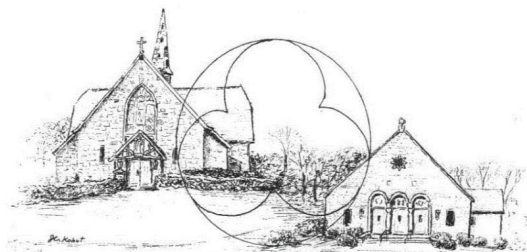

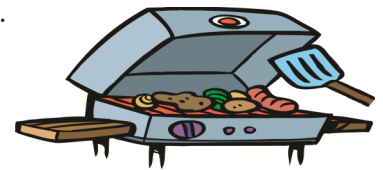

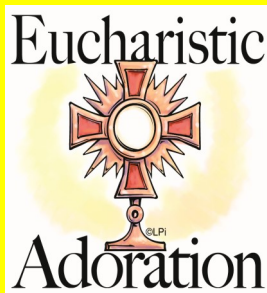

Note from the Pastor

"The word of the LORD came to me, saying: Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I dedicated you," (Jer. 1:4) Our first reading from Mass points to the fact that life in the womb is sacred to God. That is why we are a prolife people, a people who cherish the precious gift of life in all its stages. God knew us long before we were born, and he knows us better than we know ourselves now. We were created for union with our God for all eternity. That union begins here and now, and if we choose God, it continues forever in heaven. God has given us free will to accept Him as our Lord, or to reject Him and all that He offers us.

It is difficult to understand how anyone would reject this free gift, and yet we see people saying no to God all around us often in very big ways. All sin is saying no to God, but some sin is far greater than other sin, we call that grave sin. Grave sin done with full knowledge and full consent of the will is called mortal sin. Mortal sin destroys our relationship with God. The good news is that Jesus has given us the remedy, the sacrament of confession, to absolve even mortal sin.

That is why we are a people of hope. There is hope for anyone who desires to be in Communion with their God.

Many of the Saints, dedicated their lives to prayer and penance for the conversion of those who reject their God and His free gift of Salvation.

"For what shall it profit a man, if he gain the whole world, and suffer the loss of his soul." (MK 8:36).

Our gospel reading today shows us how people, even in Jesus day, didn't want to hear the truth. Sadly the truth angers those who do not love the truth. Sometimes the truth is painful. Sometimes it reminds us of our past failures. It is necessary for the truth to come to the light, particularly if that truth is darkness that needs to be conquered by light. Jesus points out that the history of Israel was not always a pretty one. Yes they were the chosen people of God, and yes they killed the prophets.

Yet God still used Israel to accomplish his will and bring forth the Messiah, the savior of the world. As Saint Paul wrote: salvation is from the Jews. We are learning that the history of the Church also has darkness in it that has come to the light. But there is much more goodness and light than darkness. God is still very much at work in the church, in the sacraments Jesus instituted and in the everyday saints who strive to do God's will.

Each day we have many opportunities to say yes to God, to do his will in the world and stand up for the Truth.

In an age where news is nearly instantaneous, we need to discern what is true and what is not. Peaceful discernment is needed. There is often much more to the story than what is reported—or much less.

If we love God above all and our neighbor as ourselves, there is no room for hatred or condemnation.

Let us pray for our country and for our government, that all parties will seek the truth and address it with prudence and justice. And let us pray for our media, that they will come to love and seek the Truth, and report it accurately.
