

We can imagine the anxiety of the Disciples, spoken by Thomas, in this weekends Gospel account. This Scripture is taken from what is called the "Last Supper Discourses" where Jesus is instructing the Disciples on what will occur when He is crucified and rises again. "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me" In their Jewish traditions and worldview, those gathered with Jesus would have know the God spoken of in Scripture, and passed down from the time of Moses and the early fathers, but they are now being asked to trust and have faith in Jesus as the promised Messiah. It can be easy to just think of Jesus as a good person, perhaps the best that ever lived, but to ignore His divine nature and son ship with God the Father. Jesus continues and says "I am the way, the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me" Jesus knows that even for the Disciples who have seen Him and been at His side through many trials and hardships, belief and trust in what will soon happen will be difficult for them to accept.

They long to remain with Him forever and to see more clearly the Father, and will be heartbroken and lost at His death and crucifixion and when He is raised to heaven at the Ascension. Many of us have experienced the loss of a loved one, recently or in the past, and we can all bring to mind the kind of broken heartedness and despair that we may have felt at such a tremendous loss. We find comfort and solace that they have gone home to the Lord, and we pray they reside in the heavenly kingdom and have seen the Lord Jesus face to face. Our earthly loss and sadness is reversed in God's eyes, and there is great rejoicing in heaven at their coming. We long with hearts of faith for the presence of Jesus, who promises to be with us always and we await the time when we will be reunited with all who have gone home. May the Lord Jesus, who gave solace to the disciples at the Last Supper and who will soon send the Advocate at Pentecost, grant us peace this week. "Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord. May the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace." May God bless you.
