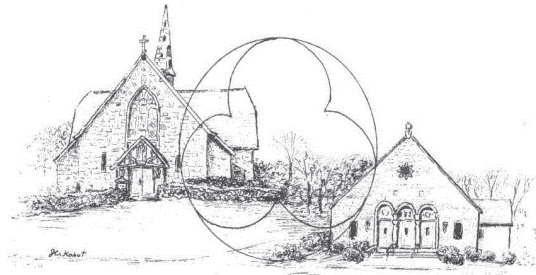

The parish office is open Monday-Thursday for all of your needs. Father Carr is also available most other times. If urgent, call and leave a message and he will get back to you.

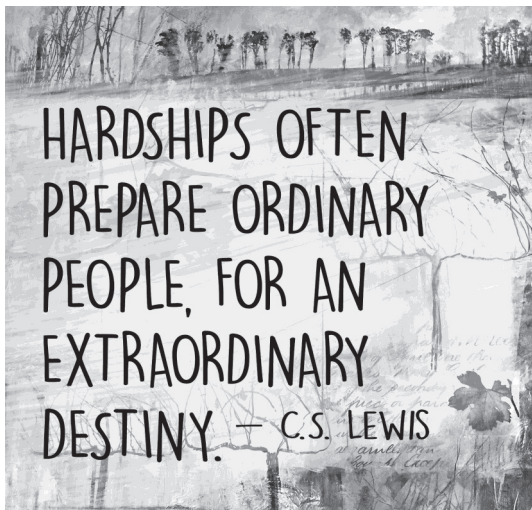
