




in order to protect you.


May we be so willing to honor, sacrifice, and obey,

Faith Formation Notes From the Religious Ed office

As we begin a new year, just a few reminders and calendar notes concerning religious education:

Please note that there are no Sunday classes (grades 1-5 and Confirmation) on January 14, because of the Martin Luther King Jr holiday weekend. Mass attendance is of course is obligatory for all Catholics every Sunday or its vigil. Sunday morning: on the first Sunday of the month we celebrate Family Fellowship Sunday (in lieu of class). Please join us at the 8:30 Mass for a special mass with the children in mind, followed by a pancake breakfast after mass at the hall. Also, we ask your help in keeping our children safe. Please walk your child into the building for class. We recognize that the parking situation is not great, but this is an effort to keep the children safe and for you to confirm that they have reached their class and teacher. Also, please come in and pick up your little ones especially in this cold weather.

Homebound Ministry


Visiting the Sick And Homebound
