



From the Pastor,

"Be not Afraid" - the words of Jesus to His disciples on many occasions, also the words of the Archangel Gabriel to Mary at the Annunciation.

Pope St. John Paul II began his pontificate with the words "Be not afraid," he issued a number of challenges, each punctuated with those words, "Be not afraid."

The Lord does not want us to live in fear. There is much that is wrong with the world today. The corona virus, the economy, violence in the streets in many places, hatred and vitriol even in the media, the list goes on and on.

As a country we have faced much worse. We will get through this, especially if we keep focused on the Lord and trust in His Love and Mercy.

Prayer is the answer, but also needed is prudence and wisdom. We need to protect those most vulnerable, and use appropriate precautions ourselves. Even with the best of efforts, some of us will get the virus.

We all know people who have lost loved ones, and we all know people who have survived or not even had serious symptoms after getting the virus. We must not allow ourselves to be paralyzed with fear. The apostles faced fear every day, much of the early church and even Christians today, have to live in the danger of martyrdom for the faith.

When we have the love of God in our hearts, fear is cast out. "True love casts out all fear." That doesn't mean everyone and everything will be fine, it means we must not allow fear to rule us. Again prudence is needed.

St. Thomas Aquinas teaches that Prudence is the knowledge of how to act, how to conduct one's life rightly. "A person in the state of grace has prudence, for he has charity, and charity cannot exist without prudence. Prudence suffuses all virtues; it is a kind of bond that links them together, and it is necessary to them all." St. Augustine says that prudence is "the knowledge of what to seek and what to avoid."

Fear is part of the human condition, however, we can live and move beyond fear, not letting it rule us. Instead, fear can be used to guide us, to inform prudence. There are many dangers in life, all are to be avoided, fear can be healthy, if we don't succumb to it. We need only fear offending our God, for sin is the greatest evil. God's grace will see us through. Prayer is the means by which we attain the grace we need to overcome fear, and live in peace. +


