




GOSPEL MEDITATION

In an on-demand society, it's not always easy to imagine life with less. The crowds of Jesus' day depended on the weather and successful growing seasons for their livelihood. For many of Jesus' listeners, even "food that perishes" would have been a welcome relief. Jesus acknowledges this but tries to draw them deeper. "You are looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled." For people who have just witnessed a miracle, the response is strangely marked by ingratitude. "What can you do? Our ancestors ate manna in the desert." Jesus fed them for one day, but Moses interceded with God for 40 years of bread. "Jesus," they seem to say, "can't you just give us more?"

How often do we behave similarly in the spiritual life? "If I only I had more patience, then I could be kind to her." "I could be welcoming if I was more outgoing, but that's just not me." "I know I'd be a better parent if I just had more time." Like the crowds, we want Jesus to give us more. We always don't want him to completely shift our paradigm. Perhaps it's not "more patience" we need, but a deeper sense of our own imperfections for a greater sense of empathy. Maybe God is inviting you not to entertain an entire group, but to seek out the quiet person on the fringe. And time may limit you from family engagement, but could God be asking you to reorder your priorities entirely?

After all, it wasn't more loaves that the people needed. Jesus is "the bread of life," who sustains our most essential needs. This week, are you looking for more or are you looking for God Himself?

The Mission Trip with the High Schoolers was another great success, despite the rain, a lot was accomplished for the poor, and the Teens had a chance to grow in their faith and build up relationships with their peers.

The new paint and renovation work on Our Lady's hall is nearly done, it looks spectacular. I have to especially thank two volunteers: Lee Duffy and his wife Amy, who have done the majority of the work over the past few months. There have been a lot of smaller projects being done by other volunteers, as well as ongoing maintenance and property upkeep being done with the help of generous volunteers.

Having these volunteers, along with our monthly utilities and maintenance collection has allowed us to keep current on all our bills. We are in much stronger shape financially than when I first arrived. Please note: each October we have a financial statement prepared for the parish and will be included in the bulletin.

The challenge now is for us to grow the parish. That begins with continuing our work on our pastoral plan, and then after approval from the Cardinal, putting that plan into action. Evangelization is everyone's vocation. Who can you invite to join us at the altar of the Lord? The Good News is for sharing.

If we can grow the parish, it is my hope to be able to afford to hire a youth minister, at least part time. Forming our youth in the faith must be a top priority.

Soon we will have our pastoral council elections. Three new members will be chosen to join the council.

Lastly, this fall I plan to start promoting our online egiving program. Egiving has the potential to help our parish become stronger financially.

We have a lot to be grateful for in our parish, may the Lord continue to bless our Community of Faith, and each one of you individually.


