball court hours are from 7:00 AM to 10:15 PM. Court hours are extended beyond regular park hours.

Purchases for court keys and access to the online reservation system must be paid at the AMLD Main Office located at 11500 El Salido Parkway, Austin. A password for the online reservation system will be given at the time of purchase. The online reservation system is available 24 hours, 7 days a week. Court reservations must be made 1 day in advance, but not more then 7 days in advance for Non-Residents and 14 days in advance for Residents.

Reminder: Court keys are changed each year in August and must be repurchased annually. Keys are valid from mid-August to the following August each year, however, court keys are half price when purchased after March 1st. Only one key will be issued per household. All keys can be purchased at the AMLD main office. Key purchases are non-refundable. All replacament keys are full price.

Tennis Court Lights

Use your key to set the timer for the court lights to "ON". Court lights will stay on for 60 minutes. The bell will sound when there are 10 minutes remaining on the timer. Lights will shut off if the timer is not immediately reset with the court key. Once the lights




have shut off, a 20 minute cool down and relighting process will start. Contact the AMLD Main Office if there are any outages.

Dog Parks

Anderson Mill Limited District offers two great dog off leash areas conveniently located at Old Stage Park on Hymeadow Drive and Millrun Park on Millwright Parkway. Dog park hours are 30 minutes before sunrise to 30 minutes after sunset.

All dog park keys are valid from August to August each year and must be renewed annually. Keys are half priced beginning March 1st each year. Keys must be purchased at the AMLD main office. No refunds on purchased keys. Current vaccination records are required each year to purchase or renew keys and must be presented at time of purchase. AMLD reserves the right to impose restrictions on access as situations warrant.



If the event is cancelled 11-30 days prior to the event, 50% of fees will be refunded minus a \$20 processing fee. All events cancelled 30 days prior will be refunded 100% less a \$20 processing fee. All rentals are subject to a refundable damage deposit.
