





From the Pastor,

It seems to me to say that we live in strange times is the understatement of the year. We are a divided nation, with political leaders who seem to thrive on division and even hatred. When Jesus was accused of driving out demons by the power of the devil, he reminded his opponents, a house divided against itself cannot stand. We must not be divided if we want to move forward.

We all need to heed the Lord and his command to love one another. What we need is open discourse, not a silencing of voices. When silencing voices is acceptable, the voice of the Church, that is the gospel, is silenced.

We live in a culture that is more confused about the truth than at any other time perhaps in history. America was once the most religious country in the world, the most Christian. Every generation seems more and more removed from the spiritual life and a desire to please God and reach salvation.

Humanities relationship with God has a very predictable pattern going back throughout salvation history with the Hebrew people and now continuing with Christianity. It begins with right relationship, then sin enters the picture. Adam and Eve fell away from God and were expelled from the garden and had to toil for their existence. Then comes a realization that they need God, so there is a time of repentance and turning to God, followed by a time of God's Blessing. After a time of blessing there is a period of growing luke warm and turning away from God and towards sin, followed by suffering the consequences of sin and withdrawal of God's blessing. Which brings about a turning to God and a repetition of the cycle again.

Are we in the turning away from God and towards sin part of the cycle? Are we reaping the fruits of sin and the withdrawing of God's blessing? If so, what will it take to turn a nation and a world back to God? It starts with one individual, each one of us needs to turn to the Lord and seek His blessing for our country and our world, and when enough people turn to God, the darkness will start to turn to light. The good news is that God desires for us to turn to Him, without Him, it will just get darker. We all can be lights in the darkness, we all have the power of the Holy Spirit and the Eucharist to empower us get through the dark valleys without fear.

God will bring good out of the worst situation for those who trust in His mercy. Prayer, penance and charity will see us through. There is reason for hope, God does not abandon His people, though they may abandon God.



Most Blessed Sacrament Church needs a ramp at the sacristy door on the left side of the altar. It also could use some work making the bathroom a little bigger. Our Lady of Good Counsel Church needs a bathroom on the main Church level. It would be possible to turn the Penance Room at the back of the church into a bathroom. This would serve the community as well as wheelchairs and those with difficulties using stairs. Before we could do this we would need to change the location of the confessional back to where it once was.
