"When John came to you in the way of righteousness, you did not believe him; but tax collectors and prostitutes did. Yet even when you saw that, you did not later change your minds and believe him." These words of Christ to the disciples that we hear in today's Gospel remind us to listen closely to what is happening in our world today and what the voice and message of God might be in our own lives. We hear through many accounts in the Old and New Testament that God often sent prophets to the people in times of great distress and turmoil to call them back to Him, and to warn them of the times ahead if they refused to listen to His words and commands. Tax collectors and prostitutes were at the very outskirts of Jewish society at the time of Christ, they were hatred and despised by the people. For these outcasts to hear the words of John the Baptist proclaiming the coming of the Messiah and to immediately believe is astounding. The great leaders and learned men of that time did not listen or believe, but the least of the people heard and trusted in God! Each of us can call to mind at least a few instances where we heard about something good that we should be doing or assisting with, and instead chose to do it our way and not listen to what we had been told. The many Marian apparitions (especially her appearance at Fatima in 1917) serve as examples of how we must work together to bring our broken and suffering world back into the embrace of the Blessed Mother and her Son, Jesus Christ. This week let us pray for the strength and the courage to listen to the Lord and to do what is right, and let us also pray for peace in all areas of our world and society. May God bless you!"- Brian Kirby
